As you are aware, the Government of India considers Lymphatic Filariasis a top-priority disease and aims to eliminate it by 2027. To achieve this goal, a strategy known as Mass Drug Administration (MDA) for the community has been devised, which will be conducted nation wide twice a year on the 10th August and the 10th February. The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has requested support from the Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education and other allied ministries to engage and culminates into a Jan Andolan for improved compliance of MDA. In this regard, please find enclosed a D.O. letter dated 25.01.2024 of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare.

- 2. The phase 1 of the MDA campaign 2024 is scheduled from 10th February, 2024 in 99 districts of Twelve States, viz. Assam, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand, Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, West Bengal, Maharashtra, and Gujarat. The list of the districts proposed for MDA is placed in **Annexure 1** for your ready reference.
- 3. The roles and responsibilities of D/o SE&L to Support the Mass Drug Administration Campaign February 2024 are as under:
- (i) From National-level, a **\vectriangletin** is to be conducted for all endemic states & advisory to be issued for schools to conduct drug administration after Mid-Day Meals.
- (ii) State officials are required to attend the State Task Force Meeting.
- (iii) Specific instructions to be released for MDA mobilization in schools located in urban areas.
- (iv) Facilitate orientation sessions for all BEOs on integrated MDA and National Deworming Day (NDD).
- (v) BEOs to be instructed to conduct Pre MDA mobilization activities in endemic blocks and report back to the district.
- (vi) Mandatory attendance at the District Coordination Committee Meeting.
- (vii) Share Lymphatic Filariasis (LF)-related communication materials with all principals/head teachers.
- (viii) LF discussions to be conducted during morning assemblies.

- (ix) Organize essay writing and drawing competitions in schools before MDA activities, focusing on LF and vector control.
- 4. We solicit your support at the districts and sub-district level for making the upcoming 10^{th} February, 2024 MDA a great success and make this convergence with MoHFW successful for eliminating the lymphatic filariasis.

Lymphatic filariasis (LF) known as elephantiasis (Haatipaon), is a serious debilitating disease transmitted through the bite of Culex mosquitos which breeds in dirty/polluted water. Infection is usually acquired in childhood causing damage to the lymphatic system. Visible manifestations of the disease, lymphoedema, and scrotal swelling occur later in life and can lead to permanent disability. India alone accounts for approximately 55 % of the global burden and the disease is endemic in 20 States/UTs of India. Approximately 740 million population in 336 districts of these states/UTs are at risk of LF.

LF is a priority disease for Government of the India and is targeted for elimination by 2027. As a vital Strategy, Mass Drug Administration (MDA) will be conducted in a mission mode twice a year on 10th February and 10th August along with National Deworming Day (NDD). The 2024 Phase-1 MDA Campaign is scheduled from 10th February 2024 in 99 districts of twelve states: Assam, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand, Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, West Bengal, Maharashtra, and Gujrat. (Annexure 1).

The strategy demands synergy of efforts by all the departments and culminates into a "Jan Andolan" for improved compliance of MDA. The roles and responsibilities envisaged for various departments are attached (Annexure2).

The support of the Ministry of School Education & Literacy is pivotal for the successful implementation of the February 2024 MDA and you may kindly issue an advisory to all states and conduct a virtual sensitization with the state officials for the Ministry of School Education & Literacy to disseminate the discussion points of the NITI Aayog Intersectoral Convergence meeting and passing on the key roles and responsibilities to support the February 2024 MDA campaign.

We solicit your support at the district and sub-district levels for making the upcoming 10th February 2024 MDA a great success.

I am sure, together we will eliminate Lymphatic Filariasis from our country by 2027.


