Minutes of the meeting of Programme Approval Board held on 22.02.2022 to consider the Annual Work Plan & Budget (AWP&B) 2022-23 of PM POSHAN Scheme for the State of Gujarat.

The meeting of the Programme Approval Board-PM POSHAN (PAB-PM POSHAN) was held in New Delhi through video conferencing on 22.02.2022 under the Chairpersonship of Ms. Anita Karwal, Secretary, Department of School Education & Literacy, Government of India. The list of participants in the meeting is enclosed at Annexure-I.

The agenda before the PAB-PM POSHAN was:

- To review the status and progress of the implementation of PM POSHAN i. Scheme in the State of Gujarat.
- To consider the Annual Work Plan and Budget (AWP&B) 2022-23 proposal of ii. Gujarat for PM POSHAN Scheme.

2. Secretary DoSEL, welcomed the members of PAB-PM POSHAN and made opening remarks. She mentioned that the Union Cabinet has approved the continuation of scheme for the five year period i.e. 2021-22 to 2025-26 and also renamed it as Pradhan Mantri Poshan Shakti Nirman (PM POSHAN). She also briefed about the new initiatives and emphasized that interventions of School Nutrition Gardens, Tithi Bhojan and Social Audit are focus areas and are packaged and positioned as special nutritional interventions. Highlighting the importance of monitoring, She further stated that it has been decided to involve students of eminent Universities / Institutions and also trainee teachers of District Institute of Education Training and Regional Institutes of Education, for enhanced monitoring of implementation of scheme at field level. She reiterated that provision of hot cooked meals has significant effect on school participation, in both enhanced enrollment as well as improved regular attendance of children in schools thereby substantially contributing towards reduction in drop-out rates. She also emphasized upon the importance of hot cooked meals in schools in removing social barriers, as children from various social backgrounds learn to sit together and share a common meal. It was further highlighted that the gender gap in school participation tends to narrow, as the Scheme helps erode the barriers that prevent girls from going to school.

JS (EE.I) appreciated State Government's good practices/initiatives viz. provision of additional food items viz sukhdi, setting up of School Nutrition Gardens in 24852 schools and provision of additional 60 kg (per term 30 kg) food gains (15 kg wheat, 15 kg Rice) to the tribal girl students who complete 70% attendance in the primary schools under 'Anna Sangam Yojana' of State Government.

Principal Secretary, Govt. of Gujarat briefed the PAB about the performance 3. of Scheme in the State during 2021-22 and the initiatives taken by the State

Government for improving the effectiveness of the scheme. Commissioner (PM POSHAN), Govt. of Gujarat made a presentation on the proposals under Annual Work Plan and Budget (AWP&B) 2022-23.

4. Review of Performance during 2021-22 (01.04.2021 to 31.12.2021)

4.1 Coverage of children:

4.1.1 Average number of children covered under the Scheme with reference to enrolment:

The State has enrollment of 33.76 lakh children in primary and 18.76 lakh children in upper primary. Out of these on an average basis Food Security Allowance has been provided to 32.16 lakh children (95%) in primary and 18.48 lakh children (98%) in upper primary during the year 2021-22.

4.1.2 Average number of children covered under the Scheme with reference to PAB-PM POSHAN Approval:

The PAB-PM POSHAN has approved 26.54 lakh children at primary and 15.12 lakh children at upper primary level. State has provided Food Security Allowance to 32.16 lakh children (121%) in primary and 18.48 lakh children (122%) in upper primary against PAB approval during the first three quarters of 2021-22. Therefore, State has submitted proposal seeking approval of additional number of children covered over and above the PAB approval for 2021-22.

Comments of PAB: PAB expressed satisfaction over coverage of children in the State. PAB further advised the State to submit the proposal complete in all respects seeking approval for additional number of children covered over and above PAB approval for 2021-22. Further Secretary (SE&L) advised the State to ensure data parity with UDISE+ data.

4.2 School Working Days:

State has covered 141 days against the approval of 173 days. **Comments of PAB:** PAB noted the information.

4.3 **PFMS - Fund Flow Mechanism**

The payments of honorarium to CCHs and Cooking Cost are being made through Centralized Payment System directly into Bank Accounts. Further State informed that they have completed almost all procedures to implement the new system for release of funds in line with the revised procedure prescribed by Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India. Training for capacity building of staff was also held.

Comments of PAB: PAB advised the State to implement the new system for release of funds in line with the revised procedure prescribed by Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India. PAB further advised the State to ensure that all requisite provisions of PFMS are followed to enable timely release of central assistance and smooth implementation of scheme at all levels.

4.4 Management Monitoring and Evaluation (MME):

State has reported utilization of 27% of the funds under MME head during 2021-22.

Comments of PAB: PAB emphasized on the importance of monitoring and awareness generation for better implementation of the scheme and advised the State to ensure full and optimal utilization of the funds under MME. State was also advised to ensure display of entitlements of children in all schools and carry out appropriate IEC activities for awareness generation.

4.5 Engagement of Cook-cum-Helpers (CCH) and honorarium

PAB-PM POSHAN has approved 96329 cook-cum-helpers to be engaged during 2021-22 in the State, the State has engaged all 96329 cook-cum-helpers. State is providing an additional amount of Rs 600 per CCH per month from its own resources.

Comments of PAB: PAB appreciated the additional contribution made by the State towards honorarium to CCH.

4.6 Kitchen-cum-Stores (Construction as well as repair):

Central assistance of Rs. 23203.15 Lakh has been released for construction of 25077 Kitchen-cum-Stores. As on 31.12.2021, construction has been completed for all 25077 Kitchen-cum-stores.

Comments of PAB: PAB appreciated the steps taken by the State Government.

4.7 Kitchen Devices (new as well as replacement):

Central assistance of Rs. 1677 lakh has been released towards procurement of 33540 units of kitchen devices during 2006-07 to 2021-22. The State has reported that all 33540 units of kitchen devices have been procured.

Central assistance of Rs. 1493.40 lakh has been released towards replacement of 29868 units of kitchen devices during 2006-07 to 2021-22. The State has reported that all 29868 units of kitchen devices have been procured.

Comments of PAB: PAB appreciated the steps taken by the State Government.

4.8 School Nutrition (Kitchen) Gardens:

State has developed School Nutrition Gardens in 24852 schools out of 32545 schools. Students, teachers and cook-cum-helpers take care of kitchen garden. Vegetables such as brinjal, drum stick, tomato, cucumber, pumpkin, carrot, green mirchi, cauliflower, cabbage etc are grown in kitchen gardens, and are used in the preparation of meals.

Comments of PAB: PAB advised the State to make concerted efforts for development of School Nutrition Gardens in all schools. State may develop school nutrition gardens in remaining schools in convergence with local Krishi Vigyan Kendras, Agriculture Dept and Horticulture Dept etc. The funds available under MNREGS of Department of Rural Development for certain eligible components may also be utilized in convergence with them.

4.9 Community Participation - Tithi Bhojan or similar practices

Gujarat is the pioneer State to initiate the concept of Tithi Bhojan to encourage community participation and enable the donors, villagers and teachers to provide special food on the occasion of their Birthdays, anniversaries and National holidays etc.

Comments of PAB: Secretary (SE&L) emphasized the importance of community participation in better implementation of the scheme. She further added that Tithi Bhojan is a wonderful way to transform the community involvement and community ownership of scheme into 'JAN ANDOLAN'. She advised the State to try to conduct such activities at-least once in a month in each school. PAB appreciated the efforts of State and advised to further promote the initiative.

4.10 Additional food items:

State is providing *sukhdi* a sweet made of wheat flour, jaggery and ghee to all the children once a week and milk in 12 districts from its own resources.

Comments of PAB: PAB appreciated the provision of *Sukhdi* and milk from State's own resources.

4.11 Testing of meals :

State reported that testing of meals could not be undertaken.

Comments of PAB: PAB advised the State to carry out the testing of the samples of dry rations to check their quality and nutritional contents etc. through NABL / FSSAI Accredited laboratories across the State, as envisaged in Scheme guidelines.

4.12 Training of Cook-cum-Helpers and other capacity building activities:

All the CCH were trained through BISAG during the current financial year.

Comments of PAB: State was advised to organize refresher training programmes for all the Cook-cum-Helpers, whenever feasible, considering the pandemic situation.

4.13 Data Entry on PM POSHAN-MIS Web Portal:

PM POSHAN-MIS portal captures information on critical indicators of scheme. The annual data entry module captures master data on availability of kitchen-cum-stores, kitchen devices, number of cook-cum-helpers engaged, mode of cooking etc. The monthly data entry module captures data on number of days Meal was served; number of meals served, honorarium paid to cook-cum-helpers engaged, number of children received IFA tablets, number of children screened under Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram (RBSK) etc. The State has completed annual data entry for 99% schools and monthly data entry for 85% schools in the MIS portal.

Comments of PAB: PAB advised the State to ensure completion of 100% data entry within the prescribed time frame.

4.14 Status of implementation of Automated Monitoring System (AMS):

During 2021-22, no schools furnished entries under AMS.

Comments of PAB: PAB advised the State to ensure 100% information submission on all working days under AMS.

4.15 Centralized kitchens:

Centralized kitchens have been engaged for providing meal to about 7.6 lakh children in 3500 schools in 9 districts.

Comments of PAB: PAB advised the State to adhere to the extant guidelines for engaging Civil Society Organizations / Non-Government Organizations in the Scheme.

4.16 Social Audit:

Government of Gujarat has initiated the process to conduct social audit of PM POSHAN scheme with the help Mahatma Gandhi Labour Institute in 60 schools of 3 districts namely Narmada, Dahod and Patan.

Comments of PAB: PAB advised the state to conduct social audit in all districts. State was also advised to take appropriate measures for display of entitlements of children under PM POSHAN at a prominent place easily visible to public in all schools. State was also advised to undertake awareness generation activities.

4.17 Provision of Meals or Food Security Allowance during closure of schools due to COVID-19

The State informed that food-grains and pulses were provided to all children as Food Security Allowance during closure of schools and hot cooked meals shall be resumed from last week of February.

Comments of PAB: Secretary (SE&L) informed that Govt. of India has issued detailed guidelines for reopening of schools and resumption of hot cooked meals in schools and further advised the State to follow these guidelines for resumption of hot cooked meals in schools. Also take all precautionary measures and special care while maintaining social distancing and Covid appropriate behavior as advised by the respective Disaster Management Authority.

5. Component wise Proposals and PAB-PM POSHAN Approvals

5.1 Coverage of children

State Government has proposed to cover 33,76,772 children in primary classes, 18,76,965 children in upper primary classes, 50,000 children in Balvatika on an average basis during 2022-23.

Approval of PAB: After detailed discussions, PAB-PM POSHAN approved the proposals of State Government to cover 32,35,291 children in primary classes, 18,61,017 children in upper primary classes, 50,000 children in Balvatika on an average basis during 2022-23.

5.2 Coverage of Working Days

State Government has proposed to serve hot cooked meals on 246 days in primary, upper primary and Balvatika during 2022-23.

Approval of PAB: After discussions, PAB-PM POSHAN approved the proposal of State to serve hot cooked meals on 246 days in primary, upper primary and Balvatika during 2022-23.

5.3 Cook-cum-Helpers (CCH)

State Government has proposed to engage 96,329 Cook-cum-Helpers under PM POSHAN during 2022-23.

Approval of PAB: Following the discussions, PAB-PM POSHAN approved the proposal of State to engage 96,329 Cook-cum-Helpers under the scheme during 2022-23.

5.4 Drought

Drought has not been notified in the State.

Approval of PAB: Not applicable.

5.5 Construction and repair of Kitchen-cum-stores

State submitted no proposal.

Approval of PAB: Not Applicable.

5.6 Kitchen Devices

State submitted no proposal.

Approval of PAB: Not Applicable

5.7 Flexibility for Innovative interventions

For School Nutrition Gardens and supplementary nutrition interventions, State may use a maximum of Rs 4570.31 lakh (5% of total recurring Central assistance and minimum mandatory State share). This expenditure will be met from the funds available with the State (recurring Central Assistance + State Share).

5.7.1 School Nutrition (Kitchen) Gardens

State Government informed that 3467 School Nutrition (Kitchen) Gardens shall be developed during 2022-23 at an estimated expenditure of Rs 173.35 lakh comprising of Rs.104.01 lakh as central share and Rs.69.34 lakh as State share.

Approval of PAB: PAB approved the State's proposal for development of School Nutrition (Kitchen) Gardens in 3467 schools during 2022-23 at an estimated expenditure of Rs 173.35 lakh comprising of Rs.104.01 lakh as central share and Rs.69.34 lakh as State share.

5.7.2 Supplementary Nutrition

State Government has proposed to provide supplementary nutrition items i.e. Poshan Shakti mix to 4.10 lakh children for 3 months in 2324 schools in 2 aspirational districts viz. Narmada (684 schools) and Dahod (1640 schools) at an

estimated expenditure of Rs 3075 lakh comprising of Rs.1845 lakh as central share and Rs.1230 lakh as State Share.

Approval of PAB: After detailed discussions, PAB-PM POSHAN approved the proposal of State to provide supplementary nutrition items i.e. Poshan Shakti mix to 4.10 lakh children for 3 months in 2324 schools in 2 aspirational districts viz. Narmada (684 schools) and Dahod (1640 schools) at an estimated expenditure of Rs 3075 lakh comprising of Rs 1845 lakh as central share and Rs 1230 lakh as State share. In order to mitigate the nutritional challenges posed by the COVID pandemic, State is advised to provide the supplementary nutrition items by the 3rd quarter of (recurring Central Assistance + State Share).

5.8 Cooking Competitions

State Government has proposed to organize cooking competitions at various levels i.e. Block level, District level and State level for promoting variety (nutritious) menu.

Approval of PAB: Following the discussions, PAB-PM POSHAN approved the proposal of State for organizing cooking competitions at various levels by utilizing MME funds.

5.9 Training of Cook-cum-Helpers

State has proposed to train all the engaged Cook-cum-Helpers during 2022-23.

Approval of PAB: Following the discussions, PAB-PM POSHAN approved the proposal of State for training of all the engaged Cook-cum-Helpers by utilizing MME funds.

5.10 Awareness Generation through Publicity and IEC activities

During the discussions, State proposed to carry out awareness generation activities like prominent display of entitlements of children under PM POSHAN, publicity of PM POSHAN and various IEC activities by utilizing MME funds.

Approval of PAB: Following the discussions, PAB-PM POSHAN approved the proposal of State to carry out awareness generation activities like prominent display of entitlements of children under PM POSHAN, publicity of PM POSHAN and various IEC activities by utilizing MME funds.

- 8. The quantification of central assistance of Rs. 57827.54 Lakh & 149489.69 MTs food-grains and minimum mandatory State share of Rs 33578.71 lakh has been done as per existing norms on the basis of PAB-PM POSHAN approvals for the year 2022-23. The detailed component-wise quantification for 2022-23 is at Appendix-I.
- 9. It is clarified that the quantification of resources is only an estimate for release of Central Assistance and allocation of food-grains during 2022-23 under the PM POSHAN Scheme. The National Food Security Act, 2013, Rules, Guidelines and Instructions issued under the PM POSHAN Scheme from time to time, provide that every child attending an eligible institution is to be covered under the Scheme and shall be served hot cooked meals or provided with Food Security Allowance, as applicable, on all school days.

During the year, if it is noticed by the State Government that more funds are needed to implement the Scheme, due to increase in the attendance of children, increase in school working days or for any other reason, they may approach Government of India during the year with justification seeking additional Central Assistance and food grains. Similarly, if the Central Government observes less coverage than the approvals, the actual releases may be restricted to actual coverage.

10. The State is advised to disseminate the approvals of the resources to all the field functionaries in the State and districts so as to enable all the eligible institutions to ensure that every eligible child must be served hot cooked PM POSHANs or provided with Food Security Allowance on all school days irrespective of the approvals of PAB-PM POSHAN.
