# Minutes of the meeting of Programme Approval Board - Mid Day Meal (PAB-MDM) on 23<sup>rd</sup> May, 2018 Union Territory of Lakshadweep

The meeting of the Programme Approval Board-Mid-Day Meal (PAB-MDM) was held in New Delhi on 23<sup>rd</sup> May, 2018. The list of participants in the meeting is enclosed at *Annexure-I* The agenda before the PAB-MDM was:

- To review the status and progress of the implementation of Mid-Day Meal Scheme for the UT of Lakshadweep.
- To consider the Annual Work Plan and Budget (AWP&B) 2018-19 proposal of UT of Lakshadweep for MDM Scheme.
- 2. Shri G. Vijaya Bhaskar, Director, MDM and Member Secretary, PAB, welcomed the members of PAB-MDM and other participants. He requested Shri V Shashank Shekhar, Joint Secretary (EE.I), to make opening remarks. Joint Secretary (EE.I) appreciated UT Government's good practices/initiatives viz; MDM being extended to students of XII class; Additional food items are provided in MDM menu, Double Fortified Salt being used for preparation of Mid Day Meal; Additional contribution to cooking cost of Rs 8.00per child in primary and Upper Primary over and above the central assistance; Additional contribution in honorarium to cook-cum-helpers (i.e.Rs. 8500/- per month per CCH); E-transfer of honorarium to all CCHs to their bank accounts; Capacity building and training to different stakeholders.
- 3. Sh. K. Buzar Jamhar, Directorate of Education, UT of Lakshadweep briefed the PAB about the initiatives taken by the UT Administration for improving the effectiveness of the scheme.Sh. K. T. P. Abdul Gafoor, State Project Officer, Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan, UT of Lakshadweep, made a presentation on the performance of Mid-Day Meal Scheme during 2017-18 along with proposals for 2018-19. Shri Lokendra Mahavar, Consultant, TSG-MDM, also presented an analysis of the performance of the UT in the implementation of Mid-Day Meal Scheme during 2017-18.
- The following issues were discussed during the meeting:

- 4.1. Coverage of children: The UT Administration has covered 94% children against enrolment in both Primary and Upper Primary level. Joint Secretary (EE.I) appreciated the UT Administration for the coverage which is above the national average.
- 4.2. Use of Millets: JS (EE.I) mentioned that Ministry of Agriculture has decided to celebrate 2018-19 as 'Year of nutri cereals (Millets)'. He further suggested the UT to explore the possibilities to introduce millets or any other traditional locally available nutritional grains in Mid Day Meal Scheme.
- 4.3. Data Entry on MIS-Web Portal: Joint Secretary (EE.I) observed that there was a mismatch between the data entered into the MDM- MIS web portal and the manual data submitted through AWP&B 2017-18 by the UT in respect of Food grains, Working day, Cooking Cost. Secretary (Education) UT Administration assured to reconcile the data in a time bound manner.
- 4.4. Ayushman Bharat: Joint Secretary (EE.I) mentioned about the importance of School Health component of recently launched programme of Ayushman Bharat. Dr.Anindita Shukla, Senior Consultant, TSG-MDM, informed that under Ayushman Bharat, identified school teachers will be trained as 'Health and Wellness Ambassadors' who in turn train the school children on Yoga & Meditation, health & hygiene, cleanliness and adolescent issues etc. She further added that provision of water purification systems of appropriate technology, Yoga & Meditation and provision of sanitary napkins for girl child in the schools are very important components in the service delivery part of School Health Component of Ayushman Bharat. Funds are also available in the programme of Menstrual Hygiene Programme of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. JS (EE.I) advised the UT to coordinate the efforts in this regard with the concerned departments and share the status with Dr.Anindita Shukla.
- 4.5. Provision of safe drinking water: Joint Secretary (EE.I) observed that only 14 schools in the State have water filtration facility. He advised the State officials to ensure that all 39 schools have safe drinking water facility. UT Administration stated that they are using Low Temperature Thermal Desalination Technology (LTTD)for providing safe drinking water facility to the Schools, He further explained that LTTD is a process under which the warm surface sea water is flash evaporated at low pressure

and the vapour is condensed with cold deep sea water. They ensure to implement the same technology in rest of the schools.

- 4.6. Kitchen Garden: Directorate of Education, UT of Lakshadweep, informed that 4 schools are having kitchen garden and 1 school is under progress. Joint Secretary (EE.I) appreciated the efforts made by the UT and advised to set up kitchen gardens in all schools where land is available. He further suggested that UT Horticulture Department, Krishi Vigyan Kendras (KVK) etc. may also be roped in for this purpose.
- 4.7. New initiative under Mid Day Meal (Green Kitchen): The Honorable Prime Minister of India in his visit to Lakshadweep on 19<sup>th</sup>December 2017 expressed that LPG is not a suitable mean of cooking in the island considering cost of transportation and desired to explore the possibilities of introducing solar cooking system in islands. M/s NTPC Ltd has agreed for installation and other associated work for Solar Thermal Cooking System at Govt. Girls Sr.Sec.School at Kavaratti. JS(EE-I) appreciated the initiative and would like to review the green Kitchen during the year 2018-19.

### 5. Other proposals made by the UT

It was clarified that the quantification of resources is only an estimate for release of Central Assistance during 2018-19 under the MDM Scheme. The MDM Guidelines provide that every child attending an eligible institution is to be covered under the Scheme and shall be served mid-day meal on all school days. In case the UT Govt. finds that the average number of children availing mid-day meal and/or if the working days are more than the approved numbers by PAB-MDM, they may approach the GOI at any time with justification for additional Central Assistance.

After discussions with UT officials and based on the performance during 2017-18 the PAB-MDM approved the following number of children, number of school days etc. for quantifying the Central assistance for UT of Lakshadweep.
