There are PS-7 (28%) & UPS-4 (33.33%) where the food is supplied by the NGO. In 14 (77.77%) PS and 7 (87.5%) UPS the food stock for full month is available at the school and comes from pradhan house. In 4 (22.22%) PS & 1 (12.5%) UPS, the food stock of one month is not available at the schools As per norms the food grains are only available at PS 18 (100%) and UPS 8 (100%). Qualities of the food grains are good at PS 18 (100%) and UPS 8 (100%).
District <b>Muzaffarnagar</b>	2. <b>Sample size- 25 primary schools and 14 upper primary schools.</b> In 22 (88%) PS and 13 (92.85%) UPS the food stock for full month is available at the school and comes from pradhan house. Students were satisfied by quality in 24 (96%) PS & 10 (83.33%) UPS. The reason of dissatisfaction was that mainly rice was served in MDM and the food was not according to menu. The students of UPS informed that the quality of food supplied by NGO was not good.

The cooked food is served in PS by schools cooks in 18 schools (72 %), by teachers in 2 schools (8%), by students in 1 school (4%) and other 4 schools (8%). The cooked food is served in upper primary schools by cooks in 8 schools (66.66%) and other in 4 (33.33%). The number of cooks is PS and UPS in as per norms. 18 schools of PS where the food is cooked in schools there is 0 male and 51 (100%) female , 8 schools of UPS where the food is cooked in schools there is 0 male and 22 (100%) female. The payment of cooks is Rs/-1000 only in PS and UPS and is given by cheque. Social status of cooks in <b>PS</b> is SC-22 (43.13%), OBC-21 (41.17%), Muslim-4 (7.84%) & other-4 (7.84%). In <b>UPS</b> it is SC-7 (31.81%), OBC-13 (59.09), Muslim-1 (4.54%) & other -1(4.54%).

Where the food is cooked in 14 schools there is 0 male and 42 (100%) female, 14 schools of UPS where the food is cooked in schools there is 0 male and 36 (100%) female.
