# **APPRAISAL NOTE**

State: Kerala

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#### Part-A: General Information

#### **Introduction:**

The Mid Day Meal Scheme was first introduced in the state of Kerala in1984 in the Lower Primary Schools functioning in 222 Villages, having Fishermen as majority. During 1985 the scheme was extended to all Lower Primary schools (Std. I to IV). The scheme was extended to Upper Primary Schools (std. V to VII) during 87-88. The scheme was further extended to the students of Std. VIII during 2007-08. The scheme consists of supplying cooked food to the children using rice, pulses, vegitables, egg, milk and coconut oil/palmolien. The outcome of the scheme is not only to give food to school pupils by Government but also to make the children eat a common dish at a common place in their respective school premises and thereby establish cordial relationship, mutual understanding, healthy friendship and emotional unity among children.

MDM-PAB has approved 13308 units of kitchen devices during 2012-13, However, the State has not submitted any proposal after the PAB approval for these kitchen devices.

#### Part-B: Review of Performance in 2012-13 (01.04.12 to 31.12.2012)

**2.** Based on the information provided by the State Govt. in its AWP&B 2012-13, the performance during 2012-13 (01.04.12 to 31.12.2012) was reviewed. The major issues in implementation during 2012-13 are summarized as under: -

#### 2.0 Coverage of Institutions

Coverage in terms of No. of institutions. Difference between PAB Approval (Target) Vs No. of institutions covered (Achievement) –

#### i) PRIMARY

The number of existing institutions = 6,847 Number of institutions covered during 01.04.12 to 31.12.12 = 6,847 (100%)

#### ii) PRIMARY WITH UPPER PRIMARY

The number of existing institutions = 4,183 Number of institutions covered during 01.04.12 to 31.12.12 = 4,183 (100%)

#### iii) UPPER PRIAMRY

The number of existing institutions = 1,360

Number of institutions covered during 01.04.12 to 31.12.12 = 1,360 (100%)

The information reveals that all the eligible institutions in the State have been covered under MDMS.

#### 2.1 Coverage of Children

#### 2.1.1 Coverage against enrolment:

a) Primary - Coverage in terms of No. of children. Difference between Enrolment vs Average No. of Children Availed MDM (Achievement) (Refer Table 2.3 of the Analysis Sheet).

Total Enrolment as on 30.09.2012 = 16,43,914 Average number of children availed MDM during 01.04.12 to 31.12.12 = 15,63,250 (95%)

The coverage at State level is very satisfactory and well above the national average of 73%. However, district wise analysis reveals that there is a gap of more than 10% in coverage of children vis-à-vis enrolment in the below mentioned districts.

Total Enrolment as on 30.09.2012 = 12,22,619 Average number of children availed MDM during 01.04.12 to 31.12.12 = 10,68,397 (87%)

87% of the enrolled children have availed Mid-day Meal on average basis during 2012-13 in Kerala, which is well above the National average of 73%. The districts where coverage is much lower than the State average are as under:

#### 2.1.2 Coverage against PAB-MDM approval:

a) Primary: Coverage in terms of No. of children. Difference between PAB Approval (Target) vs Average No. of Children Availing MDM (Achievement) (Refer Table 2.5 of the Analysis Sheet).

The number of children approved by MDM PAB for 2012-13 = 16,26,000 Average number of children availed MDM during 01.04.12 to 31.12.12 = 15,63,250 (96%)

b) Upper Primary: Coverage in terms of No. of children. Difference between PAB Approval (Target) Vs Average No. of Children Availing MDM (Achievement) (Refer Table 2.6 of the Analysis Sheet).

The number of children approved by MDM PAB for 2012-13 = 10,67,000 Average number of children availed MDM during 01.04.12 to 31.12.12 = 10,68,397 (98%)

2.1.3 No. of Meals: Difference between No. of meal to be served (Target) Vs. No. of meals served (Achievement)- PY+U PY (Refer Table 2.7 of the Analysis Sheet).

The number of meals to be served during 01.04.12 to 31.12.12 = **38.65 Crore**The number of meals served during 01.04.12 to 31.12.12 = **35.79 Crore (93%)** 

#### 2.2 FOODGRAINS (PRIMARY + UPPER PRIMARY)

#### 2.2.1 Level of Opening balance as on 01.04.12: (Refer Table 3.2 of the Analysis Sheet).

The State has 7834.16 MTs of foodgrains as opening balance against the total allocation of 67731 MTs for 2012-13 as on 1.4.12.

#### 2.2.2 Level of unspent balance as on 31.12.12: (Refer Table 3.3 of the Analysis Sheet).

The State level closing balance as on 31.12.12 is 9348.08 MTs (14%) against the total allocation of 67731 MTs. All the districts are having 7%-24% of the allocated food grains as unspent balance on 31.12.2012. The data indicates that there is no shortage of food grains at district level and there is sufficient amount of food grains as buffer stock.

#### 2.2.3 Availability of Food grains: (01.04.12 to 31.12.12)

Considering that three-fourth of the year was over by 31.12.2012, the districts should have availability of <u>at least 75%</u> of the food grains allocation. State level availability as on 31.12.12 was 77%. (Refer Table 3.5 of the Analysis sheet). The district wise details of availability of food grains are as under:

#### 2.2.4 <u>Utilization of food grains</u>: (Refer Table 3.7 of the Analysis sheet)

An analysis of the utilization of foodgrains during 2012-13 (Refer Table 3.7 of the Analysis Sheet) shows wide variations in inter-district food grain utilization. State level utilization was 64% as on 31.12.2012. The district wise analysis reveals that all the districts have utilized in the range of 61% - 64%.

#### 2.2.5 Payment of cost of food grains to FCI:

The FCI has submitted bills for Rs. 25.18 crore during 1.4.2012 to 31.12.2012 towards cost of food grains. The State has made full payment for Rs. 25.18 crore (100%) to the NAN. (Refer Table 3.9 of the Analysis sheet)

#### 2.3 COOKING COST (PRIMARY + UPPER PRIMARY)

#### 2.3.1 Level of Opening balance as on 01.04.12:

An analysis of the district wise opening balance of cooking cost as on 01.04.2012 shows, that the State had nil opening balance of allocation of cooking cost. (Refer Table 4.1.1 of the Analysis Sheet)

#### 2.3.2 Level of closing balance as on 31.12.12:

The State had closing balance of Rs. 24.60 crore (8% of annual allocation) towards cooking cost as on 31.12.12. All the districts are having cooking cost in range of 6% - 12%, which reflects that funds are available in advance. (Refer Table 4.1.2 of the Analysis Sheet).

#### 2.3.3 <u>Utilization of Cooking cost</u>

Considering that three-fourth of the year is over by 31.12.2012, the districts should have utilized at least 75% of the allocation of cooking cost. State level utilization is 58%. The State is contributing Rs. 2.75 per child per day at both primary and upper primary level, which is significantly more than than the mandatory State share of Rs. 0.78 for primary and 1.16 for upper primary. The analysis of district wise utilistation indicates that all the districts have utilized cooking cost in the range of 55% - 59%.

#### 2.4 Reconciliation of utilisation and performance during 2012-13 (1.4.12 to 31.12.12)

# 2.4.1 <u>Mismatch in utilization of Food grains vis-à-vis cooking cost: (Refer Table – 5.1 of Analysis Sheet)</u>

Ideally the percentage utilization of cooking costs and food grains should tally with each other. There is mismatch of 6 percent points at State level in utilization of cooking cost (58%) and food grains (64%). The difference in utilization is same 6% across all the districts.

#### 2.5 Cook-Cum-Helper (PRIMARY + UPPER PRIMARY):

MDM-PAB has approved 18987 cook cum helper to be engaged during 2012-13 in the State, however the State has engaged 13032 cook cum helper only. The State has utilized 46% of the allocated funds for payment of honorarium to cook cum helper. (*Refer Table – 6.2 of Analysis Sheet*). The State has submitted that the remaining 5955 cook-cum-helpers will be engaged during 2013-14. There is no requirement for any additional cook-cum-helpers.

#### 2.6 <u>Utilization of MME</u> (Refer Table – 7.2 of Analysis Sheet)

Against the allocation of Rs. 377.87 lakh as Central Assistance towards MME funds the State has utilized only Rs. 19.45 lakh. The State Government has also not submitted any MME plan.

#### 2.7 <u>Utilization of Transportation Assistance</u> (Refer Table – 8.2 of Analysis Sheet)

Against the allocation of Rs. 458.52 lakh as Central Assistance towards funds for Transportation Assistance the State has utilized Rs. 334.27 lakh. The State has made 100% payment for the quantity of food grains lifted and transported to the schools.

#### **2.8** Construction of Kitchen-cum-Stores (Reference Table -9.1.3 of Analysis Sheet)

Central assistance of Rs. 2544.55 lakh had been released towards construction of 2450 kitchen sheds during 2006-07 to 2009-10 for primary and upper primary stage, the State has reported that 318 kitchen-cum-stores has been constructed, work is under progress for 484 kitchen-cum-stores and work is yet to be start for remaining 1648 kitchen-cum-stores. The State has also constructed 7202 kitchen sheds through convergence with other development programmes. State has reported the same progress in the AWP&B for 2012-13 also.

#### **2.9 Procurement of Kitchen devices** (*Reference Table -9.2.3 of Analysis sheet*)

Central assistance of Rs. 203.95 Lakh has been released towards procurement of 4079 units of kitchen devices during 2006-07 to 2008-09 for primary and upper primary stage. The State has reported expenditure of Rs. 155.10 lakh for procurement of 3102 units of Kitchen Devices. Kitchen

devices have been procured through convergence in 900 schools. The State Govt. has submitted a proposal for 7411 units of kitchen devices for the remaining schools.

#### 3. Data Entry Status on the MIS Web Portal

Ministry of HRD, MDM Division has developed web based monitoring system i.e. Web based MIS in collaboration with NIC and same has been successfully launched in which most of the States/UTs have completed annual data entry for the year 2012-13.

#### 3.1 Annual Data Entry:

#### 3.2 Monthly data entry

Monthly data for 86% schools up to the month of December, 2012 has been entered in to the portal. The district wise analysis for the month of December, 2012 shows that the performance on monthly data entry requires attention especially in the districts of Kasargod (66%), Kozhikode & Kannur (76%) and Wayanad (77%).

The State Govt. has not completed 100% monthly data entry in to the portal. The State is requested to ensure 100% data entry in to the portal within a week and inform to MHRD.

#### 4. Release of funds

The ad-hoc grant has been released by the Govt. of India on 09/05/2012, the ad-hoc grant could reach the district level within a month. However, there was delay of three months in the release of balance of first installment, which was released on 26/07/2012 by the Govt. of India and reached the districts in the month of October, 2012.

#### 5. School Management Committee

The State Govt. has reported that School Management Committees have been constituted for all the schools. For the implementation of the programme in schools, a committee is constituted with PTA President as President and Headmaster as the Member Secretary. Other members of the committee are one member from Local Self Government, two teachers (one should be a woman), one member from mother PTA, two representatives from

parents of feeding students belonging to SC/ST. Involvement of PTA and MPTA ensures the transparency of the programme.

6. Findings of the Monitoring Institution, Centre for Development Studies, Thiruananthpura, for the period October, 2011 to March, 2012

Districts covered: Ernakulam, Allapujha, Idukki, Kannur and Kasargod

Major points of concern are as follows:

- 1. The children have not received any micronutrients (Iron, folic acid, vitamin-A dosage, etc.) and deworming medicine from them. Further no school maintains Health Card for its children.
- 2. In the case of about 25 percent of government schools, the kitchen shed is not spacious enough for cooking and keeping the cooked items; and further they are very dark and require whitewashing.
- 3. Delay of about one month in receiving cooking cost.
