Majority of the sample schools have positive opinion about the MDM. The positive responses from the schools in the context of improvement of attendance is 12(38.71%) from the primary schools and in the UPS are 07(41.18%). However, it is also informed by the teachers of the schools even the Govt. stopped the MDM it would not affect much as people of the area are quite motivated about education of their child.

General Observations

- 1. As per norms the cook MDM are supplied to the school by the contractors/Suppliers.
- 2. Informed that there is tough competition among the suppliers therefore, the quality is ensured.
- 3. The suppliers has well equipped kitchen which is the pre-requisite qualification.
- 4. Food items are supplied as per the menu which is displayed in the notice board.
 - 5. Observed that hygienic condition of cooking pace/kitchen are maintained.
 - 6. The community people are involved & there is no complain against the suppliers by the community/students.
 - 7. Low enrolment in few schools finds problem to get suitable supplier.
 - **8.** Since the MDM are supply by the contractors instead of cooking in the school therefore, the school teachers get more time for class room teaching.
