

**Brief Note on Mid Day Meal Scheme
(Andhra Pradesh)
(09-05-2017)**

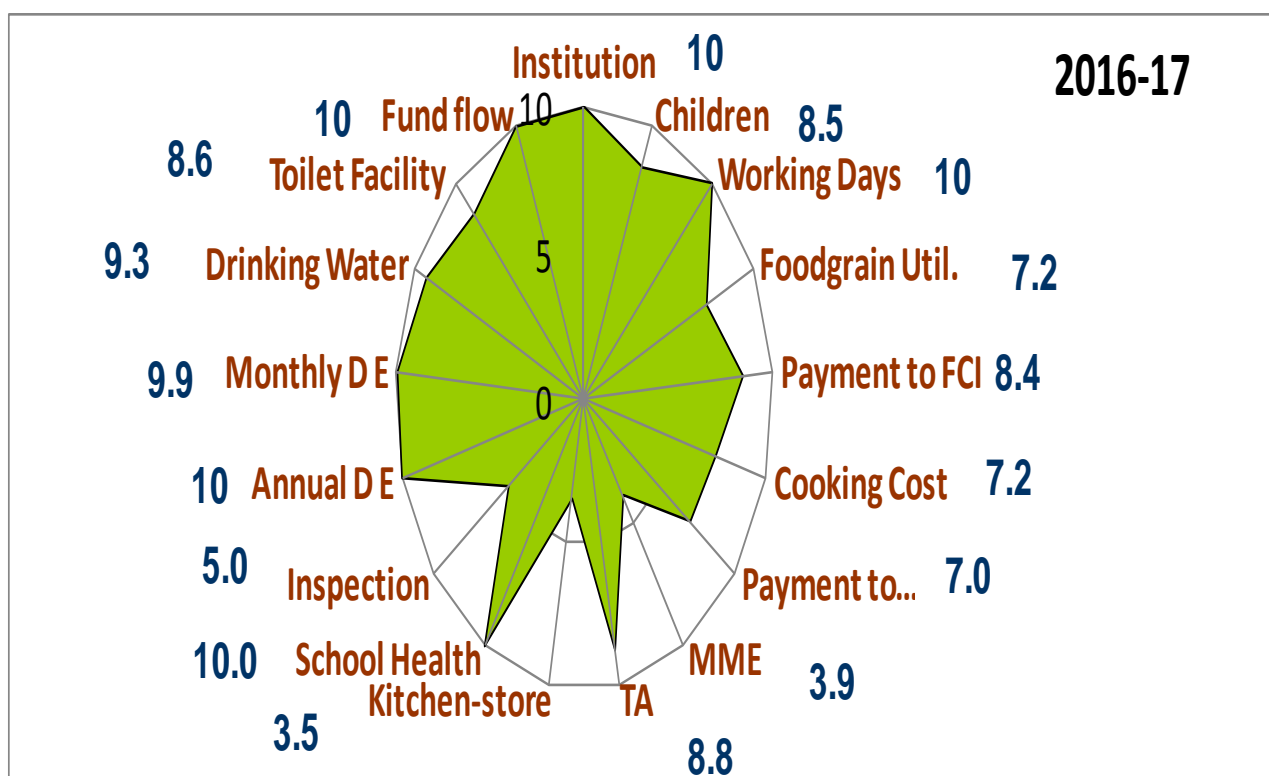
1. **Approved outlay** by the Programme Approval Board – Mid Day Meal Scheme (PAB-MDM) for the year 2017-18 is Rs. 266.27 Crore as central share. PAB has also approved Rs. 22.38 crore as central share for serving of MDM in draught affected areas during summer vacation. The Central Govt. has released Rs. 66.56 crore as ad-hoc grant on 1st May, 2017.

5. Challenges in implementation of MDMS

- i) Poor rate of construction of kitchen-cum-stores, Construction is yet to start for 7039 Kitchen-cum-stores.
- ii) LPG is used in only 19% schools.
- iii) Parents taste meal only in 37% schools.
- iv) No meeting of District level committee under chairpersonship of the senior most MP of the Lok Sabha in 8 districts.
- v) Mismatch in AWP&B data and MIS data.

6. Best Practices being followed in the State for effective implementation of the scheme:-

- i) Coverage of children of class IX and X under mid day meal from State resources.
- ii) **Provision of Egg/Banana** – The State Government is providing egg / banana to all children thrice a week from its own resources.
- iii) Bio-metric attendance system introduced in 100 School in Krishna and Chittoor.
- iv) E-Pos system is adopted for placing of indent and supply of rice to the schools.
- v) BADI BASA Programme to monitor the school from Assembly prayer to the end of the day.
