Executive Summary of all the District Reports of MDM

1. Angul District:

- Hot Cooked meal is served in all sample schools. Since 1-4-12, only in 15 (37.5%) schools MDM service has been interrupted for a few days for reasons like rice shortage, fuel shortage, rainfall etc.
- Out of every hundred enrolled children, 52 children have not taken MDM because 44 have not come to school and 08 have gone to home to take home-made food or eat home made tiffin on the visit day of MI to the schools.
- There are 14 (35%) schools, where it is found that the amount of rice actually cooked is less than the amount of rice required for the children who actually consumed MDM. At Govt. Town UPS of Angul Munciplity on 28-7-12, for instance 190 children (122 Pr + 68 Upper Pr.) took MDM. As per the MDM norm, 22 kg. 400 gm of rice should be cooked but only 16 kg. of rice was cooked.
- Food-grains have not been received regularly, since 1-4-12 by all of the sample schools. In turn, rice is given for several months to schools at one time and hence rice stock remains for 3 to 5 months.
- 29 (72.5%) out of the 40 sample schools have received 01 month's extra food-grains and 30 (75%) schools have received the food-grains at school point. Food-grain quality has been good in all cases.
- Cooking cost has not been received regularly in advance by any school. Not a single schools has received it since April 2012. The SMC / SHG / HM is to pay from their own fund to run the MDM scheme for several months and hence face a lot of difficulties.
- Social equity is seen everywhere relating to cooking, serving and seat arrangement for MDM.
- Weekly menu is displayed in 32 (80%) schools but all 40 sample schools serve variety of food items as per the prescribed menu.
- Children are happy with both quality and quantity of food items in all schools.
- Healthcare and supplementary nutrient facilities have not been provided since 1-4-12.
 Health card is found in only 10 schools but does contain health related data in only 04 schools.

- Cooks and Helpers have not yet got the remuneration of Rs.1000/- per month. But the District has already taken steps to provide it shortly. The District however should ensure that people should be posted as Cook-cum-Helper and not as Cook or Helper.
- Pucca kitchen-cum-store has been constructed in many schools but are used in only 02 schools for both cooking and storing purposes. 17 schools do not use the constructed pucca kitchen for cooking and 26 schools do not use it for storing for reasons like space shortage, ventilation problem, fear of theft etc.
- ✤ 39 (97.5%) schools have potable drinking water facility. 22(55%) schools have adequate cooking utensils but none has storing utensils.
- In most of the schools, children wash hands and utensils before and after eating. They also partake meals in an orderly manner.
- Parents / SMCs / PRI supervise MDM occasionally but a roster for MDM supervision is not maintained.
- Community in many schools has expressed satisfaction over the quantity of MDM served and has felt that MDM contributes to raise child attendance and general health.
- ✤ Inspection visits of MDM officials is very rare.

2. Ganjam District:

- Hot Cooked meal is served in all sample schools. Since 1-4-12, in no sample schools MDM service has been interrupted for any reason
- Out of every hundred enrolled children, only 63 children are taking MDM because 29 are not coming to school and 08 go home to take food or eat home made tiffin.
- In rural schools, an NGO called Nandi Foundation provides MDM which violates the GoI norm. Further, it does not adhere to the State Govt. declared weekly menu to provide MDM. It follows its own menu. It claims MDM expenditure for more number of children than those who have actually attended the school or taken MDM.
- Food-grains are not received regularly every month since 1-4-12 by most of the schools because rice has been supplied to schools for several months at a time. Further, many schools have mentioned that less amount of rice is supplied than what they sign to have received. In the absence of a digital / electronic weighing machine, they are unable to measure the quantity if rice they actually receive from the supplier.

- 6 (15%) out of the 40 sample schools have received 01 month's extra food-grains as buffer stock for every month during April to August, 2012. Most of the schools have received the food-grains at school point. Food-grain quality has been good in almost all cases.
- Cooking cost has not been received regularly every month in advance by many schools.
- Social equity is seen everywhere relating to cooking, serving and seat arrangement for MDM.
- Weekly menu prescribed by the State Govt. is not displayed in any school. The menu has been changed by the NGO and District. But all schools serve variety of food items every day.
- Children are happy with both quality and quantity of food items in all schools.
- Healthcare and supplementary nutrient facilities are not available in any school.
- Cooks and Helpers do not get remuneration regularly in most of the schools every month. In a majority of the schools, they belong to weaker sections. They have not got the remuneration of Rs.1000/- per month as per the GoI norm in some schools.
- Pucca kitchen-cum-store has been constructed in only 14 (35%) schools but most of them are not used either for cooking or for storing purpose only. In some schools MDM is cooked in school verandah or in an open place. 26 (65%) schools have not got the sanction to construct it.
- 38 (95%) out of 40 schools have potable drinking water facility. Majority of the schools have adequate cooking utensils but none has storing utensils.
- In majority of schools, children wash hands and utensils before and after eating. They also partake meals in an orderly manner in all schools.
- Parents / SMCs / PRI supervise MDM occasionally but a roster for MDM supervision is not maintained in any school.
- Community in many schools has expressed satisfaction over the quantity of MDM served and has felt that MDM contributes to raise child attendance and general health.
- Inspection visits of MDM officials is very rare.

3. Rayagada District:

- Hot Cooked meal is served in all sample schools. Since 1-4-12, in no schools, MDM service has been interrupted for any days.
- Out of every hundred enrolled children, 62 children are taking MDM because 33 are not coming to school and 05 go home to take home-made food.
- 10 (25%) schools have cooked rice less than the amount required for the children actually have consumed MDM and 13 (32.5%) schools have cooked rice more than the amount required for the children who have actually consumed MDM.
- Food-grains are not received regularly by the schools but 24 (60%) schools have got 2-8 kg. less supply of rice per 50 kg. bag. The HT is compelled to sign on the receipt to have received 50 kg. of rice per 50 kg. bag. In the absence of a digital / electronic weighing machine at school, they are unable to measure the actual amount of rice received by them.
- 22 (55%) out of 40 sample schools have received 01 month's extra food-grains and 34 (85%) schools have received the food-grains at school point. Food-grain quality has been good in all schools who have received the food grains.
- Cooking cost has never been received in advance by any school every month regularly since 1-4-12. All schools have not received it since April.
- Social equity is seen everywhere relating to cooking, serving and seat arrangement for MDM.
- Weekly menu prescribed by the State Govt. is displayed in 29 (72.5%) out of the 40 sample schools. Different food items are served everyday in all schools.
- Children are happy with both quality and quantity of food items in all schools.
- ✤ Healthcare and supplementary nutrient facilities have not been provided since 1-4-12.
- Cooks and Helpers do not get remuneration of Rs.1000/- per month. In almost all schools, they belong to weaker sections. They get Rs.600/- and Rs.400/- per month respectively. At school point, Cook-cum-Helpers have not replaced the Cook and Helper as per the GoI norm.
- Pucca kitchen-cum-store has been constructed in 29 (72.5%) schools but out of them in 20 (68.9%) school, it is not used either for cooking or for storing purpose in 20 (50%) schools. Some schools cook in school verandah and store in classroom.
- 32 (80%) out of the 40 sample schools have potable drinking water facility. 22 schools (55%) have adequate cooking utensils but none has storing utensils.

- In most of the schools, children wash hands and utensils before and after eating. They also partake meals in an orderly manner in all schools.
- Parents / SMCs/ PRI supervise MDM occasionally but a roster for MDM supervision is not maintained.
- Community in many schools has expressed satisfaction over the quantity of MDM served and has felt that MDM contributes to raise child attendance and general health.
- ✤ Inspection visits of MDM officials is very rare.

4. Gajapati District:

- Hot Cooked meal is served in all sample schools. Since 1-4-12, only in 09 schools MDM service has been interrupted for a few days for reasons like, rice shortage and no payment of salary to Cook and Helper for May and June, 2012.
- Out of every hundred enrolled children only 29 children are taking MDM because 25 are not coming to school and 04 goes home to take home-made food.
- 10 schools have cooked rice less than the amount required for the children who have actually consumed MDM.
- 08 schools have cooked rice more than the amount required for the children who have actually consumed MDM.
- Food-grains are received regularly by only 03 (7.5%) sample schools. 23 (57.5%) schools have got 01 to 06 kg. less supply of rice per 50 Kg. bag.
- Only 04 (10%) schools have received 01 month's extra food-grains regularly for every month since 1-4-12.
- 28 (70%) schools have received the food-grains at school point. Food-grain quality has been good in all 40 sample schools.
- Cooking cost has never been received in advance every month regularly in any school. Schools have not got the cooking cost from April 2012 onwards.
- Social equity is seen in all schools relating to cooking, serving and seat arrangement for MDM.
- Weekly menu prescribed by the State Govt. is displayed at a visible place in 34 (85%) out of 40 sample schools. Different food items are served everyday in all 40 schools.
- Children are happy with both quality and quantity of food items in all 40 sample schools.
- ✤ Healthcare and supplementary nutrient facilities have not been provided since 1-4-12.

- Cooks and Helpers do not get remuneration regularly in most of the schools every month. They have not got it since April, 2012. In majority of schools, they belong to weaker sections.
- Pucca kitchen-cum-store has been constructed in 30 (75%) sample schools but are not used either for cooking or for storing purpose in many of them. Some schools cook in school verandah or open space and store in classroom.
- 36 (90%) schools have potable drinking water facility. Only 26 (65%) schools have adequate cooking utensils but none has storing utensils.
- In 25 (62.5%) schools, children wash hands and utensils before and after eating but in 38 (95%) schools, they partake meals in an orderly manner.
- Parents / SMCs / PRI supervise MDM occasionally but a roster for MDM supervision is not maintained.
- Community in many schools has expressed satisfaction over the quantity of MDM served and has felt that MDM contributes to raise child attendance and general health.
- ✤ Inspection visits of MDM officials is very rare.

ANGUL DISTRICT

Introduction:

Angul District is located in the central region of ODISHA State. It has 1569 number of schools covered under SSA (DISE 2011-12 data from DPO). The District office concerned with MDM scheme is located at Angul town. In order to implement MDM activities, District as well as Block level officials have been engaged. Besides, the teachers, SMC members and PRI members are also allowed to supervise the MDM scheme at school level. As per the MDM guidelines, rice is provided to the SHG/SMC who prepares and provides MDM purchasing dal, egg, mealmakers, vegetables and fuel. Each school is to get the cooking cost in advance every month and produce the expenditure statement along with vouchers to the Block office every month for release of the expenditure amount.

Procedure and criteria adopted for selection of sample schools:

As per the MoU and ToR, 40 schools have been identified in discussion with the DPO staffs of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan of the District on 27-07-12 for monitoring of MDM activities at school level. The guidelines mentioned in the ToR have been followed for school selection. The 40 schools include 8 urban schools and 32 rural schools. The school wise details of criteria basing upon which the sample schools have been identified have been reflected in the DPO's **letter no. 1390/Estt, dtd. 27-07-12** placed at page **13**. Out of the 40 sample schools, 36 have Primary schooling, 27 have Upper Primary schooling. Each of the 40 sample schools has been visited by 01 of the members of the monitoring team who has spent 01 full day at the school to collect the MDM related data as per the format prescribed by the MHRD, GoI. The Nodal Officer has also visited one-third of the 40 sample schools as per the ToR. The data have been obtained by interacting with children, teachers, cook, helper, SHG/SMC/NGO providing MDM at school point and by observing the process of MDM preparation, storage and distribution. The data then have been cross-checked, cleaned and tabulated for analysis in respect of different aspects of the MDM scheme.

REGULARITY IN SERVING MEAL:	Students, Teachers & Parents
Whether the school is serving hot cooked meal daily? If there was interruption, what was the extent and reasons for the same?	

The MI has visited 40 schools and has found that hot cooked meal is served in every school. In only 15 of these schools since 1-4-12 provision of MDM has been stopped for some days (for school wise details, see Table 1.1 at page 15). There are several reasons for it but what matters most is stoppage if MDM due to lack of rice or cooking cost. As per the MDM guidelines cooking cost in advance should be released every month by the first week to the bank account of each school and rice is to be supplied to each school every month along with a buffer stock of one month. But for some reasons this has not happened for some 1. schools where MDM provision has been stopped for some days due to lack of rice or cooking cost. The District Nodal Officer for MDM at present does not have the required Cluster Level and Block level Nodal Officer to get the feedback data from school point every month or week. The state can engage the CRCCs as Cluster Level Nodal Officer for MDM and get the feedback data from school point. Similarly, the Block Level Nodal Officer for MDM may be provided with 01 computer set, 01 operator and 01 Accountant to update all feedback data on regular supply of rice and cooking cost in advance, stoppage of MDM for rainfall is very rare and occurs when there is heavy rainfall regulating into very low attendance. Stoppage of MDM due to other reasons are also very rare and does not warrant any change in policy decision at present.

In the 40 sample schools, 8,536 children had been enrolled and for all of them MDM provision has been made by the government. On the date of MI's visit to these schools, 4,753 (55.7%) children had attended the schools. In all 40 schools except the Nuapada PS, some children had not attended the school on the day of visit of MI. The teachers could not say correctly the reasons for which those children had remained absent from school. There is practically neither any process nor any mechanism followed in each school as well as in the District to record the reasons for non-attendance of the children. No systematic measure has been taken by the SMC to raise the percentage of attendance of children. Further, the District has not taken any step to identify the cases of double / fake enrollment and delete their names from the students' attendance register. In our MDM reports for the 2nd half year of 2010-11 as well as for the 1st half year of 2011-12, the State had been requested to make a study on students' absenteeism and take appropriate measures in this regard to reduce students' absenteeism but it appears that the District has not taken any such steps.

In addition, 8.1% children who had attended the schools, had not taken MDM. These children belong to 17 schools (Table 2.1 at page 16). In 02 of these schools, MDM was not cooked, for which reason the children could not eat MDM. In other 15 schools, some children did not take MDM for varied reasons. For instance, in J.D. Sahi UGHS, many children could not eat MDM because they had not brought their plate. MDM cooking was stopped from 23.07.12 to 26.07.12 owing to lack of rice and was started on the visit day of MI (27.07.12) which was not informed to children. In Shikshakpada UPS, Saismita Sahu, Rupali Biswal and Rajashree Sahoo of class VI could not eat MDM on visit day of MI (28.07.12) because they had not brought plates from home. On 31.07.12, at Khemala NUPS,

Sulekha Sethi and Gayatri Sahoo of Class IV and Chandan Nayak of Class VII also could not eat MDM because they had not brought plates from home. In all these cases, the concerned schools also had no plates to provide for these children. This problem can only be solved if each school procures from MDM/SSA fund some stainless steel plates and glasses for the children as per requirement. The State and the District MDM authority may take appropriate measure in this regard.

There are 29 (72.5%) out of 40 schools (Table 2.1) where MDM has not been cooked as per the number of children actually availed MDM on the visit day of the MI. Out of these, in 14 schools less quantity of rice has been cooked than the amount required for the children who actually consumed MDM (for details see Table 2.1at page 16). For instance, in Government Town UPS in Angul Municipality on 28.07.12, 122 primary children and 68 Upper Primary children (total 190) consumed MDM. The SMC of this school manages MDM and on that day, it had cooked only 16 kg of rice instead of the required 22 kg. 400 gm. of rice.

On the contrary, there are 15 schools where more quantity of rice has been cooked than the amount required for the children who actually consumed MDM. For instance, at Khamar NUPS of Pallahara Block, 127 children (26 P &101 UP) consumed MDM on 2.08.12, the visit day of MI and as per MDM guidelines, 17 kg. 750 g. of rice was required to be cooked. But the SMC who manages the MDM had cooked 24 kg. 450 gm. of rice i.e. for all 174 children (33 P + 141 UP) who had attended the school on that day. The excess amount of rice was taken away by the Cook and Helper later on.

<u>REGULARITY IN DELIVERING FOOD GRAINS</u> <u>TO SCHOOL LEVEL:</u> (i) Is school receiving food grain regularly? If there is delay in delivering food grains, what is the extent of delay and reasons for the same?

School level registers, MDM Registers, Head Teacher, School level MDM functionaries.

3. Out of the 40 sample schools, no school has received rice regularly every month since 1-4-12 (For school wise details, see Table 3.1 at page 17). In case all schools the reason of delay is found to be availability of stock for several months. The schools are provided with rice stock for 3 to 5 months at a time or even more in some cases. Thus there is a buffer stock of more than 03 months in some schools. Dal, vegetable, mealmaker and eggs are procured from local markets.

(ii) Is buffer stock of one-month's
requirement is maintained?School level registers, MDM Registers, Head
Teacher, School level MDM functionaries

There is a buffer stock of one month's requirement of rice in 29 out of the 40 sample schools (For school wise details see, Table 3.1). Data on the rest 11 sample schools are not available because of absence of MDM register.

(iii) Is the quantity of food grains supplied as per the marked / indicated weight?

In 28 out of 40 sample schools, rice has been supplied less than the marked weight of the bag (i.e. 50kg). Rice has been received less up to an amount of 2 to 5 kg per 50 kg. bag (for school wise details see Table 3.1). The Block / District officers have not taken appropriate measures to address this problem. The schools receiving less amount of rice complain that they are compelled to give signature on the receipt to have received 50 kg of rice per bag. Further, teachers are compelled to receive the rice in such cases, this situation is occurring because neither the Block Nodal Office, MDM nor the school has a digital weighing machine to measure the quantity of rice delivered/received. Policy decision be made to provide such machine to each school and each Block Nodal Office, MDM.

GANJAM DISTRICT

Introduction:

Ganjam District is located in the southern region of ODISHA State. It has 3596 number of schools covered under SSA (DISE 2011-12 data from DPO). The District office concerned with MDM scheme is located at Chhatrapur town. In order to implement MDM activities, District as well as Block level officials have been engaged. Besides, the teachers, SMC members and PRI members are also allowed to supervise the MDM scheme at school level. As per the MDM guidelines, rice is provided to the SHG/SMC who prepares and provides MDM purchasing dal, egg, mealmakers, vegetables and fuel. Each school is to get the cooking cost in advance every month and produce the expenditure statement along with vouchers to the Block office every month for release of the expenditure amount.

Procedure and criteria adopted for selection of sample schools:

As per the MoU and ToR, 40 schools have been identified in discussion with the DPO staffs of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan of the District on 6-8-12 for monitoring of MDM activities at school level. The guidelines mentioned in the ToR have been followed for school selection. The 40 schools include 8 urban schools and 32 rural schools. The school wise details of criteria basing upon which the sample schools have been identified have been reflected in the DPO's **letter no. 3366 dtd. 6-8-12** placed at page 46. Out of the 40 sample schools, 38 have primary schooling and 18 have upper primary schooling. Each of the 40 sample schools has been visited by 01 of the members of the monitoring team who has spent 01 full day at the school to collect the MDM related data as per the format prescribed by the MHRD, GoI. The Nodal Officer has also visited one-third of the 40 sample schools as per the ToR. The data have been obtained by interacting with children, teachers, Cook, Helper, SHG/SMC/NGO providing MDM at school point and by observing the process of MDM preparation, storage and distribution. The data then have been cross-checked, cleaned and tabulated for analysis in respect of different aspects of the MDM scheme.

the State had been requested to make a study on students' absenteeism and take appropriate measures to reduce it but it appears that the District has not taken any such steps. However, on enquiry to the HM, some preliminary information have been obtained. For instance, in Basanapalli PS, it was found that A. Deepak Murti of Class III is a long absentee and the HM said that he has enrolled himself in another school but has not taken T.C. But when enquired about G. Mangulu of Class III who is also a long absentee, the same HM had expressed that he did not know the reason for it. The case of Tarini Naik of Class VIII of Chikalakhandi UGHS is different. He is a long absentee and the HM says that he does not come to school because he is engaged in some work to earn for his family. It was also reported by the HM of Gedalpalli PS that B. Devraj Patro and K. Harekrushna Patro of Class V have gone to Surat along with their parents and hence they are long absentees. On the other hand, D. Balakrushna Reddy is a long absentee because he has migrated from Gedalpalli to Jhadukuda.

The case of T. Somanath Reddy of Class I of Tellapalli PS needs a special mention. Being a CWSN, he is unable to come to school and hence has become a long absentee. Despite special provision for the CWSN in the RTE Act, Somanath has not yet got the required support to come to school regularly.

The cases of Anshuman Das and Abinash Das of Class IV of Ramchandrapur PS are also peculiar. The HM admits that these two children are long absentees because they have gone to their uncle's house after the death of their father but their names have not been struck off from the Enrollment Register.

The above evidences indicate that some of the children not coming to school are long absentees. At least the District should take appropriate measure to identify the long absentees and their names be struck off from the Enrollment Register following proper procedure.

When a comparison has been made between the 08 urban schools and the 32 rural schools, it is observed that the student absenteeism is 27.1% in rural schools and 35.2% in urban schools. This reveals that the extent of student absenteeism is much less in rural than in urban areas. An in-depth study can only help in unraveling the vicious nexus that compel children not to come to schools despite several school based activities being done under SSA as well as MDM programme. It may also reveal occurrence of any gap in the policy or implementation stage. The District MDM unit should promote a research study in this regard using the prescribed MME grant.

In addition, 8.3% children, who had attended the schools, had not taken MDM. These children belong to 25 schools (Table 2.1 at page 50). These children did not take MDM for varied reasons. For instance, in Purunapatana PS, Anjali Nayak of Class IV and Jagdish Nayak of same class go to home to take food in recess and hence do not take MDM at school. On the other hand, Kusum Gouda and Rojalin Gouda of Class IV did not eat MDM on the visit day of MI because the Dalma was bit more salty in taste. In Ckikalkhandi UGHS, Sipu Sahoo of Class VII did not take MDM on 6-8-12 because he had not brought plate to take MDM. AT Telapalli PS, on 6-8-12, B. Deepak Patra and M. Gopi Reddy of Class IV did not eat MDM because they went home for lunch. Further it is observed that in some schools plates and glasses are not available. Moreover, the school gates are not closed during the time of recess to prevent children to go home to take food. Consequently, some children fail to eat MDM in absence of utensils whereas some children go home to bring utensils to eat MDM.

In Ganjam District, one NGO named Nandi Foundation is providing MDM preparing from its centralized kitchen to schools of Berhampur Municipality, Chhatrapur NAC and Chhatrapur Block areas. Out of the 40 schools monitored, Nandi Foundation provides MDM to 15 schools whereas in the rest 25 schools, either SMC or SHG prepare MDM.

In none of the 15 schools where Nandi Foundation provides MDM, the food items are cooked as per the Weekly menu prescribed by the State. Further, it is unable to cook MDM as per the number of children willing to eat MDM everyday since the cooking process begins much before the school time. In view of this, the number of children taken MDM in a day never matches the number of children for whom it claims to have provided MDM. The latter is always greater than the former. Thus it claims to have served for more number of children than the number of children for whom it actually supplies MDM, MDM is thus grossly mismanaged by the NGOs and hence they should not be encouraged to provide MDM to schools of rural areas.

Besides, there are 13 (52%) out of the rest 25 schools, where the quantum of rice is cooked either more or less than what is required for the number of children actually taken MDM (See Table 2.1 for details). This occurs in those schools who do not have a digital weighing machine to measure the quantity of rice to be cooked. In schools where rice is cooked more than the requirement, the surplus rice is taken away by the Cook/Helper.

REGULARITY IN DELIVERING FOOD GRAINS TO SCHOOL LEVEL:

Out of the 40 sample schools, only 01 school has received rice regularly since 1-4-12 (For school wise details, see Table 3.1 at page 52). In case of 19 schools the reason of delay is found to be availablity of rice stock. This has occurred because these schools have received rice for several months at a time. In 15 schools, the delay could not be assessed because MDM register is not available. It is kept by the NGO at its office.

There is a buffer stock of one month's requirement of rice only in 6 out of the 24 sample schools where MDM register is available (For school wise details see, Table 3.1). It is available for every month during April to August 2012. In other 18 schools, buffer stock is available for 01 or 02 months during this period. In 15 schools, the NGO, Nandi Foundation has not kept the MDM register at school point.

In 20 out of 25 sample schools where rice is delivered, rice has been supplied less than the marked weight of the bag (i.e. 50kg). Rice has been received less up to an amount of 1 to 5 kg. per 50 kg. bag (for school wise details see Table 3.1). The Block / District officers have not taken appropriate measures to address this problem. The schools receiving less amount of rice complain that they are compelled to give signature on the receipt to have received 50 kg. of rice per bag. Further, teachers are compelled to receive the rice in such cases. In case of the rest 15 schools, rice is received by the NGO (Nandi Foundation) at its own office.

RAYAGADA DISTRICT

Introduction:

Rayagada District is located in the southern region of ODISHA State. It has **2089** number of schools covered under SSA (DISE 2011-12 of DPO). The District office concerned with MDM scheme is located at Rayagada town. In order to implement MDM activities, District as well as Block level officials have been engaged. Besides, the teachers, SMC members and PRI members are also allowed to supervise the MDM scheme at school level. As per the MDM guidelines, rice is provided to the SHG/SMC who prepares and provides MDM purchasing dal, egg, mealmakers, vegetables and fuel. Each school is to get the cooking cost in advance every month and produce the expenditure statement along with vouchers to the Block office every month for release of the expenditure amount.

Procedure and criteria adopted for selection of sample schools:

As per the MoU and ToR, 40 schools have been identified in discussion with the DPO staffs of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan of the District on 17-08-12 for monitoring of MDM activities at school level. The guidelines mentioned in the ToR have been followed for school selection. The 40 schools include 8 urban schools and 32 rural schools. The school wise details of criteria basing upon which the sample schools have been identified have been reflected in the DPO's **letter no. 3319 dtd. 17-08-12** placed at page **80**. Out of the 40 sample schools, 38 schools have primary schooling and 20 have upper primary schooling. Each of the 40 sample schools has been visited by 01 of the members of the monitoring team who has spent 01 full day at the school to collect the MDM related data as per the format prescribed by the MHRD, GoI. The Nodal Officer has also visited one-third of the 40 sample schools as per the ToR. The data have been obtained by interacting with children, teachers, cook, helper, SHG/SMC/NGO providing MDM at school point and by observing the process of MDM preparation, storage and distribution. The data then have been cross-checked, cleaned and tabulated for analysis in respect of different aspects of the MDM scheme.

has been taken by the SMC to raise the percentage of attendance of children. Further, the District has not taken any step to identify the cases of double / fake enrollment and delete their names from the students' attendance register. In our MDM reports for the 2nd half year of 2010-11 and 1st half year of 2011-12, the State had been requested to make a study on students' absenteeism and take appropriate measures but it appears that the District has not taken such steps.

In addition, 5.3% children who had attended the schools, had not taken MDM. These children belong to 13 schools (Table 2.1 at page 83). In all these 13 schools, some children did not take MDM for varied reasons. For instance, in Amalabhatta Chhaka PS, Barsha Dakua, Swapnarani Behera and Arjun Sunari of class III and Rupali Goud of class II could not eat MDM on 17-08-12 because they had not brought plates from home and the school had no plates to provide. In Dombosara Kanyashrama, Tirang Sabar of Class IV, Pratima Bhuyan of class V and Namita Pallia of Class VII did not eat MDM on 22-08-12 due to illness. In BadaChandili PUPS, Purnima Pedanti and Anusa Pedanti of Class IV and Sanjana Mandangi of Class III did not eat MDM on 17-08-12 because they had brought tiffin from home. On 17-08-12 at Naidupeta Ps, Mehnaz Begum of Class IV and Imtiaz Ali of Class III did not eat MDM because of Ramzan. On 18-08-12 (Saturday) some Telugu children of Ex-Board Bilingual PS (e.g. Premsai of Class II, S. Saikumar of Class V, T. Behulrani of Class III) did not eat MDM because they do not take egg curry prepared on that day in MDM.

There are 23 schools where the amount of rice cooked for MDM was not as per the prescribed amount of rice for the children actually taken MDM (Table 2.1). In 10 schools, the amount cooked was less than the prescribed amount whereas in 13 schools it was the opposite situation. In latter case, the surplus rice in taken away by the Cook and Helper.

Out of the 38 sample schools, no schools have received rice regularly every month since 1-4-12 (For school wise details, see Table 3.1 at page 84). In case of all these schools the reason of delay is found to be either official or availability of stock. Extent of delay in receiving foodgrains is normally found to be within 01 to 04 months. Dal, vegetable, mealmaker and eggs are procured from local markets. There is only delay in supply of rice to all these schools.

There is a buffer stock of one month's requirement of rice in 22 out of the 40 sample schools (For school wise details see, Table 3.1).

In 24 out of 40 sample schools, rice has been supplied less than the marked weight of the bag (i.e. 50kg). Rice has been received less up to an amount of 2 to 8 kg. per 50 kg. bag (for school wise details see Table 3.1). The Block / District officers have not taken appropriate measures to address this problem. The schools receiving less amount of rice complain that they are compelled to give signature on the receipt to have received 50 kg. of rice per bag. Further, teachers are compelled to receive the rice in such cases. In 02 schools, MDM service has not been started.

GAJAPATI DISTRICT

Introduction:

Gajapati District is located in the southern region of ODISHA State. It has 1444 number of schools covered under SSA (DISE 2011-12 data from DPO). The District office concerned with MDM scheme is located at Parlakhemundi town. In order to implement MDM activities, District as well as Block level officials have been engaged. Besides, the teachers, SMC members and PRI members are also allowed to supervise the MDM scheme at school level. As per the MDM guidelines, rice is provided to the SHG/SMC who prepares and provides MDM purchasing dal, egg, mealmakers, vegetables and fuel. Each school is to get the cooking cost in advance every month and produce the expenditure statement along with vouchers to the Block office every month for release of the expenditure amount.

Procedure and criteria adopted for selection of sample schools:

As per the MoU and ToR, 40 schools have been identified in discussion with the DPO staffs of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan of the District on 23-08-2012 for monitoring of MDM activities at school level. The guidelines mentioned in the ToR have been followed for school selection. The 40 schools include 8 urban schools and 32 rural schools. The school wise details of criteria basing upon which the sample schools have been identified have been reflected in the DPO's **letter dtd. 23-08-12** placed at page **112**. Out of the 40 sample schools, 38 schools have primary schooling and 30 have upper primary schooling. Each of the 40 sample schools has been visited by 01 of the members of the monitoring team who has spent 01 full day at the school to collect the MDM related data as per the format prescribed by the MHRD, GoI. The Nodal Officer has also visited one-third of the 40 sample schools as per the ToR. The data have been obtained by interacting with children, teachers, cook, helper, SHG/SMC providing MDM at school point and by observing the process of MDM preparation, storage and distribution. The data then have been cross-checked, cleaned and tabulated for analysis in respect of different aspects of the MDM scheme.

In the 40 sample schools, 6045 children had been enrolled and for all of them MDM provision has been made by the government. On the date of MI's visit to these schools, 4543 (75.2%) children had attended the schools. Whereas 4310 (71.3%) children had taken MDM. In all 40 schools except the Sevakpur PS, some children had not attended the school on the day of visit of MI. The teachers could not say correctly the reasons for which those children had remained absent from school. There is neither any process nor any mechanism followed in each school and the District to record the reasons for non-attendance of the children. No systematic measure has been taken by the SMC to raise the percentage of attendance of children. Further, the District has not taken any step to identify the cases of double / fake enrollment and delete their names from the students' attendance register. In our MDM report for the 2^{nd} half year of 2010-11 and for the 1^{st} half year of 2011-12, the State had been requested to make a study on students' absenteeism and take appropriate measures but it appears that the District has not taken such steps.

In addition, 3.9% children who had attended the schools had not taken MDM. These children belong to 14 schools (Table 2.1 at page 114). In these schools, some children did not take MDM for varied reasons. For instance, in Gurandi Telugu UPS, N. Rajeswari of class III did not eat MDM on 24-08-12 because she was suffering from fever. For reasons of illness, Rachana Biswal and Uma Sekhar Biswalof class II, Tripati Barik of class VII and Manas Pradhan of class IV of Jajpur PUPS could not eat MDM on 25-08-12. In the same school, Subasini Pradhan and Santoshi Pradhan of class VI and Dhaneswari Jena of class IV did not eat MDM on 25-08-12 because they do not take non-vegetarian item on Saturday on ritual ground and egg curry is the prescribed menu for Saturday and 25-08-12 was a Saturday. In Dr. S.N. Rajguru UPS, some children also did not take MDM on 29-08-12 because they are vegetarian and on 29-08-12 (Wesnesday) egg curry was the prescribed menu. In the schools, some children (e.g. Rohit Pattanaik of class III) also did not take MDM because they have brought tiffin from home. The situation of coming to school but not taking MDM is more found in urban schools them in rural schools.

The MI has also noticed that there are 18 schools, where the quantum of rice cooked for MDM as its visit day was not same as is required for the numbers of children who actually consumed it. In 10 schools, rice was cooked less than the required amount (See Table 2.1 for details) whereas in 08 schools, rice was cooked more that the required amount. In latter case, the surplus fund was taken away by the Cook and Helper.

Major Issues and Policy Recommendations

Basing upon the findings on MDM activities in the 04 sample Districts, some major issues have been identified and policy measures have been suggested for each district separately in earlier chapters and those have been compiled in this chapter. The major issues have been mentioned in section B and the policy recommendation have been delineated in section C. In section A some achievements of the MDM programme have been depicted.

Section A

Achievements:

- 1. Hot cooked MDM is given in all schools in all 04 Districts.
- 2. Good quality of rice is supplied.
- There is no gender / caste / community discrimination in cooking / serving / seating arrangement relating to MDM in any schools in all 04 sample Districts.
- Most of the schools have displayed the MDM weekly menu prescribed by the State Govt. in a visible place in Angul District.
- All schools have served MDM as per the weekly menu prescribed by the State Govt. in Angul District.
- 6. In most of the schools, employment facility has been given to women of backward communities.
- 7. Potable water facility is available in almost all schools.
- Community is satisfied over the quality and quantity of MDM in almost all schools.

Section B

Major Issues:

- 1. Issue of non-provision of MDM on some working days.
 - ✓ Angul District: 15 (37.5%) schools ranging from 02 day to 30 days
 - ✓ Ganjam District : No (0%) schools.
 - ✓ Rayagada District: No (0%) schools.
 - ✓ Gajapati District: 09 (22.5%) schools ranging from 02 day to 09 days
 - \rightarrow Main reasons are rice shortage, rainfall and lack of cooking cost.
- 2. Issue of some enrolled children not coming to school and hence unable to take MDM.
 - ✓ Angul District: 44.3% children.
 - ✓ Ganjam District: 28.8% children.
 - ✓ Rayagada District: 32.2% children.
 - ✓ Gajapati District: 24.8% children.

 \rightarrow One reason may be fake enrollment or enrollment in more than one school or dropout.

 \rightarrow No steps taken by SMCs / District in a planned way to reduce student absenteeism.

3. Issue of some children denying to take MDM although have attended the school.

- ✓ Angul District: 8.1 % children
- ✓ Ganjam District: 8.3 % children
- ✓ Rayagada District: 4.9 % children
- ✓ Gajapati District: 3.9 % children

 \rightarrow The reasons are many: (1) children going to home to take food; (2) children not eating

owing to lack of utensils; and (3) children eating home-made tiffin or snacks purchased from market.

4. Issue of less amount of rice being cooked than the amount required for the children who actually consumed MDM.

→ Reported from Angul, Ganjam, Rayagada and Gajapati Districts.

5. Issue of more amount of rice being cooked than what is required for the children who have actually consumed MDM and the excess amount of rice has been taken away by the Cook and Helper.

→ Reported from Angul, Ganjam, Rayagada and Gajapati Districts.

- 6. Issue of non-engagement of Cook-cum-Helper as per the new GoI MDM norm.
 - → Reported from Angul, Ganjam, Rayagada and Gajapati Districts.
 - → The reasons are: (1) the DNO, MDM has not issued a letter to the HMs (Angul, Rayagada) or (2) the letter of DNO, MDM needs to be more clear and focussed (Ganjam, Gajapati)
- 7. Issue of schools not getting the cooking cost in advance regularly every month.
 - → Reported from Angul, Ganjam, Rayagada and Gajapati Districts.
 - → The reason is: delay by the District Officers to release the cooking cost in advance every month.

8. Issue of engaging Head Teachers in managing MDM

- → Reported from Angul, Ganjam, Rayagada and Gajapati Districts.
- → SMC members take plea that they do not have time to manage MDM but urge that children should get MDM everyday and request the Head Teachers to manage MDM.

 \rightarrow In the event of delay in payment of advance cooking cost, some SHGs are not willing

to manage MDM utilizing their own fund.

9. Non-payment of remuneration of Rs.1000/- per month to Cook and Helper.

→ Reported from Angul, Ganjam, Rayagada and Gajapati Districts.

- 10. Issue of lack of regular health check up and no provision of Vit A, iron tablets and de-worming tablets.
 - → Reported from Angul, Ganjam, Rayagada and Gajapati Districts.

 \rightarrow Reason is: (1) School Helath Programme has not been fully implemented.

11. Issue of lack of pucca kitchen-cum-store at school.

- → Reported from Angul, Ganjam, Rayagada and Gajapati Districts.
- → Reasons are: (1) no sanction of grant to construct kitchen; (2) kitchen is under construction; and (3) construction work has not been started.

12. Issue of non-utilization of pucca kitchen shed-cum-store for cooking / storing purpose.

(a) Not used for cooking:

- ✓ Angul District: 17(56.7%) out of 30 schools having the pucca kitchen.
- ✓ Ganjam District: 07 (50%) out of 14 schools having the pucca kitchen.
- ✓ Rayagada District: 14 (48.3%) out of 29 schools having the pucca kithen.
- ✓ Gajapati District: 07 (23.3%) out of 30 schools having the pucca kitchen.
- \rightarrow Main reasons: space shortage and smoke problem.

(b) Not used for storing:

- ✓ Angul District: 26 (86.7%) out of 30 schools having the pucca kitchen.
- ✓ Ganjam District: 11 (78.6%) out of 14 schools having the pucca kitchen.
- ✓ Rayagada District: 17 (58.6%) out of 29 schools having the pucca kithen.
- ✓ Gajapati District: 17 (56.7%) out of 30 schools having the pucca kitchen.
- \rightarrow Main reasons: space shortage and fear of theft.

13. Issue of inadequate availability of cooking utensils.

- ✓ Angul District: 13 (32.5%) schools.
- ✓ Ganjam District : 23 (57.5%) schools
- ✓ Rayagada District: 18 (45%) schools
- ✓ Gajapati District: 14 (35%) schools.

14. Issue of lack of adequate and regular supervision and monitoring of MDM

- → Reported from Angul, Ganjam, Rayagada and Gajapati Districts.

Section C

Policy Recommendations:

- **1.** Rice stock availability at school be recorded every month and accordingly the required amount of rice be supplied with only 01 month of buffer stock.
- 2. Physical verification of the enrolled children at every school be made and the cases of fake/multiple enrollment / dropout be identified and deleted from the Enrollment Register. The State / District may promote for a research study to find out the reasons for low attendance and non-consumption of MDM at school by enrolled children.
- **3.** School gate may be closed during recess hours and children be motivated to eat MDM together with other children. Eating utesils like steel trays and glass be provided to schools so that children would not go to home in recess to bring them to eat MDM.

- 6. The Head Teachers, SHGs and SMCs may be given onsite support relating to timely submission of vouchers and expenditure statement to the Block Office. Adequate suppoting staff and equipment may be provided to facilitate the District Nodal office, MDM in releasing the advance cooking cost regularly by the 1st week of every month. All CRCCs be engaged as Cluster Nodal Officer for MDM so that they can assist the Block Nodal Officer, MDM in monitoring of MDM.
- The District / Block Nodal Officer for MDM be instructed to ensure noninvolvement of Head Teacher / Teacher in procurement / management of MDM as per the MDM norm.
- **8.** No Head Teacher/ teacher be made accountable for any kind of discrepancy or stoppage in the management or procurement of MDM.
- **9.** The roles of SMC, SHG and teachers relating to MDM management be displayed in a flex board at a visible place in school for generating awareness as well as transparency of MDM rules.
- 10. Each Cook/ Helper be redesignated as Cook-cum-Helper and be paid Rs.1000/- per month as remuneration. The Govt. of India norm relating to engagement of the number of Cook-cum-Helper as per the student strength of school be implemented strictly within a given time period in all schools.
- **11.** The State should take steps to cover all elementary schools under the NRHM scheme for regular health check up and provision of vit. A, iron and de-worming tablets to the needy children.

- 12. For each kitchen shed-cum-store, a chimney may be constructed for release of smoke and shelves may be prepared for storage of food grains and fire wood inside the kitchen shed-cum-store using the maintenance grant. In case of schools having more than 100 children, additional grant may be given for construction of 01/ 02 more pucca kitchen shed-cum-stores depending upon the enrollment strength of the school.
- **13.** Schools having inadequate cooking utensils may be given some grant to procure the required cooking utensils.
- **14.** The supervision and monitoring system needs to be strengthened with documentation of feedback data received by the supervisory and monitoring officers in prescribed formats.
- **15.** Each school may be provided with a digital weighing machine for utilizing it to weigh the food grains/vegetables to be used for cooking and also to take weight measurement of the children to assess their nutritional status.
- **16.** Each school may be given a separate grant to purchase steel-made storage bins to keep the food grains in safe custody. This may be released depending upon the enrollment strength of school.
- 17. NGOs should not be given the responsibility of procuring cooking and supplying the MDM to any rural school and any urban school that has the facility of kitchen as per the GoI norm.
- **18.** All schools be instructed to keep record of the nutritional status of all children and to identify the malnourished children from among them for malnutritional / medical treatment.
