Agenda Notes for Conference of State Education Secretaries of all the States / UTs implementing Mid Day Meal Scheme on 25.06.2013 at India Habitat Centre, New Delhi

1. Introduction

The efforts of the State Governments and UT Administrations has resulted in providing hot cooked meals to more than 10.68 crore children, which is 75% of the enrolled children in 12.12 lakh schools in the country. Many independent evaluations have reported that MDMS has helped in preventing classroom hunger; promoting school participation and fostering social equality and enhancing gender equity.

The Government of India is also monitoring Mid Day Meal Scheme through 41 independent Monitoring Institutes, Joint Review Mission besides mentoring by Office of Supreme Court Commissioner. The Mission has recently visited 3 States viz. Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh and Delhi and will visit Andhra Pradesh, Tripura, Madhya Pradesh, Bihar and Tamil Nadu during the month of June to August, 2013.

The web enabled MIS for Mid Day Meal Scheme is a milestone in the monitoring of the Scheme and now data for the year 2012-13 is available on the portal. The funds and foodgrains management module besides auto generation of Annual Work Plan is ready and regional orientation workshop would be convened in the coming months to orient the officers / officials of the State Government.

An extremely positive development has been that the gap of 21.59 percentage points recorded between male and female literacy rates in 2001 Census has been reduced to 16.68 percentage points in 2011. While the overall literacy rate has increased by 9.81 percent, it has improved by 11.84 percent in the case of females. Amongst other factors MDMS has also contributed to this positive development.

The Ministry has prepared EFC note for revision of the existing norms and extension of the Mid Day Meal Scheme to the private unaided schools located in the SC, ST and Minority concentrated areas besides coverage of 25% children admitted in private schools under Section 12(i)(c) of the RTE Act.

An analysis of the implementation of the Mid Day Meal Scheme for the year 2012-13 reveals the following areas of concern:

- i) Timely release of funds from the State level,
- ii) Delay in payment to cook-cum-helpers,
- iii) Delays in making payment to FCI,
- iv) Strengthening of management structure for MDM at various levels in the State,
- v) Regular SSMC meetings in every quarter,
- vi) Data entry in MDM-MIS portal in time bound manner,
- vii) Conducting Research Studies,
- viii) Preparation of Action Plan for poor performing districts,
- ix) Introduction of Social Audit,
- Better convergence with NRHM for full coverage of children under the School Health Programme,
 - xi) Timely submission of QPRs and MPRs.

The QPRs submitted by the State Governments / UT Administrations have been analysed and component-wise analysis of the performance of the Scheme during the year 2012-13 is as under:

The Mid Day Meal Scheme extended benefits to 75% enrolled children in the 4th Quarter of the year 2012-13 across the country. 13 States have covered more than 90% and there are 10 States/UTs who have covered between 75% and 90% of the enrolled children. 12 States/UTs covered children under MDMS below 75% during the year 2012-13. The Govt. of Uttar Pradesh and Chandigarh has covered 54% and 43% of the enrolled children respectively. The details are given at *Annexure-1*.

Programme Approval Board had approved the working days as per the States/UTs education board calendar. It is appreciated that the 11 States/UTs had covered 100% both in Primary and Upper Primary School upto the 4th quarter for the year 2012-13. There are 8 States/UTs at Primary level and 10 States/UTs at Upper Primary level the working days covered below 95%. The States/UTs should be served meals to all the working days. As per RTE Act, 2009, the schools should be open for at least 200 days in primary and 220 days for upper primary. But Assam (184 and 180), Jammu & Kashmir (190 and 194), Mizoram (185 and 190) and Bihar (180 and 177) have covered less number of days in primary as well as upper primary. Similarly, Tamil Nadu (77), Gujarat (100) and Punjab (106) has covered 1/3rd of the approved number of days for NCLP schools. The details are given at *Annexure-II*

The mismatched between utilisation of foodgrains and cooking cost is observed high in UTs viz. Lakshadweep, Chandigarh and Andaman & Nicobar Islands due to more cooking cost share than the norms. Puducherry is providing additional foodgrains to the children from their own resources so the utilization has more than the cooking cost. The details are given at <u>Annexure-III.</u>

The above table shows that 12 States/UTs have shown their utilisation quite satisfactory i.e. foodgrains utilized more than 89%. However, in 5 States the utilisation of foodgrains is very low i.e. below the basis of the data submitted by the States/UTs upto the 4th quarter that 75%. The States/UTs should ensure that schools serve MDMS in all working days with prescribed quantity and quality. The details are given at *Annexure-IV*

Cooking cost is one of the main components of the MDMS. The central Govt. has released the cooking cost to the States/UTs in time to run the MDMS program without interruption. The above table depicted that only 13 States/UTs were able to utilize cooking cost against the allocation for FY 2012-13 more than 90%. Whereas 18 States/UTs have utilized cooking cost between 75% and 90%. The low utilization of cooking cost is observed in 5 States/UTs viz., Jammu & Kashmir (71%), Manipur (64%), Puducherry (42%) and Sikkim (37%). This indicates that there are some problems for running the MDMS programme without interruption with prescribed calorific and nutritional values. The details are given at *Annexure-V*

The payment to the transport agencies should be made in timely manner but above table depicted that the utilisation of Transportation Assistance is observed low in 14 States/UTs i.e. below 75% utilisation of TA. The details are given at **Annexure-VI**.

Chhattisgarh covered under De-Centralised Procurement (DCP) Scheme

According to the FCI statements provided to the Department, it is revealed that 22 States/UTs have made the payment above 50%. The above table depict that in the entire North Eastern States there is very low payment made to FCI i.e. below 20% of the billed raised by FCI. To make the payment process faster and easy the Central Govt. issued notification vide order No.F-1-15/2009-Desk(MDM) dated 10-02-2010 for decentralised payment of cost of foodgrains at the District level. The States/UTs should be look into the matter and 100% payment to the FCI should be made against their bills raised within fortnight. The details are given at *Annexure-VII*

One of the most important components in the MDMS is Cook-cum-helpers(CCHs). Some of the States like Tripura, Puducherry, Andhra Pradesh, Mizoram, Punjab and A&N Islands have paid more than 100% honorarium to cook-cum-helpers because higher contribution of honorarium to CCH from their State share, which is appreciated. There are below 80% payment of honorarium made by 7 States/UTs upto 4th Quarter of the year 2012-13. The States/UTs should develop mechanism for making 100% payment of honorarium to CCHs in a timely manner. The details are given at *Annexure-VIII*.

For better implementation of MDMS at the grass root level there are MME funds to be utilized fully by the States/UTs, whereas above table depict that the utilisation of MME is less than 80% which is below national average (91%) in 15 States/UTs. In order to implement the scheme without interruption, the State has to setup management structure by hiring professional qualified staff on contract basis, monitoring of the Scheme, publicity, external evaluation, inspections, local level meetings / workshop, etc. from this funds. The details are given at *Annexure-IX*.

It is evident from the above that inspection is 100% or more than 100% in 16 States and below 70% in 12 States. The States below 70% are requested to put in place some system for the better inspection and monitoring of the Scheme. It is mentioned that Central Government provides 100% funds (MME) to the States / UTs for Management, Monitoring and Evaluation of the Scheme. The details are given at *Annexure-X*.

It is explicitly clear that no meeting of SSMC has been convened in the States/UTs of Arunachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Nagaland, Sikkim, Nagaland, Tamil Nadu during the year 2012-13. It is also important to mention that 6 State/UT did not convene any meetings in any quarter during the year.

MDM guidelines provide that SSMC meeting should be convened in each quarter under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary of the States / UTs. The SSMC is an apex body headed by the Chief Secretary at the State/UT level for guiding, monitoring and implementation of the scheme at State/UT level. A representative of the Department of School Education and Literacy, Government of India and nodal officer of the Monitoring Institute should be invariably invited to the meetings to share their views. The details are given at *Annexure-XI*.

11. School Health Programme (SHP)

The State Governments of Assam, Haryana, Kerala, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh have reported through their QPR that no activities relating to School Health Programme were carried out in the 4th quarter of the year 2012-13.

The analysis of the data reveals that during the FY 2013-14, 11.79 crore children (83%) were screened for Health check-up, out of the total enrolment of 14.20 crore children in the schools, IFA dosage were distributed to 5.85 crore children (41%) and 7.75 crore children (54%) received deworming medicine. The height and weight were recorded for 8.12 crore children (57%) and 8.27 crore children (58%) respectively during the year. The details are given at *Annexure-XII and Annexure-XII(a)*.

12. Implementation agencies

MDM Guidelines envisage that MDM Scheme also provides opportunity for involvement of communities, SHGs in the management of the programme, thus ensuring that teaching-learning activities in the classroom are not affected, while SHGs take responsibility for regular procurement, cooking and serving of mid day meals. In the selection, priority should be given to SHGs with membership of poor women, and whose children are participating in the MDM programme. Around 3.56 crore children in 2.6 lakh schools are covered by the SHGs. 73 lakh children (7% of the total beneficiaries) are catered by 1368 NGOs. The details are given at *Annexure-XIII*.

It is evident from the above table that LPG is used for cooking in majority (80 to 100%) of schools in 6 States and below 40% in 7 States. 8 States / UTs have reported that there is no LPG connection in any of the schools. All the States/UTs have fed annual data entry for 99.7% schools across the country during 2012-13. Most of the States/UTs have almost completed the annual data entry into the portal except Delhi (68%). A meeting was convened at Ministry level to sort out the difficulties / problems amongst different agencies of the Govt. of NCT but annual data entry is yet to be completed for the year 2012-13. Subject: Release of balance of 1st installment of recurring Central Assistance under Mid Day Meal Scheme

Sir / Madam,

I am directed to say that as per the instructions contained in the General Financial Rules, the unspent balance lying with the States/UTs Government from previous year releases is to be taken into account at the time of making releases during the next financial year. The adjustment would be possible only if the States/UTs submit information on the unspent balance immediately after the closing of financial year. The same is still awaited.

2. Since the compilation of information on unspent balance is a time consuming process because information is to be collected from the field units and compiled thereafter at State level. Therefore, keeping in view the practical difficulties of the State Governments, this Department has been releasing the 1st installment of admissible recurring Central Assistance to the States/UTs in two installments i.e. 25% ad-hoc release is made without asking for the information on unspent balance from the previous year and the balance 35% of the first installment, is released after receiving information on the component wise unspent balance of the previous year.

- This Department had already released 25% ad-hoc grant to all States/UTs during 3. the second fortnight of April, 2013 without waiting for the unspent balance position against recurring Central Assistance during 2012-13. The balance 35% of 1st installment's recurring Central Assistance is to be released on receipt of information on the component wise unspent balance lying with the State Governments/UTs as on 1st April, 2013. The States Government are therefore, requested to submit the component wise information on the unspent balance as on 01.04.2013 from last year's central assistance in the enclosed proforma (Annexure-I) by 24th June, 2013 positively. Similarly unspent balance of the food grains lying with the State Governments may also be submitted in the proforma (Annexure-II) by the same date. Soft copy of the at gaya.prasad@nic.in information may kindly be sent by email amarjs57@gmail.com.
- 4. The State Government/ UTs may also refer to this department's letter of even no. dated 14th May, 2013 wherein States/UTs were requested to provide information on Minimum Mandatory State Share against the recurring Central Assistance released by this department during 2011-12 and 2012-13 for cooking cost and honorarium to cookcum-helpers. This information on State Share for cooking cost and honorarium to cookcum-helpers is also required to be submitted against ad-hoc release of 25% during 2013-14. The same may also be provided by 24th June, 2013 in the enclosed proforma (*Annexure-III*).
- 5. To sum up, it is therefore, requested to submit the following information before or by 24th June, 2013 to enable us to release balance of 1st installment:
