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Minutes of the meeting of Programme Approval Board held on 19.05.2020 to consider the Annual Work Plan & Budget (AWP&B) 2020-21 of Mid-Day Meal Scheme for the State of Karnataka

The meeting of the Programme Approval Board-Mid-Day Meal (PAB-MDM) was held in New Delhi on 19.05.2020 through video conferencing. The list of participants in the meeting is enclosed at *Annexure-I*.

The agenda before the PAB-MDM was:

- i. To review the status and progress of the implementation of Mid-Day Meal Scheme in the State of Karnataka.
- ii. To consider the Annual Work Plan and Budget (AWP&B) 2020-21 proposal of Karnataka for MDM Scheme.
- 2. Joint Secretary (EE.I), welcomed the members of PAB-MDM and made opening remarks. He appreciated State Government's good practices/initiatives viz. i) Provision of additional honorarium of Rs. 1700 to Cook-Cum-Helpers, ii) provision of 150 ml. of hot Milk to children, thrice a week Under Ksheera Bhagya Yojana, iii) Provision of Food Security Allowance to children during closure of schools due to COVID-19. iv) Provision of Mid Day Meal to students of class 9th and 10th also from State's own resources, v) Social Audit in 17 districts and vi) Use of LPG as fuel for cooking meals in all schools.
- 3. Principal Secretary, Primary and Secondary Education, Govt. of Karnataka briefed the PAB about the performance of Mid-Day Meal Scheme in the State during 2019-20 and the initiatives taken by the State Government for improving the effectiveness of the scheme and Annual Work Plan and Budget (AWP&B) 2020-21 proposals. Director (MDM), Govt. of India also briefed on the analysis of the performance of the State in the implementation of Mid-Day Meal Scheme during 2019-20.



### 4. Review of Performance during 2019-20 (01.04.2019 to 31.12.2019)

#### 4.1 Coverage of children:

#### 4.1.1 Average number of children availed MDM vis-à-vis enrolment

The State has enrollment of 27,43,138 children in primary and 17,68,542 children in upper primary. Out of these 24,12,156 children (88%) in primary and 15,96,079 children (90%) in upper primary have availed MDM on an average basis during the year 2019-20.

### 4.1.2 Average number of children availed MDM vis-à-vis PAB-MDM Approval:

PAB-MDM has approved 26,04,491 children at primary and 16,20,734 children at upper primary level, out of which, 24,12,156 children (93%) at primary and 15,96,079 children (98%) at upper primary have availed Mid Day Meal on an average basis during the year 2019-20.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB advised the State to make efforts to increase the coverage of children, especially at primary level.

#### 4.2 School Working Days

The PAB-MDM has approved 248 working days for primary and upper primary (172 working days during 01.04.2019 to 31.12.2019). State has informed coverage of all 172 working days during 01.04.2019 to 31.12.2019.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB appreciated 100% coverage of working days.

#### 4.3 Fund Flow Mechanism

It was informed that State Government releases funds well in advance to Zilla Panchayats without waiting for releases from the Govt. of India. From District level also funds are released well in advance to the school level through treasury and ECS.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB appreciated timely release of funds to implementing agencies by the State.

#### 4.4 Management Monitoring and Evaluation (MME)



The State has informed utilization of only 47% of the allocated funds.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB advised the State that efforts should be made well in advance to effectively utilize funds under MME for monitoring of the scheme along with other activities throughout the year.

#### 4.5 Engagement of Cook-cum-Helpers (CCH) and honorarium

State has engaged all the approved 37,804 Cook cum Helpers at primary and 80,197 Cook cum Helpers at Upper primary levels. State is providing an additional honorarium of Rs 1700 per CCH per month.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB appreciated the additional contribution made by the State towards honorarium to CCH.

#### 4.6 Kitchen-cum-Stores (Construction as well as repair)

Central assistance of Rs. 53929.41 lakh has been released for construction of 40477 Kitchen-cum-Stores since 2006-07. As on 31.12.2019, construction of 39305 Kitchen-cum-stores has been completed and construction of 57 kitchen-cum-stores is in progress. Construction work of 1115 kitchen-cum-stores is yet to be commenced.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB advised the State to construct the remaining Kitchen cum stores by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2020.

#### 4.7 Kitchen Devices (new as well as replacement)

Central assistance of Rs. 3102.90 lakh has been released towards procurement of 62058 units of kitchen devices since 2006-07. The State has reported that all the units of kitchen devices have been procured.

Central assistance of Rs. 2129.40 lakh released for replacement of 42588 units of kitchen devices has been fully utilized by the State.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB appreciated 100% procurement of sanctioned kitchen devices.

#### 4.8 School Nutrition (Kitchen) Gardens

The State has set up School Nutrition (kitchen) gardens in 19207 schools and the produced vegetables are being used in the preparation of MDM. Work is under progress



for setting up of kitchen gardens in 30515 schools. State has proposed to set up school nutrition kitchen gardens in the remaining 4639 schools during the year 2020-21.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB MDM appreciated the State Government and advised to share good photographs of School Nutrition (Kitchen) Gardens set up in the schools.

## 4.9 School Health Programme (Rashtritya Bal Swasthya Karyakram (RBSK), Weekly Iron & Folic Acid Supplementation, National De-worming Day etc.) and Nutrition in convergence with other Ministries

It was informed that upto 31.12.2019, health check up has been carried out for 3696878 (82%) children, out of total enrolment of 4511680 children and the remaining children were covered during the period of January to March, 2020.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB advised the State to keep close convergence with the health department to ensure coverage of 100% children under various provisions of RBSK.

#### 4.10 Tithi Bhojan or similar practices

Karnataka has initiated the concept of Public Participation in the scheme through the concept of "Shalegagi navu neevu". The members of the community sponsor the food with sweets for children on various occasions and provide utensil, kitchen devices and Vegetables.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB appreciated the steps taken by the State Government.

#### 4.11 Supplementary Nutrition

State Government of Karnataka is providing 150ml. of hot Milk to children, thrice a week Under Ksheera Bhagya Yojana.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB appreciated the provision of hot milk to children by the State Government.

#### 4.12 Testing of meals

Meals have been tested on two critical parameters a) Nutritional b) Microbiological during 2019-20 in 7 districts (Yadgir, Vijayapura, Uttara kannada, Dharwad, Mysore, Bangalore Rural and Bangalore Urban) and all were found to meet the prescribed norms.



**Comments of PAB:** PAB advised the State to increase the number of samples for testing of meals during 2020-21.

#### 4.13 Grievance Redressal Mechanism and status of disposal of complaints

State informed that Toll free No. 1800-4252-0007 is functional for grievance redressal. Further, a toll free number 1098 is the child help line being used by the students for any grievance occurred in MDM.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB advised the State to give wide publicity of the scheme, display of entitlement of children under MDM etc. for creation of enhanced awareness among community. It was also mentioned that apart from the grievances received at State level, the Department of School Education & Literacy also receives complaints regarding Mid Day Meal and these are forwarded to the respective States for necessary action. The State was advised to furnish timely action taken reports in such cases.

#### 4.14 Cooking Competitions:

Cooking competitions have not been organized during 2019-20.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB advised the State Government to organize Cooking Competitions during 2020-21. It was further clarified that the idea behind organization of cooking competitions is to encourage a healthy competition among cook cum helpers and by this initiative they come to know that almost all the parts of the vegetables can be eaten by preparing a good innovative recipe. It was also suggested to include children as judges alongwith the nutritionists, as they are the ultimate beneficiaries of mid day meal.

#### 4.15 Training of Cook-cum-Helpers and other capacity building activities:

State has informed that out of total engaged 1,17,999 Cook-cum-Helpers, training has been imparted to 96,560 Cook-cum-Helpers. A training module "Shuchi-Ruchi" and SOP guidelines issued by the department, for the training for CCH.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB appreciated this initiative of training and advised the State to conduct periodic refresher trainings for already trained Cook-cum-Helpers and train the remaining cook cum helpers during 2020-21.

#### 4.16 Data Entry on MDM-MIS Web Portal:



MDM-MIS portal captures information on critical indicators of MDMS. The annual data entry module captures master data on availability of kitchen-cum-stores, kitchen devices, number of cook-cum-helpers engaged, mode of cooking etc. The monthly data entry module captures data on number of days Mid-Day Meal was served; number of meals served, honorarium paid to cook-cum-helpers engaged, number of children received IFA tablets, number of children screened under Rashtritya Bal Swasthya Karyakram (RBSK) etc. The State has completed annual data entry for 100 % schools and monthly data entry for 100% in the MIS portal.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB appreciated 100% data entry made by the State Government.

#### 4.17 Status of implementation of Automated Monitoring System (AMS):

AMS has been put in place for real time monitoring of MDMS. Data on number of meals served on the particular day and reasons if meals not served are being captured from schools. Out of 54361 schools, daily data has been reported by 43440 schools i.e. 82% schools on Automated Monitoring System on an average.

**Comments of PAB :** PAB appreciated the efforts of State and advised them to scale up the reportage to 100% schools on all school working days.

#### 4.18 Centralized kitchens:

PAB was informed that there are 69 NGOs working in 13 districts covering 5366 schools and 813944 children under Mid-day Meal Scheme.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB advised the State to adhere to the extant guidelines for engaging Civil Society Organisations / Non-Government Organisations in Mid Day Meal Scheme.

#### 4.19 Social Audit:

Social Audit has been conducted in 2696 schools in 17 districts. The report is being finalized.



**Comments of PAB:** State was informed that under the provisions of section 28 of National Food Security Act, 2013 Social Audit of the scheme is mandatory. State was advised to conduct social audit in all districts during 2020-21, as also mandated by the MDM guidelines. The Social Audit Units (SAU) set up under MNREGS, may be actively involved for conducting Social Audit of MDM. State was also advised to share the reports of Social Audit with MHRD.

### 4.20 Provision of MDM or Food Security Allowance during closure of schools due to COVID-19

MHRD has advised all States and UTs vide letters dated 20.03.2020 and 29.04.2020 regarding provision of mid day meal or Food Security Allowance to the eligible children under Mid Day Meal Scheme during closure of schools due to COVID-19 and summer vacations during 2020-21 respectively. Karnataka has provided the Food Security Allowance during closure of schools.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB MDM appreciated the efforts made by State Government of Karnataka.

#### 4.21 Other proposals and issues discussed, if any

State Government has requested to enhance the honorarium of Cook-cum-Helpers.

**Comments of PAB:** The proposal of the State has been noted.

#### 5. Component wise Proposals and PAB-MDM Approvals

It may be noted that hot cooked mid-day meal shall be served to every child studying in class I to VIII, on all school days in all eligible schools as per the MDM guidelines.

#### 5.1 Coverage of children

State Government has proposed to cover 24,38,479 children in primary classes, 16,14,190 children in upper primary classes and 684 children in Special Training Centers (NCLP) on an average basis during 2020-21.

**Approval of PAB:** Following the discussions, PAB-MDM approved State's proposals to cover 24,38,479 children in primary classes and 16,14,190 children in upper



primary classes and 684 children in Special Training Centers (NCLP) on an average basis during 2020-21.

#### 5.2 Coverage of Working Days

State Government has proposed to serve MDM on 240 days in primary and upper primary schools and 313 days in Special Training Centers (NCLP) during 2020-21.

**Approval of PAB:** Following the discussions, PAB-MDM approved the proposal of State to serve MDM on 240 days in both primary and upper primary schools and 313 days in Special Training Centers (NCLP) during 2020-21.

#### **5.3 Cook-cum-Helpers (CCH)**

State Government has proposed to engage 37,802 Cook-cum-Helpers in primary and 80,197 Cook-cum-Helpers in upper primary under Mid Day Meal Scheme during 2020-21.

**Approval of PAB:** Following the discussions, PAB-MDM approved the proposal of State to engage 37,802 Cook-cum-Helpers in primary and 80,197 Cook-cum-Helpers in upper primary under Mid Day Meal Scheme during 2020-21.

#### 5.4 Drought

Drought has been notified in 18 districts in the State. The State has proposed to cover 8,85,645 children in primary and 5,70,824 children in upper primary on 51 working days during the summer vacations in the drought affected areas. State has not proposed to engage Cook-cum-Helpers as dry ration is to be distributed to children as Food Security Allowance during summer vacations in the drought affected areas.

**Approval of PAB:** Following the discussions, PAB-MDM approved the proposal to cover 8,85,645 children in primary and 5,70,824 children in upper primary on 51 working days during the summer vacations in the drought affected areas.

#### **5.5 Construction and repair of Kitchen-cum-stores**

State has proposed repair of 8051 kitchen-cum-stores with an outlay of Rs 805.10 Lakh, which comprises of Rs 483.06 lakh as central share and Rs. 322.04 Lakh as State share.



**Approval of PAB:** Following the discussions, PAB-MDM approved the proposal of State for repair of 8051 kitchen-cum-stores with an outlay of Rs **805.10** Lakh, which comprises of Rs **483.06** lakh as central share and Rs. **322.04** Lakh as State share.

This approval is subject to submission of detailed proposal along with Schedule of Rates approved by the State Government and list of schools including UDISE codes within two months.

#### **5.6 Kitchen Devices**

State has proposed replacement of Kitchen devices in 6945 schools with an outlay of Rs 1028.40 Lakh, which comprises of Rs 616.80 lakh as central share and Rs 411.60 Lakh as State share.

**Approval of PAB**: Following the discussions, PAB-MDM approved the proposal of State for replacement of kitchen devices in 6945 schools with an outlay of Rs 1028.40 Lakh, which comprises of Rs 616.80 lakh as central share and Rs 411.60 Lakh as State share.

The State will submit a proposal, within two months, along with list of schools including UDISE codes where Kitchen devices are to be procured / replaced.

#### **5.7** Flexibility for new interventions

For School Nutrition (Kitchen) Gardens and supplementary nutrition interventions, State may use a maximum of Rs 4048.56 lakh (5% of total recurring Central and State share). This expenditure will be met from the funds available with the State (recurring Central Assistance + State Share).

#### 5.7.1 School Nutrition (Kitchen) Gardens

State Government has proposed to develop and maintain 4639 School Nutrition (Kitchen) Gardens at an estimated expenditure of Rs.231.95 Lakh, comprising of Rs 139.17 lakh as central share and Rs.92.78 lakh as State share.

**Approval of PAB:** Following the discussions, PAB-MDM approved the proposal of State to develop and maintain 4639 School Nutrition Gardens at an estimated expenditure of Rs. 231.95 Lakh, comprising of Rs 139.17 lakh as central share and Rs 92.78 lakh as State share. This expenditure will be met from the funds available with the State (recurring Central Assistance + State Share).

#### 5.7.2 Supplementary Nutrition



State Government has proposed to provide additional items like one egg/banana to 13,00,548 children in 7 districts (viz., Yadgiri, Kalburgi, Bellary, Gadag, Raichur, Bidar and Vijayapura) at an estimated expenditure of Rs. 3121.56 Lakh comprising of Rs 1872.94 lakh as central share and Rs 1248.62 lakh as State share.

**Approval of PAB:** Following the discussions, PAB-MDM approved the proposal of State to provide items like one egg/banana to 13,00,548 children in 7 districts at an estimated expenditure of Rs 3121.56 Lakh comprising of Rs. 1872.94 lakh as central share and Rs 1248.62 lakh as State share. This expenditure will be met from the funds available with the State (recurring Central Assistance + State Share).

#### **5.8 Cooking Competitions**

State has proposed to organize cooking competitions at various levels viz. cluster, taluk, district and state level.

**Approval of PAB:** Following the discussions, PAB-MDM approved the proposal of State for organizing Cooking competitions using the funds available under MME.

#### **5.9 Training of Cook-cum-Helpers**

State has proposed to train 21439 Cook cum Helpers during 2010-21.

**Approval of PAB:** Following the discussions, PAB-MDM approved the proposal of State for training of 21439 Cook cum helpers using the funds available under MME.

### 5.10 Provision of MDM or Food Security Allowance (FSA) during summer vacation as a onetime measure due to COVID-19

In compliance with the directions issued vide letter no. F. No. 1-2/2020 Desk (MDM) dated 28.04.2020 regarding provision of MDM or Food Security Allowance (FSA) during summer vacation as a one time measure due to COVID-19, the State has submitted proposal for covering 18,57,493 children in primary and 11,97,034 children in upper primary for 51 days, during summer vacations in 2020-21.

**Approval of PAB:** Following the discussions, PAB-MDM approved State's proposals to cover 18,57,493 children in primary and 11,97,034 children in upper primary for 51 days of summer vacations during 2020-21.

Central Assistance and allocation of foodgrains during 2020-21 under the MDM Scheme.

The National Food Security Act, 2013, MDM rules, MDM Guidelines and instructions

issued from time to time, provide that every child attending an eligible institution is to

be covered under the Scheme and shall be served hot cooked mid-day meal or provided

with Food Security Allowance, as applicable, on all school days. During the year, if it is

noticed by the State Govt. that more funds are needed to implement the Mid Day Meal

Scheme, due to increase in the attendance of children, increase in school working days

or for any other reason, they may approach Government of India at any time during the

year with justification seeking additional Central Assistance and foodgrains.

10. The State is advised to disseminate the approvals of the resources to all the field

functionaries in the State and districts so as to enable all the eligible institutions to

ensure that every child attending an eligible school must be served hot cooked Mid-Day

Meals or provided with Food Security Allowance on all school days irrespective of the

approvals of PAB-MDM.
