Monitoring Institute Observation:

1. 45% of the schools visited, i.e. 19 out of 42 schools visited do not receive foodgrains regularly and there is a delay to the extent of 02/03 months in these schools. The schools are Megazine Para S B School, Shanti Kr. R P School, Jagabandhupara High School, Harerkhola High

School, Fishery Para S B School, Debkanta Para J B School, Chandra Mohan Tripura S B School, Nalkata L B J B School, DhanyarRam K P High School, Kulai class XII School, Chailengta Colony S B School, Debipur Colony S B School, West Daluchara High School, West Daluchara High School, West Daluchara High School (Primary Section), Halhali S B School, Larai karbari Para S B School, Harerkhola S B School, Katalutma S B School and Dubajoy Chow Para High School.

- 2. Buffer stock of one-month's requirement is not possible or cannot be maintained in 16 schools, namely, Shanti Kr. R P School, Harerkhola High School, Fishery Para S B School, Debkanta Para J B School, Chandra Mohan Tripura S B School, Biswarai D/B Para S B School, Dayal Para J B School, DhanyarRam K P High School, Kulai class XII School, Shikaribari J B School, Chailengta Colony S B School, Debipur Colony S B School, Ambadkarnagar J B School, West Daluchara High School, Larai karbari Para S B School and Harerkhola S B School.
- 3. Quantity of food grain supplied seems to be as per the marked/indicated weight.
- Foodgrain is not delivered in the school premises of 3 schools out of the 42 schools visited by MI. The schools are Harerkhola S B School (Pry. Section), DhanyarRam K P High School and Munda colony J B School.

Food grain is delivered at the remaining 39 schools.

5. All the 42 schools reported that the quality of food grain is good.

4. REGULARITY IN DELIVERING COOKING COST TO SCHOOL LEVEL:

- (i) Is school/implementing agency receiving cooking cost in advance regularly? If there is delay in delivering cooking cost, what is the extent of delay and reasons for it?
- (ii) In case of delay, how school/implementing agency manages to ensure that there is no disruption in the feeding programme?

Monitoring Institute Observation:

1. 30 schools out of the 42 schools visited, 71% of the schools, receive cooking cost with a delay

of 2/3 months, mainly after submission of bills or adjustment of bills. The schools are Megazine Para S B School, Shanti Kr. R P School, K C Girls' Class XII School, Harerkhola High School, Fishery Para S B School, Debkanta Para J B School, Chandra Mohan Tripura S B School, Biswarai D/B Para S B School, Nalkata L B J B School, Dayal Para J B School, Munda colony J B School, DhanyarRam K P High School, Kulai class XII School, Arjun Mani K P Sr. B School, Phanindra Reang Para S B School, Chailengta Colony S B School, TRTC Para S B School, Debipur Colony S B School, Gopal Sardar Para High School, West Daluchara High School, West Daluchara High School (Primary Section), Halhali S B School, Bhagirath Para S B School, 82 Miles Proper H S School (Primary Section), Larai karbari Para S B School, Mohanpur high School, Halhali Class XII School, Harerkhola S B School, Katalutma S B School and Dubajoy Chow Para High School.

- 2. Cooking cost is paid only when the school authorities receive from the district level.
- 3. Cooking cost is paid both in cash and through banking channels.

Monitoring Institute Observation:

- 1. The MI did not observe any gender or caste or community discrimination in cooking or serving or seating arrangements in any of the visited schools.
- 2. There is no specific seating arrangement for the mid day meal scheme in all the 42 visited schools. The students, generally, seat in the 'Verandahs' and take the meal.

6. VARIETY OF MENU:

- i) Has the school displayed its weekly menu at a place noticeable to community, and is it able to adhere to the menu displayed?
- ii) Who decides the menu?

Monitoring Institute Observation:

1. Majority of the schools displayed its weekly menu at a place noticeable to community, and it adheres to the menu displayed.

Weekly menu is not displayed in 11 schools out of the 42 schools visited. The schools are Bakcherra High School, Hezachara High School, Debkanta Para J B School, Nalkata L B J B School, Dayal Para J B School, Chailengta Colony S B School, West Daluchara High School, West Daluchara High School, West Daluchara High School (Primary Section), Halhali S B School, 82 Miles Proper H S School (Primary Section) and Dubajoy Chow Para High School.

- 2. The state school authority decides the mid day meal menu.
- 7. (i) Is there variety in the food served or is the same type of food served daily?
 - (ii) Dose the daily menu include rice / wheat preparation, dal and vegetables?

Monitoring Institute Observation:

1. There is a variety in the food served to the students of the schools in the Dhalai district. The weekly mid day meal menu is

Khichudi – 01 day,

Rice and Egg Curry - 02 day, Rice and Vegetables - 02 days, and

Sweet Rice -01 day.

2. The daily menu includes rice and other preparations.

8. QUALITY & QUANTITY OF MEAL:

Monitoring Institute Observation:

- 1. The maximum students of the visited schools reported that the quality of meal is good.
- 2. Similarly, the students opined that the quantity of meal is also sufficient.

9. SUPPLEMENTARY:

- (i) Is there school Health Card maintained for each child?
- (ii) What is the frequency of health check-up?
- (iii) Whether children are given micronutrients (Iron, folic acid, vitamin A dosage) and de-worming medicine periodically?
- (iv) Who administers these medicines and at what frequency?

Monitoring Institute Observation:

- 1. Health card is not maintained in any of the schools visited. However, two schools, namely, Jagabandhupara High School and Gandachara Class XII School (UP) have health cards but are not maintained.
- 2. The frequency of health check-up varies from school to school, like

Thrice/year in West Daluchara High School, West Daluchara High School (Primary Section) and Dubajoy Chow Para High School.

Once/year in Halhali S B School, Dayal Para S B School, Debkanta Para J B School, Jagabandhupara High School, Gandachara Class XII School, Bakcherra High School, Durnichara Shayamrai Para S B School, Harerkhola S B School, Katalutma S B School, Harerkhola S B School (primary), 82 Miles Proper H S School (Primary Section), Fishery Para S B School, Bhagirath Para S B School, Baralutma H S School (Primary Section), TRTC Para S B School, Megazine Para S B School, Harerkhola High School, Gopal Sardar Para High School and Mohanpur High School.

3. Childrens are given Iron, folic /acid and vitamin – A dosage in 4 schools, namely, Megazine Para S B School, K C Girls' Class XII School, Ambadkarnagar J B School and Gopal Sardar Para High School.

Vaccination like Hepatitis B, Polio, etc. are given in 24 schools out of the 42 schools visited, namely, Jagabandhupara High School, Harerkhola High School, Fishery Para S B School (2011), Bakcherra High School, Debkanta Para J B School, Dayal Para J B School (Measles), Mohanpur Arabic Jr., Madrasa, Arjun Mani K P Sr. B School, Chailengta Colony S B School, TRTC Para S B School, Gopal Sardar Para High School, West Daluchara High School, West Daluchara High School, West Daluchara High School (Primary Section), Halhali S B School, Bhagirath Para S B School, Gandachara Class XII School (UP), 82 Miles Proper H S School (Primary Section), Mohanpur high School, Halhali Class XII School, Harerkhola S B School (Pry. Section), Baralutma H S School (Primary Section), Harerkhola S B School, Katalutma S B School and Dubajoy Chow Para High School.

4. Local Health workers/Multi Purpose Workers/Primary Health centres and also district health departments including NRHM staffs administer these medicines.

- 1. VEC/SHGs/Panchayat/PRI/Locally appointed persons and in few schools, school teacher are engaged in cooking and serving of the mid day meals.
- 2. Number of cooks and helpers are engaged in the school as per GOI norms.

- 3. Cooks cum helpers are paid Rs.1000/- per month and the mode of payment is cash/cheque.
- 4. There is delay of 03/04 months in paying the remuneration to cooks cum helpers in 88% of schools, i.e. 37 schools out of the 42 schools visited. The schools are Megazine Para S B School, Kamalpur Madrasa (Pry. Section) H S School, Shanti Kr. R P School, Jagabandhupara High School, K C Girls' Class XII School, Chawmanu H S School (UP), Harerkhola High School, Fishery Para S B School, Bakcherra High School, Hezachara High School, Debkanta Para J B School, Chandra Mohan Tripura S B School, Nalkata L B J B School, Dayal Para J B School, Mohanpur Arabic Jr., Madrasa, Munda colony J B School, DhanyarRam K P High School, Kulai class XII School, Shikaribari J B School, Arjun Mani K P Sr. B School, Phanindra Reang Para S B School, Chailengta Colony S B School, TRTC Para S B School, Debipur Colony S B School, Gopal Sardar Para High School, West Daluchara High School, West Daluchara High School, Gandachara Class XII School (Primary Section), Halhali S B School (Primary Section), Larai karbari Para S B School, Mohanpur high School, Halhali Class XII School, Harerkhola S B School, Katalutma S B School and Dubajoy Chow Para High School.

There is no water source in Shikaribari J B School and Harerkhola S B School (Pry. Section).

Hand Pump water is used for cooking and drinking purposes in 12 schools, namely,

Megazine Para S B School, Jagabandhupara High School, Kamalpur Madrasa (Pry. Section) H S School, Bakcherra High School, Nalkata L B J B School, Mohanpur Arabic Jr., Madrasa, Munda colony J B School, Phanindra Reang Para S B School, West Daluchara High School (Primary Section), Halhali S B School, Mohanpur high School and Halhali Class XII School.

Ring well water is used for cooking and drinking purposes in 10 schools, namely, Shanti Kr. R P School, K C Girls' Class XII School, Chawmanu H S School (UP), Dayal Para J B School, Arjun Mani K P Sr. B School, Chailengta Colony S B School, Ambadkarnagar J B School, Larai karbari Para S B School, Durnichara Shayamrai Para S B School and Katalutma S B School.

Water supply is used for cooking and drinking purposes in 5 schools, namely, Hezachara High School, TRTC Para S B School, Debipur Colony S B School, Gopal Sardar Para High School and Gandachara Class XII School (UP).

Portable water is used for cooking and drinking purposes in 5 schools, namely, DhanyarRam K P High School, Kulai class XII School, Ambadkarnagar J B School (bad condition), West Daluchara High School and Baralutma H S School (Primary Section).

In addition to these sources of water, Cooks and Helpers also carry water for cooking and drinking purposes.

14. Whether utensils are available for cooking food? If, available is it adequate?

Monitoring Institute Observation:

The mid day meal team of 12 schools opined that utensils are not adequate for cooking food. The schools are Megazine Para S B School, Shanti Kr. R P School, Chawmanu H S School (UP), Harerkhola High School, Bakcherra High School, Hezachara High School, Debkanta Para J B School, Nalkata L B J B School, Dayal Para J B School, Halhali S B School, Bhagirath Para S B School and Baralutma H S School (Primary Section).

All the visited schools use firewood as a source of fuel for cooking purposes. The details are

- 5. In all the 42 schools visited, firewood is used for cooking. Though at a glance, it seems that the process of cooking process is safe but it may lead to hazard if the cooks remain inattentive.
