#### b. Main Issues from appraisal:

- 1) Less coverage of working days i.e. 160 against 182 upto 3rd quarter.
- 2) Delay in release of funds from State to school level (2 to 7 months).
- 3) Less utilization of cooking cost (68%) and MME (64%) against allocation.
- 4) Only 68% children screened under Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram.
- 5) Social Audit not conducted in any of the district.

#### **c.** Best Practices:

- 1) Fresh and locally available organic vegetables like potatoes, cabbage, green saag, cauliflower, Broccoli, raddish, carrot, beans, peas are being used in Mid Day Meal.
- 2) Mothers groups are actively involved in monitoring Mid Day Meal Scheme at school level.
- 3) State Government is providing multi tap handwashing facilities in 377 out of 868 schools.

#### **Introduction:**

The Mid-day-Meal Scheme is a school meal programme of the Government of India designed to improve the nutritional status of school going children nationwide. The programme supplies free lunches on working days for children in primary and upper primary classes in government, government aided, local body, Education Guarantee Scheme and alternate innovative education centres, *Madarsa* and *Maqtabs* supported under Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan and National Child Labour Project schools run by the Ministry of Labour. With a view to enhancing enrolment, retention and attendance and simultaneously improving nutritional levels among children, the "*National Programme of Nutritional Support to Primary Education*" (NP-NSPE) was launched as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme on 15th August, 1995.

In the year 2001, Mid-Day-Meal Scheme became a cooked Mid-Day-Meal Scheme under which every child in every Government and Government aided primary school was to be served a prepared Mid-Day-Meal with a minimum content of 300 calories of energy and 8-12 gram protein per day for a minimum of 200 days. The Scheme was further extended in 2002 to cover not only children studying in Government, Government aided and local body schools, but also children studying in Education Guarantee Scheme (EGS) and Alternative & Innovative Education (AIE) centres.

In October 2007, the Scheme was extended to cover children of upper primary classes (i.e. class VI to VIII) studying in 3,479 Educationally Backwards Blocks (EBBs) and the name of the Scheme was changed from 'National Programme of Nutritional Support to Primary Education' to 'National Programme of Mid Day Meal in Schools'. The Scheme was further revised in April 2008 to extend the scheme to recognized as well as unrecognized Madarsas / Maqtabs supported under SSA. Cooked Mid-Day-Meal Scheme was implemented in Sikkim from 2002.

**2.** Based on the information provided by the State administration in its AWP&B 2020-21, the performance during 2019-20 (01.04.19 to 31.12.2019) was reviewed. The major issues in implementation during 2019-20 are summarized as under: -

Observations - The coverage against enrolment in primary and upper primary is above the national average of 76%.

#### 2.2 FOODGRAINS

#### 2.2.1 Level of Opening Balance as on 01.04.19:

The State has zero MTs (0%) of food-grains as opening balance against the allocation as on 1.4.19.

#### 2.2.2 Level of unspent balance as on 31.12.19

The State level closing balance as on 31.12.19 is zero against the total allocation.

#### 2.2.3 Availability of Food grains: (01.04.19 to 31.12.19):

State level availability as on 31.12.19 was 80% of the total allocation.

#### 2.2.4 Utilization of food grains:

An analysis of the utilization of food grains during the first three quarters of 2019-20 shows that State has utilized 1207.96 MTs (80%) of the allocated food grains till 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter.

#### **2.2.5** Payment of cost of foodgrains to FCI:

The FCI has submitted bills for Rs. 1207.96 lakh during 1.4.2019 to 31.12. 2019 towards cost of food grains. The State has made payment for Rs. 1207.96 lakh (100%) to the FCI. The State is advised to ensure that 100% payment is made for the food grains supplied by FCI.

As per FCI statement, there is a pendency of Rs. 8.84 lakhs for the FY 2019-20 upto March 2020. State Govt. needs to clear the pending bills and also reconcile the data with FCI.

#### 2.3 COOKING COST (PRIMARY + UPPER PRIMARY)

#### 2.3.1 Level of Opening balance as on 01.04.19:

The State had reported Rs 57.38 lakh (9%) as opening balance at the beginning of the financial year 2019-20.

#### 2.3.2 Level of closing balance as on 31.12.19:

The State had closing balance of Rs.354.92 lakh towards cooking cost as on 31.12.19.

#### 2.3.3 Utilization of Cooking cost:

State level utilization of cooking cost is Rs. 363.88 lakhs (60%) against allocation of Rs. 605.23 lakhs.

#### 2.4 Reconciliation of utilization and performance during 2019-20 (1.4.19 to 31.12.19)

#### 2.4.1Mismatch, if any, in utilization of Food grains vis-à-vis cooking cost:

Ideally the percentage utilization of food grains and cooking cost should match, however in this case there is mismatch of 20 point between utilization of food grains and cooking cost.

#### 2.5 Cook-Cum-Helper (PRIMARY + UPPER PRIMARY):

PAB-MDM has approved 1891 cook-cum-helpers to be engaged during 2019-20 in the State, the State has engaged 1881 cook-cum-helpers. The State has utilized 70% of the allocated funds for payment of honorarium to cook cum helper till 31.12.2020. The State has proposed to engage 1891 Cook-Cum-Helpers for 2020-21.

#### 2.6 Utilization of MME

Against the allocation of Rs. 22.89 Lakh as Central Assistance towards MME funds, the State has utilized only Rs. 11.74 Lakh (51%).

#### 2.7 <u>Utilization of Transportation Assistance</u>

Against the allocation of Rs.27.35 lakh as Central Assistance towards funds for Transportation Assistance the State has utilized Rs. 21.98 lakh (80%).

#### 2.8 Construction of Kitchen-cum-stores

Central assistance of Rs. 710.73 Lakh has been released for construction of 948 Kitchen-cum-Stores from 2006-07 to 2019-20. As on 31.12.2019, construction has been completed for 948 Kitchen-cum-stores (100%). State has proposed for repair of 245 kitchen-cum-stores constructed prior to 2009-10.

#### 2.9 Procurement of Kitchen devices

Central assistance of Rs. 43.95 lakh has been released towards procurement of 879 units of new kitchen devices from 2006-07 to 2018-19. The State has reported that all 879 units of kitchen devices have been procured. Central Assistance of Rs. 65.95 lakh was further released during 2012-13, 2013-14 and 2018-19 for the replacement of 1319 units of kitchen devices. Against this the State has procured 1319 (100%) kitchen devices.

PAB-MDM 2019-20 also approved 336 units of kitchen devices (replacement) for State of Sikkim. However, the State has not submitted the detailed proposal (comprising of list of schools including UDISE codes) for the same resulting into non release of funds to the State Government.

#### 3. Data Entry Status on the MIS Web Portal

In order to ensure smooth functioning of MDMS, Department of School Education & Literacy, MHRD has developed web based monitoring system i.e. Web based MIS in collaboration with NIC. In this web portal State/District/Block users have to make Annual and Monthly data entry. The Annual and monthly data entry status of the State as on December, 2019 is given below:-

It is evident from the table above that mismatch is observed especially in coverage of working days and utilization of foodgrains. State is advised to reconcile the figures accordingly.

#### 3.4 Automated Monitoring System

AMS has been put in place for real time monitoring of MDMS. Data on number of meals served on the particular day and reasons if meals not served is being captured from schools with no cost to school head masters/teachers. Out of 868 schools, daily data has been reported by 756 schools (on an average April to December, 2019) i.e. 87% schools on Automated Monitoring System. In this regard, email alerts are being sent to all States/UTs on daily basis from NIC server.

#### 4. Release of funds

The system of release of central and the state funds under MDM Scheme are being routed through DPER & NECAD, Finance Deptt and Pay & Account Office. Cooking cost and honorarium to cook cum helpers are generating through state web portal. The district further submit that bills in compiled form to MDM HQ for final payment. The MDM, HQ can transfer the funds directly to the respective joint accounts of schools directly from the state HQ as per the details provided by the district. The MDM, HQ is transferring the funds directly to the school's joint account (MDM) through RTGS as per the Sikkim Gazette Notification.

#### 6. School Nutrition Gardens

Out of 868 schools, 75 schools in the State of Sikkim are having Nutrition Gardens and setting up of Kitchen Gardens is in progress in 18 schools. State has proposed to develop nutrition gardens in 247 schools.

#### 7. Supplementary Nutrition

The State informed that they are not providing additional items from their own resources in addition to the Mid Day Meal.

#### 8. Community Participation (Tithi Bhojan etc.)

As per information provided by the State, the community in and around the schools serves additional [special meals] to the school children during certain festive/social occasions. In most of the schools, the school management committee with the help of local panchayats has managed to procure eating plates and other required utensils from the local community. whereas in remaining schools the children bring their plates themselves from their homes.

#### 10. Social Audit

State has not conducted Social Audit in any of the 4 districts. The State is advised to conduct social audit during 2020-21.

#### 11. Testing of meals

There is no such reputed lab for testing of food sample in the State. State has not initiated the testing of cooked meals.

#### 12. Tasting of Meal

Tasting of meals by the community members in the schools is encouraged and practiced on regular basis. Recently, SMC's have started constituting mothers group to taste the food on daily basis.

#### 13. Centralized Kitchens and involvement of NGOs

No Centralized kitchen has been engaged in the State for supplying meals to children.

#### 14. Cooking Competition

No cooking competitions have been organized in 2019-20. State is advised to organize cooking competitions at various levels i.e. Block level, District level and State level. The expenditure for these activities may be met from MME component.

#### 15. Capacity Building

The MDM Cell in the State had conducted training and awareness generation programme of web portal to all heads of the institutions, training to cook cum helpers, stake holders and SMDC under mid-day meal scheme in all four districts. All the heads of the institutions and SMC had attended the training cum awareness programme of MDM Section held at various district levels in presence of district officials, MDM in-charge, Assistant Directors and Asst. Education Officers of the Block Administrative Centre BAC. Series of interaction between SMDC and Head of schools were held. Apart from this, School heads are being sensitized by the officers at the BAC level during coordination meetings. Modules used for the training were about cleanliness of the kitchen, personal hygiene of CCH, pure drinking water, hand washing before serving of MDM, nutritional value, safety measures etc.. Resource persons conducted training of CCH as well.

#### 16. Contingency Plan to avoid any untoward incident

Mid-Day Meal Scheme in Sikkim is being implemented in a highly smooth and efficient manner. All the schools cooking agencies/Cook cum Helper/SMCs are being sensitized on safety measures like disaster management, combating fire incidents, first aid application etc. The schools cooking agencies are also sensitized by Health Department on nutritional and hygienic aspect of the meals being prepared.

The schools and cluster are under the administrative jurisdiction of Asst. Directors and Block Development Officer and in case of any emergency situation in schools, the school heads are directed to seek immediate help from the Block offices. Besides, the school heads/PTA/Panchayats/SMC are actively involved in serving MDM and ensuring proper hygiene. The important helpline numbers like Fire, Hospital emergency call and Police are also with the school heads in case of any emergency situation. Besides, all the teaching and non-teaching staff after school as well as school children are regularly sensitized by the school safety programme to deal with any kind of emergency situation.
