APPRAISAL NOTE

STATE: Maharashtra

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a. <u>Main Issues from appraisal:</u>

- 1. Social Audit not conducted during 2019-20.
- 2. Health checkup done for 64% children only.
- 3. IFA and De-worming tablets provided to 44% children only.
- 4. Testing of meals done only in Mumbai.
- 5. No meeting of District Level Committee in 17 out of 35 districts.

b. <u>Best Practices:</u>

- 1. Provision of milk, fruits and eggs in drought affected areas from State funds.
- 2. State is providing additional honorarium of Rs. 500 per month to Cook-Cum-Helpers.
- 3. Mandatory health checkup of cook-cum-helpers, every six months.
- 4. E-transfer of funds directly to School accounts from State level.

Part-A: General Information

Introduction:

National Programme of Mid-Day-Meal in Schools (MDMS) is a flagship programme of the Government of India aiming at enhancing enrolment, retention and attendance and simultaneously improving nutritional levels among children studying in all eligible schools. It is being implemented in Maharashtra since 1995-96 onwards. In 2002, the scheme was implemented in 15 tribal districts of Maharashtra; however, the scope of implementation was extended to all districts of Maharashtra in January, 2003 for primary classes. Now MDM scheme is being implemented all over Maharashtra state covering all students studying in classes I-VIII in eligible schools.

2. Based on the information provided by the State administration in its AWP&B 2020-21, the performance during 2019-20 was reviewed. The major issues in implementation during 2019-20 are summarized as under: -

The number of meals to be served during 2019-20 = 215.69 crore

The number of meals served during 2019-20 = 202.37 crore (94%)

2.2 **FOODGRAINS**

2.2.1 Level of Opening Balance as on 01.04.19: (Refer Table 3.2 of the Analysis Sheet).

The State has 2217.25 MTs (9%) of food-grains as opening balance against the total allocation of 257499.42 MTs for 2019-20 as on 1.4.19.

2.2.2 Level of unspent balance as on 31.03.20: (Refer Table 3.3 of the Analysis Sheet).

The State level negative closing balance of 2411.96 MT foodgrains as on 31.03.20 against the total allocation of 257499.42 MTs.

2.2.3 Availability of Food grains: (01.04.19 to 31.03.20) : (Refer Table 3.5 of the Analysis sheet)

The districts should have availability of 100% of the food grains allocation. State level availability as on 31.03.20 was 93% of the total allocation.

2.2.4 Utilization of food grains: (Refer Table 3.7 of the Analysis sheet)

An analysis of the utilization of food grains during the first three quarters of 2019-20 shows that State has utilized 240733.77 MTs (93%) of the allocated food grains.

2.3 COOKING COST (PRIMARY + UPPER PRIMARY)

2.3.1 Level of Opening balance as on 01.04.19: (Refer Table 4.1.1 of the Analysis Sheet)

The State had reported Rs 166.32 crore (14%) as opening balance at the beginning of the financial year 2019-20.

2.3.2 Level of closing balance as on 31.12.19: (Refer Table 4.1.2 of the Analysis Sheet)

The State had closing balance of Rs. 226.36 crore (20% of allocation) towards cooking cost as on 31.03.20.

2.3.3 Utilization of Cooking cost: (Refer Table 4.5 of the Analysis Sheet)

The districts should have utilized 100% of the allocation of cooking cost. State level utilization is 94%.

2.4Reconciliation of utilization and performance during 2019-20 (1.4.19 to 31.03.20)

2.4.1 Mismatch, if any, in utilization of Food grains vis-à-vis cooking cost: (Refer Table – 5.1 of Analysis Sheet)

Only 1% difference was observed in the utilization of food grains (93%) and cooking cost (94%).

2.5 Cook-Cum-Helper (PRIMARY + UPPER PRIMARY):

PAB-MDM has approved 175336 cook-cum-helpers to be engaged during 2019-20 in the State, the State has engaged 169931 cook-cum-helpers. The State has utilized 97% of the allocated funds for payment of honorarium to cook cum helper. The State has proposed to engage 175336 Cook-Cum-Helpers for 2020-21.

2.6<u>Utilization of MME</u>(Refer Table – 7.2 of Analysis Sheet)

State has utilised the full allocation of Rs 24.45 crore for MME grants.

2.7 <u>Utilization of Transportation Assistance</u>(Refer Table – 8.2 of Analysis Sheet)

Against the allocation of Rs. 28.24 crore as Central Assistance towards funds for Transportation Assistance the State has utilized Rs. 26.18 crore (93%).

2.8 Construction of Kitchen-cum-stores (Reference Table -9.1.2 of Analysis Sheet)

Central assistance of Rs. 48032.21 Lakh has been released for construction of 66090 Kitchen-cum-Stores. As on 31.03.2020, construction has been completed for 58090 Kitchen-cum-stores and construction work is in progress for 1436 kitchen-cum-stores. Construction is yet to start for remaining 6564 kitchen-cum-stores.

2.9 Procurement of Kitchen devices (Reference Table -9.2.2 of Analysis sheet)

Central assistance of Rs. 7006.81 lakh has been released towards procurement of 140136 units of kitchen devices during 2006-07 to 2014-15. The State has reported that all units of kitchen devices have been procured.

2.10 Procurement of Replacement of Kitchen devices (Reference Table -9.2.2 of Analysis sheet)

Central assistance of Rs. 13461.22 lakh has been released towards replacement of 206313 units of kitchen devices. The State has reported that 157008 units of kitchen devices have been procured.

3. Data Entry Status on the MIS Web Portal

In order to smooth function of MDMS, Ministry of HRD, MDM Division has developed web based monitoring system i.e. Web based MIS in collaboration with NIC. In this web portal State/District/Block users have to make Annual and Monthly data entry into the web portal through online. The State has completed 100% data entry for both annual and monthly data.

3.1 Automated Monitoring System

State Government of Maharashtra is using 3 modes i) Mobile App, ii) Web portal and iii) SMS for data gathering for AMS. On an average 90% schools are submitting information on daily basis.

4. Release of funds

Funds are being transferred to schools directly from the State level through e-transfer. Honorarium to cook-cum-helpers is paid directly from district to CCH bank accounts through e-transfer.

5. Menu of MDM

Weekly menu is decided at district level considering local requirements.

6. School Nutrition Gardens

In Maharashtra kitchen gardens have been developed in 22173 schools and work is in progress in 6599 schools. All set up and maintenance made by local students with the help of members of School Management Committees. All produces of these gardens are being used in the Mid Day Meal. All gardens have been developed by using the local resources. State is planning to develop kitchen gardens in more than 19000 schools during 2020-21 in the same manner.

7. Supplementary Nutrition

Supplementary food item likes groundnuts chikki, Rajgiraladu, dates, Eggs, almonds, fruits etc. are provided once in a week within the limit of existing cooking cost. State does not provide any additional funds for these items.

8. Community Participation : Sneh Bhojan

Maharashtra has inititated 'Sneh Bhojan' to promote community participation in the Mid Day Meal Scheme. At School level specially in rural areas people on various occasions offer sweets, fruits and meals to students. Students in more than 40000 schools have benefited of shehbhojan, as community has contributed items worth Rs 3.16 crore in these schools.

9. Monitoring Mechanism

The State Government has mentioned that orders/ circulars have been issued time and again to strengthen the monitoring mechanism at district, block and school level. School Management Committee has been constituted at school level and they time to time monitor and appraise regularity of MDM at school level. At block level Cluster head, Education Extension officer, Superintendent and Block Education Officer monitor the scheme. At district level Education officer and Account Officer (MDM) monitored the scheme and also made visits to schools for monitoring purpose. Flying squads arranged for surprise visit to randomly selected schools. At State level, for monitoring purpose a special separate Mid Day Meal cell

has been set up. State may ensure more visits by officers from State level to districts. District wise nodal officers may be deputed for regular monitoring of the scheme.

10. Social Audit

Social Audit has not been conducted during 2019-20.

11. Testing of meals

Testing of food samples is being done in Mumbai only. State has reported that out of total 194 samples tested, 160 were meeting norms and 34 were found to be below norms. Appropriate action has been taken in case of these 34 samples, which failed to meet the norms.

12. Tasting of Meal

State has mentioned that tasting of meals is undertaken by community members, SMC members, teachers and cooks before serving cooked food to children. A register is maintained in school, community members and one parent tastes the meal before serving and writes remarks in the register with time and date.

13. Cooking Competition

Cooking Competitions have been organised at school, cluster, block and district level across the State during 2019-20.

14. Contingency Plan to avoid any untoward incident

State has informed that instructions have been issued to all schools to display the emergency contact number on notice board and kitchen shed also. Banner regarding precautions and measures to be undertaken during any emergency situation are also provided to all schools. Special contingency plan is prepared for schools having enrollment of more than 500 children.
