

Appraisal Note

STATE: WEST BENGAL

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a. Issues from appraisal:

- 1. Less coverage of children under health check-up.
- 2. Less utilization of foodgrains

b. Best Practices:

- a) State Government is making additional contribution of Rs.500/- per Cook-cum-Helper per month towards the honorarium of Cook-cum-Helpers over and above its mandatory share.
- b) State Government is providing additional food items viz. egg once in a week in all schools and 50 gms chicken once in month in 11 districts of West Bengal from its own resources.
- c) State Government provided plates and glasses to all the children under Mid Day Meal Scheme from its own resources.
- d) State Government constructed 692 units of dining halls from its own resources.
- e) LPG is provided as a mode of cooking in 71433 (85%) Schools.
- f) School Nutrition Gardens has been set up by the children in 6407 schools.
- g) Rs. 25.83 crore has been provided for installation of fire extinguishers to 57,996 schools from its own resources.
- h) State Government developed an application for inspection of MDM. It is available to all inspecting Officials including Education Supervisors for field visits.
- State Government made provision of fund Rs.35.10 crore for purchase of apron / gloves / Head Gear for cook cum helpers; Rs.17.55 crore for purchase of Rice containers in all schools and sanctioned an amount of Rs. 11.70 crore for cleaning and sweeping toilets at schools from its own resources.
- State Government sanctioned 731 Education Supervisors for each Educational Circle of West Bengal for better monitoring and reporting progress of Mid-Day Meal, SSA & RMSA programmes.

PART A – General Information:

Introduction:

National Programme of Mid-Day-Meal in schools (MDMS) is a flagship programme of the Government of India mining of enhancing enrolment, retention and attendance and simultaneously improving nutritional levels among children studying in Government, Local Body and Government-aided primary and upper primary schools and the Centres run under Education Guarantee Schools (EGS/Alternative & Innovative Education (AIE) and National Children Labour Project (NCLP) schools now call as Special Training Centres (STC) of all areas across the country.

Part B: Review of the Performance of the scheme during 2018-19

1. Review of Commitments and Expected Outcomes & Action Taken during 2018-19.

The progress made in implementing the commitments/expected outcomes with respect to the indicators in Performance Grading Index (PGI) in 2018-19 was reviewed which is as follows:

2. Review of Performance during 2018-19

2.1. Performance on PGI indicators:

There are two indicators of Mid Day Meal Scheme in the Performance Grading Index (PGI) i.e. i) Score against the weightage of 10 for indicator No. 1.3.7 i.e. "% of elementary school's children taking MDM against target approved in PAB – in Govt. and aided schools" and ii) Score against the weightage of 10 for indicator No 1.3.8 i.e. "% of days Mid Day Meal served against total working days – Govt. and aided elementary schools."

2.2. Coverage of children:

The PAB-MDM has approved 64,97,969 children at primary and 42,30,973 children at upper primary level, out of which 67,53,947 children at primary and 41,37,265 children at upper primary have availed Mid Day Meal on an average basis during the year 2018-19.

Under 'Performance Grading Index' (PGI), the State of West Bengal obtained score of 10 against the weightage of 10 for indicator No. 1.3.7 i.e. "% of elementary school's children taking MDM against target approved in PAB – in Govt. and aided schools". It was observed that there is a significant difference in the proportion of children covered at primary and upper primary level as is evident from 104% coverage at primary level compared to 98% at upper primary level as against PAB-MDM approval. The State was advised to take necessary steps to enhance the coverage of children at upper primary level. It was also observed that the coverage is below the State average in districts Gorkha Territory Administration(75%), Murshidabad(94%), West Bardhaman(96%), East Medinipur(96%), South Twenty-fourPerganas(97%) and East Bardhaman(97%).

2.3. School Working Days:

The PAB-MDM has approved 230working days for both primary and upper primary level, out of which Mid Day-Meal was served on 225 days for both at primary and upper primary levels respectively. Principal Secretary, School Education, Government of West Bengal mentioned that schools remained closed for 5 days due to the declaration local holidays. Under Performance Grading Index (PGI), the State of West Bengal obtained score of 10 against the weightage of 10 for indicator No. 1.3.8 i.e. "% of days Mid Day Meal served against total working days – Govt. and aided elementary schools".

2.4. Kitchen cum store:

Central assistance of Rs. 86587.61 Lakh has been released for construction of81,582 Kitchen-cum-Stores. As on 31.3.2019, construction has been completed for 77,446Kitchen-cum-stores and construction work is in progress for 4,136 kitchen-cum-stores.

2.5. Kitchen Devices (new as well as replacement):

Central assistance of Rs. 4542.75 lakh has been released towards procurement of 90,855 units of new kitchen devices. The State has reported that all the sanctioned90,855 units of kitchen devices have been procured. An amount of Rs.4495.70 sanctioned for 89,914 units of kitchen devices for replacement during 2012-13 to 2018-19, the State has procured all kitchen devices (39,933 units of kitchen devices procured during 2012-13 to 2014-15 and 49,981 units of kitchen devices procured during 2016-17 to 2018-19).

2.6. School Health Programme (Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram, Weekly Iron & Folic Acid Supplementation, National De-worming Day etc.) and Nutrition in convergence with other Ministries:

It was observed that health check-up has been carried out for 60,89,683 (53%) children, out of total enrolment of 1,15,79,246 children.

2.7. Training of Cook-cum-Helpers and other capacity building activities:

State has informed that out of total engaged 2,40,282 Cook-cum-Helpers in 83,935 schools, training has been imparted to 39,870 Cook-cum-Helpers during 2018-19.

2.8. Data Entry on MIS-Web Portal:

MDM-MIS portal captures information on critical indicators of MDMS. The annual data entry module captures master data on availability of kitchen-cum-stores, kitchen devices, number of cook-cum-helpers engaged, mode of cooking etc. The monthly data entry module captures data on number of days Mid Day Meal was served, number of meals served, honorarium paid to cook-cum-helpers engaged, number of children received IFA tablets, number of children screened under Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram (RBSK) etc. The State of West Bengal has completed 100% Annual and Monthly data entries in the MIS portal.

2.9. Status of implementation of Automated Monitoring System:

AMS has been put in place for real time monitoring of MDMS. Data on number of meals served on the particular day and reasons if meals not served is being captured from schools with no cost to school head masters/teachers. Out of 83,785 schools, daily data has been reported by 75,638 schools i.e. 90% schools on Automated Monitoring System. In this regard, email alerts are being sent to all States/UTs on daily basis.

2.10. Centralized kitchens:

No Centralized kitchen has been engaged under MDMS in the State. However,194 Cluster Kitchens are being engaged for supplying meals to 1,76,920 children, covering 960 Schools in 3 districts.

2.11. Awareness generation activities:

State has informed that following activities have been carried for awareness generation during 2018-19: Publicity in local newspaper, local cable etc., published a booklet on best practices and circulated to all districts.

2.12. Social Audit:

Social Audit has not been conducted in the State so far. State has informed that the mechanism of Panchayat and Rural Development Department has been taken up for conducting Social Audit during 2019-20 and initially 100schools per district will be covered.

2.13. Meeting of District level Steering cum Monitoring Committee:

As per the information provided by the State Government, 225 meetings of District level Steering cum Monitoring Committee under the chairpersonship of the District collector have taken place against the mandated 288.

2.14. School Nutrition Gardens:

State Govt. informed that 6407 schools have School Nutrition Gardens. State Govt. proposed to develop Nutrition Gardens in 30,000 schools under 5% flexible innovation activities. The same is recommended and also advised to explore maximum no. of schools under MGNREGA and other organisation.

2.15. Training of Cook Cum Helper:

State has informed that out of total engaged 240282 cook-cum-helpers in 83935 schools, training has been imparted to 39870 cook-cum-helpers with the help of 163 master trainers during the FY 2018-19. Now 17% cook-cum-helpers have been trained by the master trainers. State is advised to provide training all the cooks.
