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**Minutes of the meeting of Programme Approval Board held on 9<sup>th</sup> May, 2022 to consider the Annual Work Plan & Budget (AWP&B) 2022-23 of PM POSHAN Scheme for the UT Administration of Jammu & Kashmir.**

The meeting of the Programme Approval Board-Pradhan Mantri Poshan Shakti Nirman (PAB-PM POSHAN) was held in New Delhi through video conferencing on 9<sup>th</sup> May, 2022 under the Chairpersonship of Ms. Anita Karwal, Secretary, Department of School Education & Literacy, Government of India. The list of participants in the meeting is enclosed at Annexure-I.

The agenda before the PAB-PM POSHAN was:

- i. To review the status and progress of the implementation of PM POSHAN Scheme in the UT Administration of Jammu & Kashmir.
- ii. To consider the Annual Work Plan and Budget (AWP&B) 2022-23 proposal of UT Administration of Jammu & Kashmir for PM POSHAN Scheme.

2. Secretary DoSEL, welcomed the members of PAB-PM POSHAN and made opening remarks. She mentioned that the Union Cabinet has approved the continuation of scheme for the five-year period i.e. 2021-22 to 2025-26 and also renamed it as Pradhan Mantri Poshan Shakti Nirman (PM POSHAN). She also briefed about the new initiatives and emphasized that interventions of School Nutrition Gardens, Tithi Bhojan and Social Audit are focus areas and are positioned as special nutritional interventions. Highlighting the importance of monitoring, she further stated that it has been decided to involve students of eminent Universities/Institutions and also trainee teachers of District Institutes of Education Training and Regional Institutes of Education, for enhanced monitoring of implementation of the scheme at field level. She reiterated that provision of hot cooked meals has significant effect on school participation in terms of enhanced enrollment as well as improved regular attendance of children in schools thereby substantially contributing towards reduction in drop-out rates. She also emphasized upon the role of hot cooked meals in the schools in removing social barriers as

children from various social backgrounds learn to sit together and share a common meal. It was further highlighted that the gender gap in school participation trends to narrow, as the Scheme helps erode the barriers that prevent girls from going to school.

Subsequently Joint Secretary (EE.I) appreciated UT Administration's good practices/initiatives viz. e-transfer of funds to School / Block / District levels, the honorarium of Cook-cum-Helpers has been paid through e-transfer. Further he expressed concern over the issues of delay in the release of Adhoc funds by 3 months from UT Authority to schools, UT has neither constructed 4,697 units of Kitchen-cum-Stores nor surrendered the funds as directed by previous PAB. The UT has not yet procured 1311 units of new Kitchen Devices sanctioned during 2014-15. The UT has not constituted separate PM POSHAN management units at UT and District levels. The UT has not conducted testing of food samples. There is low utilization of MME funds up to December, 2021. Only 22% schools are having School Nutrition Gardens. Social Audit has not been conducted, health check-up of children has not been carried out and Deworming tablets have not been provided to the children during 2021-22. Only 19% children were provided Weekly Iron & Folic Acid tablets.

3. Principal Secretary (Education), UT Administration of Jammu & Kashmir briefed the PAB about the performance of Scheme in the UT during first three quarters of 2021-22 (01-04-2021 to 31-12-2021) and State Project Director (PM POSHAN) made a presentation on the proposals under Annual Work Plan and Budget (A WP&B) 2022-23.

#### **4. Review of Performance during 2021-22 (01.04.2021 to 31.12.2021)**

##### **4.1 Coverage of children:**

##### **4.1.1 Average number of children covered under the Scheme with reference to enrollment:**

The UT has enrollment of 546181 children in Primary and 298421 children in Upper Primary. Out of these, on an average basis 529239 children (97%) in Primary and 285616 children (96%) in Upper Primary have been covered during first three quarters of 2021-22.

#### **4.1.2 Average number of children covered under the Scheme with reference to PAB-PM POSHAN Approval:**

The PAB-PM POSHAN has approved 540604 children at Primary and 292561 children at Upper Primary level. Against these on an average basis 529239 children (98%) in Primary and 285616 children (98%) in Upper Primary have been covered during first three quarters of 2021-22.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB expressed satisfaction over coverage of children in UT. Secretary (SE&L) also advised the UT to ensure data parity with UDISE+ Data.

#### **4.2 School Working Days:**

PAB has approved 220 days to be covered during year 2021-22, UT reported coverage of 176 days in Primary and 177 days in Upper Primary during first three quarters of 2021-22.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB noted the information.

#### **4.3 PFMS - Fund Flow Mechanism**

The UT informed that the payments of honorarium to CCHs and Cooking Cost are being made through Centralized Payment System directly into Bank Accounts. The SNA / IA accounts have been opened in an identified nodal bank and mapping with PFMS has been completed and other preparatory works for implementation through PFMS are under active process.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB advised the UT to implement the new system for release of funds in line with the revised procedure prescribed by Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India. PAB further advised the UT to ensure that all requisite provisions of PFMS are followed to enable timely release of Central Assistance and smooth implementation of scheme at all levels.

#### **4.4 Management Monitoring and Evaluation (MME):**

UT has reported utilization of 3% of the allocated funds during the year 2021-22.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB emphasized on the importance of monitoring and awareness generation for better implementation of the scheme and advised the UT to ensure full and effective utilization of the funds under MME. UT was also advised

to ensure prominent display of entitlements of children in all schools and carry out appropriate IEC activities for awareness generation through publicity.

#### **4.5 Engagement of Cook-cum-Helpers (CCH) and honorarium.**

PAB-PM POSHAN has approved 32,394 Cook-cum-Helpers to be engaged during 2021-22. The UT has engaged 29,874 (92%) Cook-cum-Helpers.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB advised the UT to make the provision of additional contribution to honorarium of Cook-cum-Helpers from UT's own resources. PAB advised also the UT to engage Cook-cum-Helpers as per the norms of the Scheme.

#### **4.6 Kitchen-cum-Stores (Construction as well as repair):**

Central Assistance of Rs. 8393.63 lakhs has been released for construction of 11,488 Kitchen-cum-Stores. As on 31.12.2021, construction has been completed for all 6,791 Kitchen-cum-Stores (59%). UT informed that construction of 4,697 units of Kitchen-cum-Stores has not been started.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB advised the UT to surrender the total amount along with interest for 4,697 units of Kitchen-cum-Stores by June, 2022 which were sanctioned to UT for construction of Kitchen-cum-Stores.

#### **4.7 Kitchen Devices (new as well as replacement):**

Central Assistance of Rs.1103.10 lakhs was released from 2006-07 to 2021-22 towards procurement of 22,062 units of new Kitchen Devices. The UT Administration of Jammu & Kashmir has reported that out of 22,062 units of new Kitchen Devices, only 20,751 units were procured. 1311 units of new Kitchen Devices are yet to be procured by the UT.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB expressed concern over the non-procurement of 1,311 units of Kitchen Devices sanctioned during 2014-15 and advised the UT to procure the same by June, 2022.

#### **4.8 School Nutrition (Kitchen) Gardens:**

UT Administration of Jammu & Kashmir has developed School Nutrition Gardens in 4842 (4310 completed + 532 in progress) schools out of 21,952 schools. It was

further informed that due to closure of schools during major part of 2021-22, the development work of School Nutrition Gardens could not be taken up.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB advised the UT to make concerted efforts for development of School Nutrition Gardens in all schools. UT may develop School Nutrition Gardens in remaining schools in convergence with local Krishi Vigyan Kendras, Agriculture Department and Horticulture Department etc. The funds available under MNREGS of Department of Rural Development for certain eligible components may also be utilized in convergence with them.

#### **4.9 Community Participation - Tithi Bhojan or similar practices**

UT has not formally adopted concept of 'Tithi Bhojan'.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB advised the UT to encourage the concept of 'Tithi Bhojan' by giving a suitable regional name for Community participation in the Scheme. This would help in promoting a sense of ownership of the scheme among the community and children may get Supplementary Nutrition.

#### **4.10 Additional food items:**

UT Administration of Jammu & Kashmir informed that no additional items are being provided to the children under the Scheme. UT informed that in some low enrollment schools, eggs are being provided to the children as an additional food item.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB advised the UT Administration of Jammu & Kashmir to explore the feasibility of adding funds from UT Share from its own resources to meet the additional nutritional requirement of children.

#### **4.11 Testing of meals:**

UT Administration reported that testing of meals could not be undertaken during 2021-22 as schools remained closed due to Covid-19.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB advised the UT to carry out the testing of food samples to check their quality and nutritional contents etc. through NABL/FSSAI Accredited Laboratories across the UT.

#### **4.12 Training of Cook-cum-Helpers and other capacity building activities:**

UT had not organized training of Cook-cum-Helpers during 2021-22.

**Comments of PAB:** UT was advised to organize training programmes for all the Cook-cum-Helpers during 2022-23.

#### **4.13 Data Entry on PM POSHAN-MIS Web Portal:**

PM POSHAN-MIS portal captures information on critical indicators of PM POSHANS. The Annual data entry module captures master data on availability of Kitchen-cum-Stores, Kitchen Devices, number of Cook-cum-Helpers engaged, mode of cooking etc. The Monthly data entry module captures data on number of days meal was served; number of meals served, honorarium paid to Cook-cum-Helpers engaged, number of children received IFA tablets, number of children screened under Rashtritya Bal Swasthya Karyakram (RBSK) etc. The UT has completed Annual data entry for 87% schools and Monthly data entry for 70% schools in the MIS portal.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB advised the UT to ensure 100% data entry within the prescribed time frame.

#### **4.14 Status of implementation of Automated Monitoring System (AMS):**

During 2021-22 entries under AMS could not be made because schools remained closed due to Covid pandemic and dry ration was distributed.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB noted the reasons and advised the UT to ensure 100% submission of information on all working days under AMS when schools are opened.

#### **4.15 Centralized Kitchens:**

No Centralized Kitchen has been engaged for serving the hot cooked meals to the children in UT.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB advised the UT to adhere to the extant guidelines for engaging Civil Society Organisations / Non-Government Organisations in the Scheme.



#### **4.16 Social Audit:**

UT informed that Social Audit has been conducted in 16 districts covering 20 schools from each district, a total of 320 schools were covered during 2021-22. The detailed compilation reports of the Social Audit are under process.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB appreciated the effort made by UT. The UT was informed that under the provisions of Section 28 of National Food Security Act, 2013 Social Audit of the scheme is mandatory. UT was also advised to take appropriate measures for display of entitlements of children under PM POSHAN at prominent places easily visible to public in all schools. UT was also advised to take appropriate measures for awareness generation about the scheme.

#### **4.17 Provision of meals or Food Security Allowance during closure of schools due to COVID-19**

The UT informed that dry ration has been provided to all children on monthly basis as Food Security Allowance during closure of schools and hot cooked meals was resumed from 28<sup>th</sup> February, 2022.

**Comments of PAB:** PAB informed that Government of India has issued detailed guidelines for reopening of schools and resumption of hot cooked meals in schools and further advised the UT to follow these guidelines for resumption of hot cooked meals in schools. It was further advised that the UT needs to take all precautionary measures and special care while maintaining social distancing and Covid appropriate behaviour as advised by the respective Disaster Management Authorities.

### **5. Component wise Proposals and PAB-PM POSHAN Approvals**

#### **5.1 Coverage of children**

UT has proposed to cover 5,30,379 children in Primary classes, 2,86,341 children in Upper Primary classes and 1,14,606 children in Bal Vatika on an average basis during 2022-23.

**Approval of PAB:** After detailed discussions, PAB approved to cover 5,30,379 children in Primary classes, 2,86,341 children in Upper Primary classes and 1,14,606 children in Bal Vatika on an average basis during 2022-23.

## **5.2 Coverage of Working Days**

UT has proposed to serve meals on 220 days in Primary, 220 days in Upper Primary, and 220 days in Bal Vatika during 2022-23 as per academic calendar.

**Approval of PAB:** Following the discussions, PAB-PM POSHAN approved the proposal of UT to serve PM POSHAN on 220 days in Primary, 220 in Upper Primary and 220 days in Bal Vatika during 2022-23.

## **5.3 Cook-cum-Helpers (CCH)**

UT has proposed to engage 32,394 Cook-cum-Helpers under PM POSHAN Scheme during 2022-23.

**Approval of PAB:** Following the discussions, PAB approved the proposal of UT to engage 32,394 Cook-cum-Helpers under PM POSHAN Scheme during 2022-23.

## **5.4 Drought**

Drought has not been notified in the UT.

**Approval of PAB:** Not applicable.

## **5.5 Construction and repair of Kitchen-cum-Stores**

UT submitted no proposal.

**Approval of PAB:** Not applicable.

## **5.6 Kitchen Devices**

UT submitted no proposal.

**Approval of PAB:** Not applicable.

## **5.7 Flexibility for new interventions**

PAB observed that UT has not submitted any proposal under flexibility for innovative interventions. However, UT may use a maximum of Rs. 820.24 lakhs comprising of Rs. 738.22 lakhs as central share and Rs. 82.02 lakhs as UT share (5% of total recurring Central and minimum mandatory UT share) for School Nutrition Gardens and Supplementary nutrition interventions. This expenditure will be met from the funds available with the UT (recurring Central Assistance + UT Share).

## 5.8 Cooking Competitions

UT has proposed to organize cooking competitions at various levels i.e. Block level, District level and UT level for promoting variety menu.

**Approval of PAB:** Following the discussions, PAB approved the proposal of UT for organizing cooking competitions at various levels by utilizing MME funds.

## 5.9 Training of Cook-cum-Helpers

UT has proposed to train all the engaged Cook-cum-Helpers during 2022-23.

**Approval of PAB:** Following the discussions, PAB approved the proposal of UT for training of all the engaged Cook-cum-Helpers by utilizing MME funds.

## 5.10 Awareness Generation Through Publicity and IEC activities

UT proposed to carry out awareness generation activities like prominent display of entitlements of children under the Scheme, publicity of the Scheme and various IEC activities including preparation of videos and short films during 2022-23 by utilizing MME funds.

**Approval of PAB:** Following the discussions, PAB approved the proposal of UT.

8. The quantification of Central Assistance of Rs. 14898.90 lakhs & 23638.92 MTs food grains and minimum mandatory UT share of Rs 1505.89 lakhs has been done as per existing norms on the basis of PAB approvals for the year 2022-23. The detailed component- wise quantification for 2022-23 is at Appendix-I.

9. It is clarified that the quantification of resources is only an estimate for release of Central Assistance and allocation of food grains during 2022-23 under the PM POSHAN Scheme. The National Food Security Act, 2013, Rules, Guidelines and instructions issued under PM POSHAN Scheme from time to time, provide that every child attending an eligible institution is to be covered under the Scheme and shall be served hot cooked meals or provided with Food Security Allowance, as applicable, on all school days.

During the year, if it is noticed by the UT Administration that more funds are needed to implement the Scheme, due to increase in the attendance of children, increase in school working days or for any other reason, they may approach Government of India at any time during the year with justification seeking additional Central Assistance and food grains. Similarly, if the Central Government observes less coverage than the approvals, the actual releases may be restricted to actual coverage.

10. The UT is advised to disseminate the approvals of the resources to all the field functionaries in the UT and Districts so as to enable all the eligible institutions to

ensure that every child attending an eligible school must be served hot cooked meals or provided with Food Security Allowance on all school days irrespective of the approvals of PAB-PM POSHAN.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
