Cooks are paid via cheque in 16(66.66%) primary and 11(73.33%) upper primary schools. The cook cum helpers in all the visited schools informed that they were receiving the honorarium regularly.

Cook cum helpers in most of the schools belongs to General, SC, OBC and Minority category.

Cook cum helpers in most of the schools belongs to **OBC**, Other (general cast) and SC category.

Yes, adequate kitchen utensils are available in 23 (82.14%) primary and 05(55.55%) Upper primary of the visited schools. LPG is used in 08(28.57%) primary and 02(22.22%) Upper primary of the visited schools And in rest of the schools firewood and Gas + Firewood is used for preparing mid day meal.

Adequate kitchen utensils are available in 20(83.33%) primary and 08(61.53%) Upper primary of the visited schools.

LPG is used in 10(41.66%) primary and 04(30.76%)Upper primary of the visited schools

And in rest of the schools firewood and Gas + Firewood is used for preparing mid day meal.

During the visit it was noticed that 100 percent of the visited school primary schools were fulfilling the indicator of cooking and serving the food in neat, hygienic as well as safe conditions. In 2(13.33%) upper primary schools the hygiene standards are poor.

Children are encouraged to wash hands before and after eating in all the visited schools.

Efforts were made in all the schools to conserve water and teachers encourage students to save water.

In about 23(95.83%) primary and 15(100%) Upper Primary of the visited schools visited MI found that the cooking process and fuel storage was safe was not posing any fire hazard. However, in 01(4.16%) primary of the visited schools it was not safe as the meals were either cooked in open or the makeshift kitchen was so small and very near the classrooms. However there is strong need for safe storage of fuel along with cooking ingredients.

During the visit it was noticed that 01(3.57%), 02(7.14%), 02(7.14%) of the visited primary schools standards of environment, safety & Hygiene respectively were poor. In 01(11.11%), 03(33.33%), 03(33.33%) of the visited upper primary schools standards of environment, safety & Hygiene respectively were poor.

Children are encouraged to wash hands before and after eating in all the visited schools. Efforts were made in all the schools to conserve water and teachers encourage students to save water.

In about 25(89.28%) primary and 09(100%) Upper Primary of the visited schools visited MI found that the cooking process and fuel storage was and safe was not posing fire hazard. However, in 03(10.71%) primary of the visited schools it was not safe as the meals were either cooked in open or the makeshift kitchen was so small and very near the classrooms. However there is strong need for safe storage of fuel along with cooking ingredients.

# District 3. **Tehri Garhwal**

#### Sample size- 24 Primary Schools and 13 Upper primary schools.

During the visit it was noticed that 100 percent of the visited school Upper primary schools were fulfilling the indicator of cooking and serving the food in neat, hygienic as well as safe conditions. In 1(4.16%) primary schools the Safety standards are poor.

Children are encouraged to wash hands before and after eating in all the visited schools.

Efforts were made in all primary and 12(92.30%) Upper Primary schools to conserve water and teachers encourage students to save water.

In all primary and Upper Primary of the visited schools visited MI found that the cooking process and fuel storage was and safe was not posing fire hazard.

There was Good & Fair community participation noticed in about more than 96 percent of the visited schools Primary schools, however in almost 10 percent of the Upper Primary schools visited the community participation requires strengthening.

The community participation and awareness in 02(8.33%) of the visited schools Primary schools was poor as per SMC, however in almost 02(15.38%) of the Upper Primary schools visited the community participation was poor as per Parents & 5(38.46%) poor as per SMC. This requires strengthening.

# District **Dehradun**

#### 1. | Sample size- 24 Primary Schools and 15 Upper primary schools.

In all the 24(100%) Primary and 14(93.33%) Upper Primary schools of the district of Dehradun, the hot cooked Mid Day meal is served daily without fail. The students, teachers & Parents of the children are happy with the quantity & quality of food served. On enquiry with parents they say that daily good meal is served which comprises of Dal, rice & green vegetables. 24(100%) PS and 14(93.33%) UPS the schools are regularly getting the food grains and almost 23(95.83%) PS and 14(93.33%) UPS the schools have one month stock of food grains. The quality of food grains is good and the teachers have reported that is the quality is not good they return back the food grains back to the shopkeeper. Almost all the schools have samples of rice grains for comparisons on regular supply. All the schools receive the cooking expenses in advance. Around 17.94% of the schools have not displayed the menu on the wall, but the food is given according to the menu in all these schools.

The school children are happy with the quantity & quality of MDM and they eat full to their satisfaction. In almost all schools the Health card was found and the students are given the medications from time to time.

The MDM is cooked and distributed by departmental cooks, who are selected by SMC.

Around 5.12% schools don't have Kitchen and store room so the food is cooked in extra room or in open.

In most of the schools the food is cooked on Gas. In around 71.79% of the schools the MDM is not being monitored properly by the Department.

In almost all the schools improvement in enrollment, attendance and health of students has been noticed due to MDM. The school children are happy with the quantity & quality of MDM and they eat full to their satisfaction. In almost all schools the Health card was found and the students are given the medications from time to time.

The MDM is cooked and distributed by departmental cooks, who are selected by SMC.

In almost all the schools improvement in enrollment, attendance and health of students has been noticed due to MDM.

# District **Haridwar**

### 2. Sample size- 28 Primary Schools and 09 Upper primary schools.

In all the Primary and Upper Primary schools of the district of Haridwar, the hot cooked Mid Day meal is served daily without fail. The students, teachers & Parents of the children are happy with the quantity & quality of food served. On enquiry with parents they say that daily good meal is served which comprises of Dal, rice & green vegetables.

Almost 27(96.42%) PS and 100% UPS the schools are regularly getting the food grains and Buffer stock is maintained in 22(78.57%) of the Primary schools & 08(88.88%) upper primary schools.

The quality of food grains is good and the teachers have reported that if the quality is not good they return back the food grains back to the shopkeeper. Almost all the schools have samples of rice grains for comparisons on regular supply. 28(100%) primary and 08(88.88%) Upper primary visited schools have received cooking cost in advance most of the times.

In 5.40% of the schools, the conveyance charges of bringing the ration to the school from the shop are not being paid by the shopkeeper. In these schools the teachers have to pay from their pockets the conveyance charges to bring ration to the school from the ration shop.

Menu has been displayed in 17(60.71%) primary and 06(66.66%) Upper primary of the visited schools on the notice board or wall and it is adhered to in 26(92.85%) primary and 08(88.88%) upper primary schools.

The school children are happy with the quantity & quality of MDM and they eat full to their satisfaction. In 5.40% of all schools surveyed, the Health card was not found but the students of all schools are given the medications from time to time.

The MDM is cooked and distributed by departmental cooks, who are selected by SMC. In 46% schools the payment to cooks is made in cash as they do not have a bank account.

Around 27% schools don't have Kitchen and store room so the food is cooked in extra room or in open. In 3 schools don't have provision of drinking water in school premises.

In most of the schools the food is cooked on firewood. In 56.75% all of the schools the MDM are not being monitored properly by the Department.

# District 3. **Tehri Garhwal**

#### Sample size- 24 Primary Schools and 13 Upper primary schools.

In all the Primary and Upper Primary schools of the district of TEHRI GARHWAL, the hot cooked Mid Day meal is served daily without fail. The students, teachers & Parents of the children are happy with the quantity & quality of food served. On enquiry with parents they say that daily good meal is served which comprises of Dal, rice & green vegetables.

Almost all the schools are regularly getting the food grains and 20(83.33%) PS and 13(100%) Ups the schools have one month stock of food grains. The quality of food grains is good and the teachers have reported that if the quality is not good they return back the food grains back to the shopkeeper. Almost all the schools have samples of rice grains for comparisons on regular supply. 23(95.83%) primary and 13(100%) Upper primary of the sampled schools have received cooking cost in advance most of the times.

In 1 school - PS the cooking expenses are not coming in advance and the teachers have to pay from their pockets to run the MDM regularity.

In 2.70% of the schools, the conveyance charges of bringing the ration to the school from the shop are not being paid by the shopkeeper. In these schools the teachers have to pay from their pockets the conveyance charges to bring ration to the school from the ration shop.

Menu has been displayed in 16(66.66%) primary and 11(84.61%) Upper primary of the visited schools on the notice board or wall and it is adhered to in 20(83.33%) primary and 13(100%) Upper primary of the schools.

The school children are happy with the quantity & quality of MDM and

they eat full to their satisfaction. In 2.70% of all schools surveyed, the Health card was not found but the students of all schools are given the medications from time to time.

The MDM is cooked and distributed by departmental cooks, who are selected by SMC. In 35% schools the payment to cooks is made in cash as they do not have a bank account.

Around 8% schools don't have Kitchen and store room so the food is cooked in extra room or in open. In 4 schools don't have provision of drinking water in school premises.

In most of the schools the food is cooked on firewood and Gas. In around 54% of the schools the MDM is not being monitored properly by the Department.

# MDM DISTRICT – DEHRADUN

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# **Methodology**

A total number of 40 schools which includes 24 primary schools, 15 Upper Primary Schools and 1 KGBVs. have been randomly selected for the study in Dehradun district, as decided by the Ministry. 10 schools out of 39 schools are from the urban part of the district, 4 schools have civil works sanctioned for them and 5 schools have minimum of three CWSN (priority to those having other than orthopedic ally impaired), 3 schools each covered under the Computer Aided Learning (CAL) and 1 KGBV scheme.

### **Criteria of Sample Selection**

The following criteria were followed in the selection of sample primary and Upper Primary Schools in Dehradun district:

- 1. Higher gender gap in enrolment,
- 2. Higher proportion of SC/ST students,
- 3. Low retention rate and higher drop-out rate,
- 4. Schools with a minimum of three CWSN.
- 5. The habitation where the school is located has sizeable number of OoSC.
- 6. The habitation where the school is located has in-bound and out-bound seasonal migration,
- 7. The habitation where the school is located is known to have sizable number of urban deprived children.
- 8. The school is located in a forest or far flung area.
- 9. The habitation where the school is located witnesses recurrent floods or some other natural calamity.

# 1.5 <u>Sample Design of the Study</u>

A total number of 40 schools have been taken as sample schools from Dehradun district. Out of these 40 Schools, 10 schools are from Nagar Kshetrya and 30 schools are from rural areas. 1 KGBVs (one from rural blocks) have been selected.

There is no doubt that MDM bridges the gap and results in bringing about social justice because children belonging to different castes enjoy taking MDM collectively in a place which sets aside the feeling of discrimination.

#### B. Any other issues relevant to MDM implementation – Investigator comments

In all the 24(100%) Primary and 14(93.33%) Upper Primary schools of the district of Dehradun, the hot cooked Mid Day meal is served daily without fail. The students, teachers & Parents of the children are happy with the quantity & quality of food served. On enquiry with parents they say that daily good meal is served which comprises of Dal, rice & green vegetables.

24(100%) PS and 14(93.33%) UPS the schools are regularly getting the food grains and almost 23(95.83%) PS and 14(93.33%) UPS the schools have one month stock of food grains. The quality of food grains is good and the teachers have reported that is the quality is not good they return back the food grains back to the shopkeeper. Almost all the schools have samples of rice grains for comparisons on regular supply. All the schools receive the cooking expenses in advance. Around 17.94% of the schools have not displayed the menu on the wall, but the food is given according to the menu in all these schools.

The school children are happy with the quantity & quality of MDM and they eat full to their satisfaction. In almost all schools the Health card was found and the students are given the medications from time to time.

The MDM is cooked and distributed by departmental cooks, who are selected by SMC.

Around 5.12% schools don't have Kitchen and store room so the food is cooked in extra room or in open.

In most of the schools the food is cooked on Gas. In around 71.79% of the schools the MDM is not being monitored properly by the Department.

In almost all the schools improvement in enrollment, attendance and health of students has been noticed due to MDM. The school children are happy with the quantity & quality of MDM and they eat full to their satisfaction. In almost all schools the Health card was found and the students are given the medications from time to time.

The MDM is cooked and distributed by departmental cooks, who are selected by SMC.

In almost all the schools improvement in enrollment, attendance and health of students has been noticed due to MDM.

#### INTRODUCTION

#### 1.1 Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA)

SSA is an effort to universalize elementary education by community ownership of the school system. It is a response to the demand for quality basic education all over the country. The SSA Programme is also an attempt to provide an opportunity for improving human capabilities to all children through provision of community owned quality education in a mission mode. Implementation of SSA Programme includes National Programme for Education of Girls at Elementary Level, Mid-day-Meal Scheme and Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidhyalaya Scheme, hereinafter referred to as Schemes, for two years from 1st April 2013 to 31st March 2015. The goal is also there to bridge social, regional and gender gaps, with the active participation of the community in the management of schools.

#### 1.2 Objectives of Present Study

The main objectives of the study are:

- To assess and analysis the implementation of the approved interventions and processes of interventions at School and habitation levels, keeping in view the goals of these schemes and the provisions under RTE Act, 2009.
- To Identify the social, cultural, linguistic or other barriers coming in the way of successful implementation of the schematic interventions and attainment of these goals.

#### 1.3 Methodology

A total number of 40 schools which includes 28 primary schools, 09 upper primary schools and 3 KGBV have been randomly selected for the study in Haridwar district, as decided by the Ministry. 09 schools out of 40 schools are from the urban part of the district, 4 schools have civil works sanctioned for them and 2 schools have minimum of three CWSN (priority to those having other than orthopedically impaired), 5 schools each covered under the Computer Aided Learning (CAL) and 3 KGBV scheme.

#### 1.4 <u>Criteria of Sample Selection</u>

The following criteria were followed in the selection of sample primary and upper primary schools in Haridwar district:

- Higher gender gap in enrolment,
- Higher proportion of SC/ST students,
- Low retention rate and higher drop-out rate,
- Schools with a minimum of three CWSN.
- The habitation where the school is located has sizeable number of OoSC.
- The habitation where the school is located has in-bound and out-bound seasonal migration,
- The habitation where the school is located is known to have sizable number of urban deprived children.
- The school is located in a forest or far flung area.
- The habitation where the school is located witnesses recurrent floods or some other natural calamity.

#### 1.5 Sample Design of the Study

A total number of 40 Schools have been taken as sample Schools from Haridwar district. Out of these 40 Schools, 28 Schools are from rural areas. 03 KGBVs (Three from rural blocks KGBV) have been selected (Table-1.1).

There is no doubt that MDM bridges the gap and results in bringing about social justice because children belonging to different castes enjoy taking MDM collectively in a place which sets aside the feeling of discrimination.

#### B. Any other issues relevant to MDM implementation – Investigator comments

In all the Primary and Upper Primary schools of the district of Haridwar, the hot cooked Mid Day meal is served daily without fail. The students, teachers & Parents of the children are happy with the quantity & quality of food served. On enquiry with parents they say that daily good meal is served which comprises of Dal, rice & green vegetables.

Almost 27(96.42%) PS and 100% UPS the schools are regularly getting the food grains and Buffer stock is maintained in 22(78.57%) of the Primary schools & 08(88.88%) upper primary schools.

The quality of food grains is good and the teachers have reported that if the quality is not good they return back the food grains back to the shopkeeper. Almost all the schools have samples of rice grains for comparisons on regular supply. 28(100%) primary and 08(88.88%) Upper primary visited schools have received cooking cost in advance most of the times.

In 5.40% of the schools, the conveyance charges of bringing the ration to the school from the shop are not being paid by the shopkeeper. In these schools the teachers have to pay from their pockets the conveyance charges to bring ration to the school from the ration shop.

Menu has been displayed in 17(60.71%) primary and 06(66.66%) Upper primary of the visited schools on the notice board or wall and it is adhered to in 26(92.85%) primary and 08(88.88%) upper primary schools.

The school children are happy with the quantity & quality of MDM and they eat full to their satisfaction. In 5.40% of all schools surveyed, the Health card was not found but the students of all schools are given the medications from time to time.

The MDM is cooked and distributed by departmental cooks, who are selected by SMC. In 46% schools the payment to cooks is made in cash as they do not have a bank account.

Around 27% schools don't have Kitchen and store room so the food is cooked in extra room or in open. In 3 schools don't have provision of drinking water in school premises.

In most of the schools the food is cooked on firewood. In 56.75% all of the schools the MDM are not being monitored properly by the Department.

#### INTRODUCTION

#### 1.1 Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA)

SSA is an effort to universalize elementary education by community ownership of the school system. It is a response to the demand for quality basic education all over the country. The SSA Programme is also an attempt to provide an opportunity for improving human capabilities to all children through provision of community owned quality education in a mission mode. Implementation of SSA Programme includes National Programme for Education of Girls at Elementary Level, Mid-day-Meal Scheme and Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidhyalaya Scheme, hereinafter referred to as Schemes, for two years from 1st April 2013 to 31st March 2015. The goal is also there to bridge social, regional and gender gaps, with the active participation of the community in the management of schools.

#### 1.2 Objectives of Present Study

The main objectives of the study are:

- To assess and analysis the implementation of the approved interventions and processes of interventions at School and habitation levels, keeping in view the goals of these schemes and the provisions under RTE Act, 2009.
- To Identify the social, cultural, linguistic or other barriers coming in the way of successful implementation of the schematic interventions and attainment of these goals.

#### 1.3 Methodology

A total number of 40 Schools which includes 24 Primary Schools, 13 Upper Primary Schools and 3 KGBVs. have been randomly selected for the study in Tehri Garhwal district, as decided by the Ministry. 0 Schools out of 40 Schools are from the urban part of the district, 03 Schools have civil works sanctioned for them, and 03 Schools have minimum of three CWSN (priority to those having other than orthopedically impaired), 05 Schools each covered under the Computer Aided Learning (CAL) and 03 KGBV scheme.

#### 1.4 <u>Criteria of Sample Selection</u>

The following criteria were followed in the selection of sample Primary and Upper Primary Schools in Tehri Garhwal district:

- Higher gender gap in enrolment,
- Higher proportion of SC/ST students,
- Low retention rate and higher drop-out rate,
- Schools with a minimum of three CWSN.
- The habitation where the School is located has sizeable number of OoSC.
- The habitation where the School is located has in-bound and out-bound seasonal migration,
- The habitation where the School is located is known to have sizable number of urban deprived children.
- The School is located in a forest or far flung area.
- The habitation where the School is located witnesses recurrent floods or some other natural calamity.

#### 1.5 Sample Design of the Study

A total number of 40 Schools have been taken as sample Schools from Tehri Garhwal district. Out of these 40 Schools, 37 Schools are from rural areas. 3 KGBVs (Three from rural blocks KGBV) have been selected.

There is no doubt that MDM bridges the gap and results in bringing about social justice because children belonging to different castes enjoy taking MDM collectively in a place which sets aside the feeling of discrimination.

#### B. Any other issues relevant to MDM implementation – Investigator comments

In all the Primary and Upper Primary schools of the district of TEHRI GARHWAL, the hot cooked Mid Day meal is served daily without fail. The students, teachers & Parents of the children are happy with the quantity & quality of food served. On enquiry with parents they say that daily good meal is served which comprises of Dal, rice & green vegetables.

Almost all the schools are regularly getting the food grains and 20(83.33%) PS and 13(100%) Ups the schools have one month stock of food grains. The quality of food grains is good and the teachers have reported that if the quality is not good they return back the food grains back to the shopkeeper. Almost all the schools have samples of rice grains for comparisons on regular supply. 23(95.83%) primary and 13(100%) Upper primary of the sampled schools have received cooking cost in advance most of the times.

In 1 school - PS the cooking expenses are not coming in advance and the teachers have to pay from their pockets to run the MDM regularity.

In 2.70% of the schools, the conveyance charges of bringing the ration to the school from the shop are not being paid by the shopkeeper. In these schools the teachers have to pay from their pockets the conveyance charges to bring ration to the school from the ration shop.

Menu has been displayed in 16(66.66%) primary and 11(84.61%) Upper primary of the visited schools on the notice board or wall and it is adhered to in 20(83.33%) primary and 13(100%) Upper primary of the schools.

The school children are happy with the quantity & quality of MDM and they eat full to their satisfaction. In 2.70% of all schools surveyed, the Health card was not found but the students of all schools are given the medications from time to time.

The MDM is cooked and distributed by departmental cooks, who are selected by SMC. In 35% schools the payment to cooks is made in cash as they do not have a bank account.

Around 8% schools don't have Kitchen and store room so the food is cooked in extra room or in open. In 4 schools don't have provision of drinking water in school premises.

In most of the schools the food is cooked on firewood and Gas. In around 54% of the schools the MDM is not being monitored properly by the Department.
