Observations:

1. MDM are suspended in several Primary Schools due to the poor quality of rice.

2. The payment of cooking cost and the payment of remuneration of the cooks/helpers are very irregular which hamper MDM.

3. There are complains against head teacher about the transparency.

4. There are complains against the SHGs where they have whole responsibility of the MDM.

5. The SHG members working in the schools as cooks/helpers are not aware about the norms for the payment of the remuneration.

6. Community participation in the MDM is total absent.

7. The UPS are reluctant to run the cooked MDM as they find the allotted Tiffin hours(30mnt) is in-suffient.

8. Very Poor Monitoring mechanism both from the community as well from out sides.
