### **Issues:**

- i) Decline in coverage of children (in absolute numbers) in primary as well as upper primary categories.
- ii) Only 10 meetings of District committee under chairpersonship of DM.
- iii) Poor coverage under school health programme (health check-up of 64% children).
- iv) Only 14% schools have water filtration facility.

### **Best Practices:**

- i) Sikkim, being an organic state, every child is served with fresh and locally available organic vegetables like potatoes, black dal, cabbage, green saag, cauliflower, Broccoli, radish, carrot, beans, peas in Mid-Day Meals.
- ii) Some schools (31) have started their kitchen gardens for growing local fresh organic vegetables.

### **Part-A: General Information**

### **Introduction:**

National Programme for Nutritional support to Primary Education Mid-Day Meal Scheme was launched as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme on 15th August, 1995 in a phased manner all over India. Its objective was to boost "Universalization of Primary Education" by increasing enrolment, retention, attendance and simultaneously impacting on nutrition of students in primary classes". The programme originally covered children of primary level (classes I to V) in government, local body and government aided schools. In October 2002, the programme was extended to cover children studying in Education Guarantee Scheme (EGS) & AIE centers and from the same year the hot cooked meal was started in the State of Sikkim. Prior to the year 2001-02 the food grain (Rice) provided by the Government of India @3kgs per child per month for 10 academic months in a year, was distributed as dry rations to the children. However, the Supreme Court in its order dated: 28.11.2001 in WP(C) NO. 196 of 2001- People's Union for Civil Liberties versus Union of India and other, directed all the state governments to provide cooked Mid-Day-Meal containing 300 calories and 8 to 10 grams of protein per serving.

### Part-B: Review of Performance in 2017-18 (01.04.17 to 31.03.2018)

**2.** Based on the information provided by the State administration in its AWP&B 2018-19, the performance during 2017-18 (01.04.17 to 31.03.2018) was reviewed. The major issues in implementation during 2017-18 are summarized as under: -

### 2.0 Coverage of Institutions

Coverage in terms of no. of institutions.

Difference between Existing Institutions Vs No. of institutions covered (Achievement) –

i) PRIMARY

The number of existing institutions = 495

Number of institutions covered = 495 (100%)

ii) UPPER PRIMARY

The number of existing institutions = 373

Number of institutions covered = 373 (100%)

The information reveals that all the institutions are covered under MDMS.

### 2.1 Coverage of Children

### 2.1.1 <u>Coverage against enrolment</u>:

a) Primary - Coverage in terms of No. of children. Difference between Enrolment vs. Average No. of Children Availed MDM (Achievement) (Refer Table 2.5 of the Analysis Sheet).

Total Enrolment as on 30.09.2017

= 35980

Average number of children availed MDM during 01.04.17 to 31.03.18 = 31348 (87%)

The coverage at State level is well above the national average of 75%.

b) <u>Upper Primary:</u> Coverage in terms of No. of children. Difference between Enrolment vs. Average No. of Children Availed MDM (Achievement) – (Refer Table 2.6 of the Analysis Sheet).

Total Enrolment as on 30.09.2017

= 30677

Average number of children availed MDM during 01.04.17 to 31.03.18 = 26676 (87%)

The coverage of children at upper primary level in the State is well above the national average of 75%.

### 2.1.2 Coverage against PAB-MDM approval:

a) Primary: Coverage in terms of No. of children. Difference between PAB Approval (Target) vs. Average No. of Children Availing MDM (Achievement) (Refer Table 2.3 of the Analysis Sheet).

The number of children approved by MDM PAB for 2017-18 = 34678 Average number of children availed MDM during 01.04.17 to 31.03.18 = 31348 (90%)

b) Upper Primary: Coverage in terms of No. of children. Difference between PAB Approval (Target) Vs Average No. of Children Availing MDM (Achievement)

The number of children approved by MDM PAB for 2017-18 = 29539Average number of children availed MDM during 01.04.17 to 31.03.18 = 26676 (90%)

### 2.1.3 No. of Meals: Difference between No. of meal to be served (Target) Vs. No. of meals Served (Achievement) - PY+U PY (Refer Table 2.7 of the Analysis Sheet).

The number of meals to be served during 01.04.17 to 31.03.18 = **1.43 Crore**The number of meals served during 01.04.17 to 31.12.18 = **1.28 Crore (89%)** 

### 2.2 <u>FOODGRAINS (PRIMARY + UPPER PRIMARY)</u>

### 2.2.1 Level of Opening Balance as on 01.04.17: (Refer Table 3.2.1 of the Analysis Sheet).

The State had zero opening balance against the total allocation of 1761.39 MTs for 2017-18 as on 1.4.17.

### 2.2.2 Level of unspent balance as on 31.03.18: (Refer Table 3.2.2 of the Analysis Sheet).

The State level closing balance as on 31.03.18 is 0 MTs (0%) against the total allocation of 1761.39 MTs.

### 2.2.3 <u>Availability of Food grains: (01.04.17 to 31.03.18) : (Refer Table 3.4 of the Analysis sheet)</u> State level availability as on 31.03.18 was 100% of the total allocation.

### 2.2.4 Utilization of food grains: (Refer Table 3.6 of the Analysis sheet)

An analysis of the utilization of food grains during 2017-18 shows that State has utilized 1761.39 MTs (100%) of the allocated food grains.

### 2.2.5 Payment of cost of foodgrains to FCI: (Refer Table 3.8 of the Analysis sheet)

The FCI has submitted bills for Rs. 52.84 lakhs during 1.4.2017 to 31.03.2018 towards cost of food grains. As per information provided by the State Government, State has made payment for Rs. 52.84 lakhs (100%) to the FCI.

### 2.3 COOKING COST (PRIMARY + UPPER PRIMARY)

### 2.3.1 Level of Opening balance as on 01.04.17: (Refer Table 4.2.1 of the Analysis Sheet)

The State had reported opening balance of Rs. 57.92 lakhs (8%) at the beginning of the financial year 2017-18 against allocation of Rs. 729.11 lakhs.

### 2.3.2 Level of closing balance as on 31.03.18: (Refer Table 4.2.2 of the Analysis Sheet)

The State had closing balance of Rs. 69.78 lakhs (10% of allocation) towards cooking cost as on 31.03.18.

### 2.3.3 <u>Utilization of Cooking cost:</u> (Refer Table 4.5& 4.6 of the Analysis Sheet)

State level utilization is Rs. 679.62 (93%) against the allocation of Rs. 729.11 lakhs.

### 2.4 Reconciliation of utilisation and performance during 2016-17 (1.4.16 to 31.12.16)

### 2.4.1 <u>Mismatch in utilization of Food grains vis-à-vis cooking cost:</u> (Refer Table – 5.1 of Analysis Sheet)

Ideally the percentage utilization of cooking cost and food grains should tally with each other. The data furnished in the AWP&B reveals that there is a mismatch of 7% at State level in utilization of cooking cost (93%) and food grains (100%).

### 2.5 Cook-Cum-Helper (PRIMARY + UPPER PRIMARY):

MDM-PAB has approved 1891 cook-cum-helpers to be engaged during 2018-19 in the State, the State has engaged 1846 cook-cum-helpers. The State has proposed to engage 1891 cook-cum-helpers as approved during PAB-MDM 2017-18. The State has utilized 98% of the allocated funds for payment of honorarium to cook cum helper. (*Refer Table – 6.2 of Analysis Sheet*).

### 2.6 Utilization of MME (Refer Table – 7.3 of Analysis Sheet)

Against the allocation of Rs. 16.36 lakh as Central Assistance towards MME funds, the State has utilized Rs. 16.36 lakh (100%).

### 2.7 <u>Utilization of Transportation Assistance</u> (Refer Table – 8.3 of Analysis Sheet)

Against the allocation of Rs. 32.06 lakhs towards Central Assistance towards funds for Transportation Assistance the State has utilized Rs. 32.06 lakhs (100%).

### 2.8 <u>Construction of Kitchen-cum-stores</u> (Reference Table -9.1.2 of Analysis Sheet)

Central assistance of Rs. 684.34 lakhs has been released for construction of 936 Kitchen-cum-Stores. Out of 936 kitchen-cum-stores sanctioned till 2016-17, all kitchen-cum-stores have been constructed.

### 2.9 Procurement of Kitchen devices (Reference Table -9.2.2 of Analysis sheet)

Central assistance of Rs. 82.90 lakhs has been released towards procurement of 1658 units (879 new + 779 replacement) of kitchen devices during 2006-07 to 2017-18. The State has reported that all the units of kitchen devices have been procured.

### 3. Data Entry Status on the MIS Web Portal

For online monitoring of MDMS, Ministry of HRD, MDM Division has developed web based monitoring system i.e. MDM-MIS in collaboration with NIC. In this web portal District/Block users have to make Annual and Monthly data entry. The State needs to ensure that the data is entered in

timely manner by District/Block users into the portal. The Annual and monthly data entry status of the State are given below:-



### 4. Release of funds

The Govt. of India released ad-hoc grant in May, 2017; balance of first installment in July, 2017 and 2<sup>nd</sup> installment on December, 2017 & January, 2018. As per the information provided by the State, the adhoc and balance of 1<sup>st</sup> installment were received at school level in the month of September, 2017. 2<sup>nd</sup> installment was received at school level in February, 2018.

Cooking cost and honorarium to cook cum helpers are generating through state web portal. The district further submit that bills in compiled form to MDM HQ duly certified for final payment to authenticate the bill. The MDM, HQ can transfer the funds directly to the respective joint accounts of

schools directly from the state HQ as per the details provided by the district. The MDM, HQ is transferring the funds directly to the school's joint account (MDM) through RTGS.

### 5. Management Structure

- State Project Office, MDM headed by the Principal Secretary, HRDD, State Project Director [MDM], Jt. Director, Deputy Director and Assistant Director.
- Joint Director at the district level is the overall In-charge with Dy. Director as In-charge MDM and Asst. Dir, AEO at every block level to monitor the MDM at the school level. District Collector is the Chairman of the District MDM.

### 6. System for payment of cost of foodgrains to FCI

Earlier, fund used to transfer to districts and thereafter, having examined by the pay and accounts office, the payment was released to FCI, as a result, there was delay in payment to FCI.

Keeping this problem in view, the state authority decided to make payment from the Head Quarter (Gangtok) from the year 2014, to ensure timely payment and clear all the pending bills of FCI, with proper authentication and confirmation from respective districts. Thereafter, the payment procedure has become effective and smooth and no delay complaints are received.

### 8. Community involvement

Active involvement of stake holders in MDM programme for effective, nutritious, regular meals, are ensured. Panchayats and community members are sensitized. Provisions for community monitoring at school are made i.e. Mother Roaster, Inspection registers are being maintained in schools. Tasting of meals by the community members in the schools are encouraged and practiced on regular basis. Recently, SMC's have started forming mothers group to taste the food on daily basis.

### 9. Capacity Building

The MDM Cell, HRDD had conducted training and awareness programme of web portal to head of the institutions, training to cook cum helpers, SMDC and other stake holders under mid-day meal scheme in all the four districts. All the heads of the institutions and SMDC attended the training cum awareness programme of MDM Section held at various levels in presence of district officials, MDM incharge, Assistant Directors and Asst. Education Officers of the Block Administrative Centre (BAC). Apart from this, School heads are being sensitized by the officers at the BAC level in monthly coordination meetings. Cooking agencies/School Heads of MDM are being sensitized about web portal. Modules used for the training were about cleanliness of the kitchen, personal hygiene of CCH, pure drinking water, hand wash before serving of MDM, nutritional value, safety measures. Resource persons also conducted training of CCH.

#### 10. Tasting of Meal

System of tasting of food by the teacher/MDM incharge, members of the SMC, in regular basis are prevalent in the schools. But, maintenance of tasting register at schools is not being done so far. Mothers committee is also encouraged to taste the meals.

#### 11. Grievance Redressal Mechanism

Complaints box at all district offices and block level offices have been mandatorily installed. All schools have been provided the important help line numbers for emergency.

### 12. Contingency Plan to avoid any untoward incident

Mid-Day Meal Scheme in Sikkim is being implemented in a highly smooth and efficient manner. All the schools cooking agencies/Cook cum Helper/SMCs are being sensitized on safety measures like disaster management, combating fire incidents, first aid application etc. The schools cooking agencies are also sensitized by Health Department on nutritional and hygienic aspect of the meals being prepared.

The schools and cluster are under the administrative jurisdiction of Asst. Directors and Block Development Officer and in case of any emergency situation in schools, the school heads are directed to seek immediate help from the Block offices. Besides, the school heads/PTA/Panchayats/SMC are actively involved in serving MDM and ensuring proper hygiene. The important helpline numbers like Fire, Hospital emergency call and Police are also with the school heads in case of any emergency situation. Besides, all the teaching and non-teaching staff after school as well as school children are regularly sensitized by the school safety programme to deal with any kind of emergency situation.

### 13. Social Audit

As per the information provided by the State Government, till date no social audit has been conducted however SMC members are acting as auditing members to ensure social audit in their respective Schools.
