b. Main Issues from appraisal:

- 1. Average coverage is much less (75%) in Bengaluru (South) vis-à-vis State average of 93% in primary.
- 2. Testing of meals is done in only 8 districts out of 34.
- 3. Only one meeting of District level committee in 13 districts. No meeting in remaining 21 districts.
- 4. Buffer stock of FoodGrains is not maintained in 15 out of 34 districts, these districts are having availability of less than 5% foodgrains of allocation.
- 5. Cooking competitions was not organized in the State during 2019-20.

C. <u>Best Practices:</u>

- 1. State is providing additional honorarium of Rs. 1700 to Cook-Cum-Helpers.
- 2. 150ml. of hot Milk provided to children, thrice a week Under Ksheera Bhagya Yojana.
- 3. State provided foodgrains, pulses, oil etc during closure of schools due to COVID-19.
- 4. State is providing Mid Day Meal to students of class 9th and 10th also from its own resources.
- 5. % children are provided with IFA, De-worming tablets.
- 6. Social Audit is being carried out in 17 districts out of 34.

7. LPG is used for cooking meals in all schools.

Part-A: General Information

Introduction:

Initially Midday Meal Programme was started during the year 2002-03 in seven districts of North eastern parts of Karnataka which were identified as educationally and economically most backward areas. During 2003-04 this programme of Mid-day Meals was extended to the remaining districts.

2.2 <u>FOODGRAINS</u>

2.2.1 Level of Opening Balance as on 01.04.19: (Refer Table 3.2 of the Analysis Sheet).

The State has **403.68** MTs of food-grains as opening balance against the total allocation of **124914.52**.MTs for 2019-20 as on 01.04.2019. It is a matter of concern that almost all the districts has not maintained the buffer stock of foodgrains.

2.2.2 Level of unspent balance as on 31.12.19: (Refer Table 3.3 of the Analysis Sheet).

The State level closing balance as on 31.12.19 is **6592.43** MTs (5%) against the total allocation of **124914.52** MTs.

2.2.3 Availability of Food grains: (01.04.19 to 31.12.19) : (Refer Table 3.5 of the Analysis sheet)

The districts should have availability of at least 82% of the food grains allocation. State level availability as on 31.12.19 was 67% of the total allocation.

2.2.4 Utilization of food grains: (Refer Table 3.7 of the Analysis sheet)

An analysis of the utilization of food grains during the first three quarters of 2019-20 shows that State has utilized 77112.61(62%) of the allocated food grains. The utilization of food grains was much less than State average in Kodagu (45%) Baglkot (53%).

2.2.5 Payment of cost of foodgrains to FCI: (Refer Table 3.9 of the Analysis sheet)

The FCI has submitted bills for Rs. **2375.53** during 1.4.2019 to 31.12.2019 towards cost of food grains. The State has made payment for Rs. **2241.76** (94%) to the FCI.

2.3 COOKING COST (PRIMARY + UPPER PRIMARY)

2.3.1 Level of Opening balance as on 01.04.19: (Refer Table 4.1.1 of the Analysis Sheet)

The State had reported Rs 2367 lakh (4%) as opening balance at the beginning of the financial year 2019-20.

2.3.2 Level of closing balance as on 31.12.19: (Refer Table 4.1.2 of the Analysis Sheet)

The State had closing balance of Rs18985.35 (34% of allocation) towards cooking cost as on 31.12.19. Maximum closing balance was observed in Kodagu (50%) and Uttar kannada (40%)

2.3.3 Utilization of Cooking cost: (Refer Table 4.5 of the Analysis Sheet)

The districts should have utilized 72% of the allocation of cooking cost. State level utilization is 66%. At the district level the utilization ranges between 45 % to 72%.

2.4Reconciliation of utilization and performance during 2019-20 (1.4.19 to 31.12.19)

2.4.1 Mismatch, if any, in utilization of Food grains vis-à-vis cooking cost: (Refer Table – 5.1 of Analysis Sheet)

There is a mismatch of 4 % in the utilization of cooking cost and food grains.

2.5 Cook-Cum-Helper (PRIMARY + UPPER PRIMARY):

PAB-MDM has approved 117927 cook-cum-helpers to be engaged during 2019-20 in the State, the State has engaged 117999 cook-cum-helpers. The State has utilized 62% of the allocated funds for payment of honorarium to cook cum helper. The State has proposed to engage 117999 Cook-Cum-Helpers for 2020-21.

2.6 <u>Utilization of MME</u>(Refer Table – 7.2 of Analysis Sheet)

Against the allocation of Rs1242.94 Lakh as Central Assistance towards MME funds, the State has utilized only Rs. 587.13 Lakh (47%).

2.7 Utilization of Transportation Assistance(Refer Table – 8.2 of Analysis Sheet)

Against the allocation of Rs 1867.64 lakh as Central Assistance towards funds for Transportation Assistance the State has utilized Rs. 1079.70 lakh (58%).

2.8 Construction of Kitchen-cum-stores (Reference Table -9.1.2 of Analysis Sheet)

Central assistance of Rs 53929.41 Lakh has been released for construction of 40477 Kitchen-cum-Stores. As on 31.12.2019, construction has been completed for 39305 Kitchen-cum-stores and construction work is in progress for 57 kitchen-cum-stores. The State Government has not started any construction work for 1115 kitchen-cum-stores. State has proposed for repair of 8051 units of kitchen cum stores during 2020-21.

2.9 Procurement of Kitchen devices (Reference Table -9.2.2 of Analysis sheet)

Central assistance of Rs. 3102.90 lakh has been released towards procurement of 62058 units of kitchen devices during 2006-07 to 2019-20. The State has reported that all units of kitchen devices have been procured.

2.10 Procurement of Replacement of Kitchen devices (Reference Table -9.2.2 of Analysis sheet)

Central assistance of Rs. 2129.40 lakh has been released towards replacement of 42588 units of kitchen devices during 2019-20. The State has reported that all the units of kitchen devices have been procured.

3. Data Entry Status on the MIS Web Portal

In order to smooth function of MDMS, Ministry of HRD, MDM Division has developed web based monitoring system i.e. Web based MIS in collaboration with NIC. In this web portal State/District/Block users have to make Annual and Monthly data entry into the web portal through online. The State should monitor data entry activities to be made timely manner by District/Block users into the portal. The Annual and monthly data entry status as on December, 2019 of the State is given below:-

A perusal of the table reveals that districts viz. Dharwad, Kalburgi, Bangalore (North), Bagalkot, Yadgir, Kolar etc have performed very poorly on Monthly data entry.

3.3 Automated Monitoring System

Automated Monitoring system has been introduced to supervise the MDM program implementation at school level on day to day basis. Daily monitoring of regularity of meals provided being carried out through SMS based real-time monitoring. Automated Monitoring System is implemented in the across the state. AMS Reports are generated on daily basis at Block, District and State level in order to ensure the number of SMS sent from schools. Immediate action is being taken to get the SMS on the same day from the school regularly

4. Release of funds

Government of India releases funds to State Government and State Government after adding state share releases them to districts. The State Government releases funds well in advance to Zilla Panchayats without waiting releases from the Gol. From District levels also funds are released well in advance to the school level through treasury and ECS. The release of funds from the central and state, up to the level of school is operated on the time schedule prepared for the year. Steps are taken to transfer these funds through e-transfer and 3 months advance directly to the joint account of the head teacher and the SDMC president of the concerned schools, the fund flow is being monitored by all level officials their visit to schools.

6. School Nutrition Gardens

Out of 54361 schools, School Nutrition (kitchen) garden was already developed in 19207 schools. Government of India has authorized the State to utilize funds to develop school nutrition kitchen gardens in 30515 schools during 2019-20. State is in a process of setting up of kitchen garden in 30515 schools. State has proposed to set up school nutrition kitchen gardens in the remaining 4639 schools during the year 2020-21.

7. Supplementary Nutrition

State Government of Karnataka has proposed to provide supplementary nutrition in 7 districts Yadgiri, Kalburgi, Bellary, Gadag, Raichur, Bidar and Vijayapura). State has proposed to provide one Egg or Banana once a week to 1300548 children in these districts @ of Rs 6 per child per week (10 months).

8. Community Participation (Tithi Bhojan etc.)

The community participates through school children's mothers association. Out of the total mothers of enrolled children in the school, two mothers are nominated on roster basis to supervise the cooking and distribution of meal. Roaster of parents and community is maintained at schools to ensure their presence during cooking and serving. They are allowed to taste the food before serving and to record their comments in the taste register.

9. Monitoring Mechanism

The State Government with the help of Department of Public Instruction, Health Department, Department of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj Institutions, Food Corporation of India and Karnataka Food and Civil Supplies at the District and Block Level monitoring the scheme.

10. Social Audit

During 2019-20 of activities of social audit has been carried out in 17 districts (2696 schools), however the report is awaited.

11. Testing of meals

During 2019-20 out of 34 districts, 7 districts (Yadgir, Vijayapura, Uttara kannada, Dharwad, Mysore, Bangalore Rural and Bangalore Urban) have been conducted food testing and got the report as food is "Satisfactory". Testing of food sample is being carried by PHI-Bengaluru, CFTRI-Mysuru, NABL-Hyderabad and Kuvempu University, Dept. of P.G. Studies and Research in Microbiology, Shimoga.

12. Tasting of Meal

Teachers and Cook-cum-Helpers in the State, taste cooked MDM everyday and enter the amount of vegetables used to prepare MDM and quality of food in the register RUCHI VAHI maintained at school level. Whenever officials, field functionaries, SDMC members and community members, visit schools, they also taste the Mid Day Meal and write their opinion in the report. All the schools have maintained the system of tasting of Mid Day Meal. Mothers' committee is formed at every school to give their feedback and monitor the quality and quantity of the food being served to the children.

13. Centralized Kitchens and involvement of NGOs

In the State 69 NGOs are working in 13 districts covering 5366 schools and 813944 children under Mid-day Meal Scheme. Akshaya Patra Foundation-Bengaluru, Adamya Chetana-Bengaluru, Sri Gurushanteshwara Janakalyana Pratishtana-Chikkodi, Samriddi Seva Samsthe-Belagavi are the main NGOs who are serving mid day meal for more than 20,000 children during the year 2019-20. All NGOs have established their own centralized kitchen.

14. Cooking Competition

Cooking competitions was not organized in the State during 2019-20.

15. Capacity Building

A module has been prepared on all components of the scheme. All the Cook cum Helpers have been trained during 2019-20, 117999 cooks are given two days training at cluster level, head teachers and CRPs are trained at taluk level. In the orientation programme, the personal hygiene of cooks, the safety measures to be followed before and during the process of cooking in kitchen, use of LPG stoves, use of aprons, steps to be followed in the preparation and serving of food, storing of food grains, accounts maintaining etc., have been discussed in detail.

16. Contingency Plan to avoid any untoward incident

To avoid any untoward incident instructions have been issued on following items:-

- i. To keep fire extinguishers and sand buckets in schools.
- ii. Teachers should taste MDM before half an hour before it is served to students.
- iii. Random checking and supervision by the field officers to be carried out.
- iv. Emergency plan consisting of important numbers is made available in all schools.
- v. Display of important phone numbers such as primary health centre, Fire brigade, Hospital, Police station on the school walls is ensured
- vi. First-Aid boxes are kept in schools.
