Monitoring Institute Observation:

All the 41 schools visited by MI in the 'North Tripura' district of Tripura serve hot cooked meals but there was no mid day meal for 2 days (28 and 29/9/12) in *Nabincherra High School*, for 23 days (From January'12 to 10 October' 2012) in *Chandrapur Govt. H S School*, for 30 days (From January'12 to October' 2012) in *Chandrapur Govt. H S School* (primary section), for 12 days (from January'12 to October'12) in *Bir Bikram Institution (Primary Section)* and for 17 days (from January'12 to October'12) in *Dharmanagar Govt. Girls H S School (Primary Section)*.

- 1. All the schools visited by MI, i.e. 41 schools, receive foodgrains regularly.
- 2. Buffer stock of one-month's requirement is not maintained in Jampui H S School.
- 3. Quantity of food grain supplied seems to be as per the marked/indicated weight.
- 4. Foodgrain is not delivered in the school premises of 4 schools out of the 41 schools visited by MI. The schools are Piplacherra High School, Uricherra S N S B School, Hemsukla S B

School and Kanchanpur Colony Girls H S School (Primary Section).

Food grain is delivered at the school premises in the remaining 37 schools.

5. All the 41 schools reported that the quality of food grain is good.

4. **REGULARITY IN DELIVERING COOKING COST TO SCHOOL LEVEL:**

- (i) Is school/implementing agency receiving cooking cost in advance regularly? If there is delay in delivering cooking cost, what is the extent of delay and reasons for it?

Monitoring Institute Observation:

- 22 schools out of the 41 schools visited, 54% of the schools, receive cooking cost with a delay of 2/3 months, mainly after submission of bills or adjustment of bills. The schools are LaxmanCherra S. B. School, Paiza Govt. High School, Nabincherra High School, Amratal J B School, Jampui H S School, Rabindranagar H S (+2 stage) school (Primary Section), Kailashahar Girls High School (Primary Section), Yeazekhowra S B School, R K Institution, Asrampalli S B School, Baruakandi Col. H S School, Padmapur J B School, PratyekRoy H S School (primary section), PratyekRoy H S School, Madhya Deocherra Nabin S B School, Deochherra H S School (primary section), Uricherra S N S B School, Hemsukla S B School, Kanchanpur Colony Girls H S School (Primary Section), Kanchanpur J B School, Vanghmun High School and Shantipur North S B School.
- 2. Cooking cost is paid only when the school authorities receive from the district level.
- 3. Cooking cost is paid both in cash and through banking channels.

Monitoring Institute Observation:

- 1. The MI did not observe any gender or caste or community discrimination in cooking or serving or seating arrangements in any of the visited schools.
- 2. There is no specific seating arrangement for the mid day meal scheme in all the 40 visited schools. The students, generally, seat in the 'Verandahs' and take the meal.

'Dinning Shed' is used for dining in the Kanchanpur J B School.

School, Amratal J B School, Jampui H S School, Rabindranagar H S (+2 stage) school (Primary Section), Pekucherra S B School, Algapur High School, Chandrapur Govt. H S School, Tilthai R/C H S School, Paschim Chandrapur S B School, Bir Bikram Institution (Primary Section), Dharmanagar Govt. Girls H S School (Primary Section), Kailashahar Girls High School (Primary Section), Yeazekhowra S B School, R K Institution, Asrampalli S B School and Sidongbanapalli S B School.

The weekly mid day meal menu is Monday - Khichudi, Tuesday - Rice and Egg Curry, Wednesday - Rice and Vegetables, Thursday - Rice and Egg curry. Friday - Rice and Vegetables, and Saturday - Sweet Rice/Payesh.						
	2. The daily menu includes rice and other preparations.

F	 Monitoring Institute Observation: 1. The maximum students of the visited schools reported that the quality of meal is good. However, the quality of meal is bad in R K Institution 						
	 Similarly, the students opined that the quantity of meal is also sufficient but not adequate in R K Institution. 						
	3. In many schools in the 'North Tripura' district, the quality of meal is not up-to the mark so many students do not prefer the meal. Again, in the ST dominated areas, the menu of the						

meal is not inclined to their 'dish'. So the students are also attracted by the same.

9. SUPPLEMENTARY:

- 1. Health card is not maintained in the 40 schools visited. However, health card is maintained by the Shantipur North S B School.
- 2. The frequency of health check-up varies from school to school, like

Thrice/year in Yeazekhowra S B School.

Twice/year in 11 schools, namely, LaxmanCherra S. B. School, Asrampalli S B School, Baruakandi Col. H S School, Padmapur J B School, PratyekRoy H S School (primary section), Huplong Cherra TE H S School (primary section), Pabiacherra Colony High School, Sidongbanapalli S B School, Kanchanpur Colony Girls H S School (Primary Section), Kanchanpur J B School and Shantipur North S B School.

Once/year in 11 schools, namely, Nabincherra High School, Jampui H S School, Rabindranagar H S (+2 stage) school (Primary Section), Pekucherra S B School, Paschim Chandrapur S B School, Pabiacherra Class XII School (primary section), Madhya Deocherra Nabin S B School, Deochherra H S School (primary section), Kacharghat Ramcharan Govt. High School, Uricherra S N S B School and Vanghmun High School.

There is no health check-up in 16 schools, namely, Paiza Govt. High School, Dopatacherra S B School, Amratal J B School, Chandrapur Govt. H S School, Chandrapur Govt. H S School (primary section), Tilthai R/C H S School, Krishnapur H S School (primary section), Bir Bikram Institution (Primary Section), Dharmanagar Govt. Girls H S School (Primary Section), Kailashahar Girls High School (Primary Section), R K Institution, PratyekRoy H S School, Tillabazar H S School, R K Siksha Pratisthan Class XII School, Piplacherra High School and Hemsukla S B School.

H S School (primary section), Tilthai R/C H S School, Paschim Chandrapur S B School, Krishnapur H S School (primary section), Bir Bikram Institution (Primary Section), Dharmanagar Govt. Girls H S School (Primary Section), Kailashahar Girls High School (Primary Section), Pabiacherra Class XII School (primary section), Yeazekhowra S B School, R K Institution, Asrampalli S B School, Baruakandi Col. H S School, Padmapur J B School, PratyekRoy H S School (primary section), Huplong Cherra TE H S School (primary section), Madhya Deocherra Nabin S B School, Deochherra H S School (primary section),

- 1. VEC/SHGs/Panchayat/PRI/Locally appointed persons and in few schools, school teacher are engaged in cooking and serving of the mid day meals.
- 2. Number of cooks and helpers are engaged in the school as per GOI norms.

3. Cooks cum helpers are paid Rs.1000/- per month and the mode of payment is cash/cheque.

There is delay of 03/04 months in paying the remuneration to cooks cum helpers in all the schools visited by MI, i.e. 41 schools out of the 41 schools visited.

4. Social Composition of cooks cum helpers depends on the habitation.

Foodgrains/ other ingredients are stored in staff room in Paiza Govt. High School and Rabindranagar H S (+2 stage) school (Primary Section).

In the case of Jampui H S School, foodgrains/other ingredients are stored in the 'COOK' house and cooking is also done in the same house.

Food grains are stored in the class/temporary rooms in Pabiacherra Class XII School (primary section), R K Institution, Kanchanpur Colony Girls H S School (Primary Section), Piplacherra High School, Hemsukla S B School and Kanchanpur J B School.

13. Whether potable water is available for cooking and drinking purpose?

Monitoring Institute Observation:

There is no source of water in 5 schools, namely, Amratal J B School, Jampui H S School, Yeazekhowra S B School, Sidongbanapalli S B School and Vanghmun High School.

Tap/Hand Pump water is used for cooking and drinking purposes in 18 schools, namely, LaxmanCherra S. B. School, Tilthai R/C H S School, Pabiacherra Class XII School (primary section), R K Institution, Asrampalli S B School, Baruakandi Col. H S School, Padmapur J B School, PratyekRoy H S School (primary section), PratyekRoy H S School, Huplong Cherra TE H S School (primary section), Madhya Deocherra Nabin S B School, Deochherra H S School (primary section), Pabiacherra Colony High School, Kacharghat Ramcharan Govt. High School, Tillabazar H S School, R K Siksha Pratisthan Class XII School, Kanchanpur Colony Girls H S School (Primary Section), Kanchanpur J B School and Shantipur North S B School.

Ring well water is used for cooking and drinking purposes in 7 schools, namely, Paiza Govt. High School, Nabincherra High School, Pekucherra S B School, Krishnapur H S School (primary section), West Bilthai S B School, Piplacherra High School and Hemsukla S B School.

Water supply is used for cooking and drinking purposes in 9 schools, namely, Rabindranagar H S (+2 stage) school (Primary Section), Algapur High School, Chandrapur Govt. H S School, Chandrapur Govt. H S School (primary section), Paschim Chandrapur S B School, Bir Bikram Institution (Primary Section), Dharmanagar Govt. Girls H S School (Primary Section), Kailashahar Girls High School (Primary Section) and Uricherra S N S B School.

In addition to these sources of water, Cooks and Helpers also carry water for cooking and drinking purposes.

14. Whether utensils are available for cooking food? If, available is it adequate?

Monitoring Institute Observation:

The mid day meal team of 14 schools opined that utensils are not adequate for cooking food. The schools are Nabincherra High School, Rabindranagar H S (+2 stage) school (Primary Section), Tilthai R/C H S School, Krishnapur H S School (primary section), Bir Bikram Institution (Primary Section), Pabiacherra Class XII School (primary section), Asrampalli S B School, West Bilthai S B School, Pabiacherra Colony High School, Sidongbanapalli S B School, R K Siksha Pratisthan Class XII School, Uricherra S N S B School, Hemsukla S B School and Kanchanpur J B School.

15. What is the kind of fuel used? (Gas based/firewood etc.)

All the visited schools use firewood as a source of fuel for cooking purposes. The details are

H S School, Padmapur J B School, PratyekRoy H S School (primary section), PratyekRoy H S School, Huplong Cherra TE H S School (primary section), Madhya Deocherra Nabin S B School, Deochherra H S School (primary section), West Bilthai S B School, Pabiacherra Colony High School, Sidongbanapalli S B School, Kacharghat Ramcharan Govt. The cooking process is not at all safe in Paiza Govt. High School, Dopatacherra S B School and R K Institution.

In 'North Tripura' district, there is a scarcity of water. Given the condition, childrens are still encouraged to wash hands and take food.

Children take food in an orderly manner.

Water is conserved only in 56% of the schools, i.e., 24 out of the 41 schools visited. The schools are Jampui H S School (Rain water Harvesting), Chandrapur Govt. H S School, Chandrapur Govt. H S School (primary section), Tilthai R/C H S School, Paschim Chandrapur S B School, Krishnapur H S School (primary section), Bir Bikram Institution (Primary Section), Kailashahar Girls High School (Primary Section), Pabiacherra Class XII School (primary section), R K Institution, Baruakandi Col. H S School, Padmapur J B School, PratyekRoy H S School (primary section), PratyekRoy H S School, Huplong Cherra TE H S School (primary section), Madhya Deocherra Nabin S B School, Sidongbanapalli S B School, Kacharghat Ramcharan Govt. High School, Tillabazar H S School, R K Siksha Pratisthan Class XII School, Uricherra S N S B School, Kanchanpur J B School, Vanghmun High School (Rain Water) and Shantipur North S B School.

In all the 41 schools visited, firewood is used for cooking. Though at a glance, it seems that the process of cooking process is safe but it may lead to hazard if the cooks remain inattentive.
