Dear Sir/Madam.

As you are well aware, preparation of hygienic and wholesome meal under the Mid Day Meal Scheme (MDMS) is contingent upon the knowledge and skills of staff and cook-cum-helpers (CCHs) engaged for providing meal in the schools. The Self Help Groups and CCHs, who are the pillars of the MDMS, mainly come from the deprived sections of the society. Majority of them have very limited knowledge about nutrition, cooking process, health and hygiene, cleaning of raw grains and vegetables, recipes, serving skills, time management, maintenance of stock and cash registers etc. It is, therefore, essential that the capacity of the workforce at the field level is built on an ongoing basis.

- 2. Currently, about 25.38 lakh CCHs are engaged all over the country for cooking of the mid-day meal at the school level. These CCHs are responsible for preparing hygienic food for the children on a daily basis. All these devoted people are the strength of this programme and they are preparing food and feeding the children using their own knowledge and skills. Training of such CCHs contributes greatly in enhancing the effectiveness of the Mid Day Meal Scheme.
- 3. Earlier in 2012, on the request of this Department, Ministry of Tourism (MoT) had agreed to provide training to selected CCHs as master trainers through Institutes of Hotel Management (IHMs) and Food Craft Institutes (FCIs). MoT had approved a scheme for training of CCHs of MDMS under their Programme namely Capacity Building for Service Providers (CBSP). Accordingly, all States/UTs were requested vide this Department's d.o. letter no. 5-2/2013-MDM-1-1 (EE-5) dated February 12, 2013 (copy, along with enclosures, enclosed for ready reference) to nominate CCHs to get the training as master trainers. Approximately 926 master trainers have so far been trained under the scheme of MoT. The trained master trainers go back greatly enthused; and in turn train other CCHs in a cascade model of training.
- 4. Further, recently training of master trainers was carried out in Gujarat and Jharkhand in July, 2017 by an NGO, Akshaypatra. 28 master trainers in Gujarat and 98 master trainers in Jharkhand were trained. These master trainers were quite satisfied with the training and plan to train fellow

CCHs in a cascading way in Gujarat and Jharkhand. The results of training of cook-cum-helpers were quite encouraging.

- 5. This Ministry has again requested the MoT to continue to arrange the training programmes vide d.o. letter dated 08.02.2017 from Secretary (SE&L) (copy enclosed). The States/UTs are requested to kindly get in touch with the MoT for training of maximum number of selected CCHs as master trainers through Institutes of Hotel Management (IHMs) and Food Craft Institutes (FCIs)
- 6. The States/UTs are also requested to get all the untrained CCHs engaged under MDMS trained by 31-12-2017 through MoT/master cooks trained under said scheme of MoT. The progress of such training may be reviewed in the Regional Workshops on MDMS, as and when held. The status of progress of training of the CCHs during 2017-18 may be intimated to me on monthly basis (within one week of the close of the month) through e-mail. Dr. Anindita Shukla, Senior Consultant, TSG-MDM, Ed.CIL (Mobile-9891266209); (e-mail: banindita76@yahoo.com), Nodal Officer from this Department in this regard, may also be kept informed about progress of such training. It is also requested that the information to be furnished should include the number of CCHs engaged/already trained/untrained; and number of CCHs the State/UT intends to train through MoT/master cooks/other sources.
- 7. We feel feeding millions of hungry children is truly a noble cause, which we all are privileged to carry out. A little effort on our part will make this effort even more effective, and benefit millions of children all over the country.

Dear Sir/Madam,

As you are aware that the Mid Day Meal Programme is the world's largest noon meal programme for school children. Under this programme, 10.54 crore children are provided hot cooked meals in 12.12 lakh schools, in the country on a daily basis.

- 2. It is an incontrovertible fact that school meal programme exerts a positive influence on enrolment and attendance in schools. Many studies have also shown that MDMS has helped in preventing classroom hunger; promoting school participation and fostering social equality and enhancing gender equity thereby facilitating overall healthy growth of children.
- 3. The responsibility of providing nutritious cooked mid-day-meal to every child lies with the State Governments and Union Territory Administrations, under the guidelines issued by the Government of India. At present there are about 27 lakh Cook-cum-Helpers engaged in schools for preparation and serving to children of Mid-day meal on a daily basis. The success of the Mid-Day Meal Programme revolves around the manner in which it is implemented at the schools. Safety and hygiene standards must be set and practiced with rigour.
- 4. Preparation of hygienic and wholesome meal is contingent upon the knowledge and skills of staff and cook-cum-helpers engaged for providing meal in the schools. The insufficiently trained staff to manage the programme is a big constraint in the overall management. Self Help Groups and Cook cum Helpers (CCH) are the pillars of the MDMS. Majority of them come from the deprived sections of the society where they have very limited information about nutrition, cooking process, health and hygiene, preparation of raw grains and vegetables, recipes, serving skills, time management, maintenance of stock and cash registers etc. These staff are not being provided adequate orientation on issues relating to health, hygiene & cleanliness. It is also equally important for them to know how to handle cooking gas/kerosene, wherever in use.



- 5. It has become essential that the workforce managing the Scheme especially the Cooks-cum helpers must, therefore, be informed of cooking varieties and methods of the nutritional aspects of a meal. This calls for bringing up resource persons from amongst the existing service providers, who can be trained to imbibe these abilities and who in turn will serve as motivators and masters for others.
- 6. We would like to train a few cooks in all the states, who in turn can train others in a cascade model of training. We believe this will contribute greatly to enhancing the effectiveness of the Mid Day Meal scheme. Some of the reputed hotels and hospitality groups have already undertaken training and capacity building of the Cook-cum-Helpers engaged in the Mid Day Meal Scheme, as part of their Corporate Social Responsibility. - 7. This Ministry proposes to conduct Training of the Trainee (ToTs) in convergence with Ministry of Tourism (MoT).
 - (i) The training will be imparted by the Institutes of Hotel management (IHMs) and the Food Craft Institutes (FCIs) designated by MoT for the purpose. The training module covering the following 6 areas will be developed by Institute of Hotel Management (IHM), PUSA, New Delhi in consultation with MHRD, also taking inputs from the Principals of IHMs at Lajpat Nagar and Chandigarh, as also the Consultant Academic in National Council for Hotel Management and Catering Technology (NCHMCT). A ten day full time course (9 a.m. to 5 p.m.) will be organised covering the following aspects:-
 - (a) Knowledge dissemination regarding the caloric and nutritive values of Mid-Day Meal
 - (b) Methods of cooking for retaining the nutritive value of cooking ingredients.
 - (c) Awareness regarding issues of malnutrition and also benchmark of nutrition
 - (d) Importance of Hand washing
 - (e) General health and Hygienic practices and concerns
 - (f) Communication skill

- (ii) A group of 30 cooks will be given training in each Institute. However, in no circumstances the course with less than 15 cooks will be conducted.
- (iii) The States/UTs should ensure that the cooks nominated are VIIIth class pass so that they can serve as trainers for training other cooks. (In case educational qualification is required to be relaxed, the reasons may be given. However, in any case the cooks should be found to be eligible to clear the Course Test).

(iv) Efforts will be made to nominate/train as many cooks as possible during the school vacations. The provisional target for financial 2012-13 will be to nominate 600 cooks.

- (v) A trainee will be paid a compensation @ Rs. 200/- per working day subject to maximum of Rs. 2000/. TA, DA and stay arrangement of the Cook cum helpers will be borne by the respective State Government/UT Administration. No fee will be charged for the training.
- (vi) The trainees with minimum attendance of 90 per cent will be required to appear in a Course Test and those who pass successfully will be awarded joint certificate of MHRD and IHMs/FCIs. For the purpose of the test, there will be one internal and one external examiner- the latter will be drawn from a panel of experts maintained by NCHMCT.
- 7. You are therefore, requested to nominate 30 cook cum helpers from your State for each Institute as per List to get the training as ToTs, for ten days. These nominations of Cooks cum helpers should be sent to MHRD by 28th February 2013 with complete details as per attached 'Annexure-I'. These trainings will be held at the Institutes of the Hotel Management (IHMs) at State level (Annexure-II attached).
- 8. The requisite information as per Annexure-I may be sent by 28th February 2013 to this Ministry so that the trainings can be started in March 2013.
