

**Brief Note on Mid-Day Meal Scheme
(Madhya Pradesh)
(08-05-2017)**

Mid Day Meal Scheme was started in Madhya Pradesh in 1995 with a view to enhance enrolment, retention and attendance of primary class children studying in Government, Government aided and Local Body Schools and to provide nutritional support to them.. In compliance with the direction of Hon'ble Supreme Court, hot cooked meal was started in 2004. The coverage of the Scheme was extended to Upper Primary Classes during 2008-09.

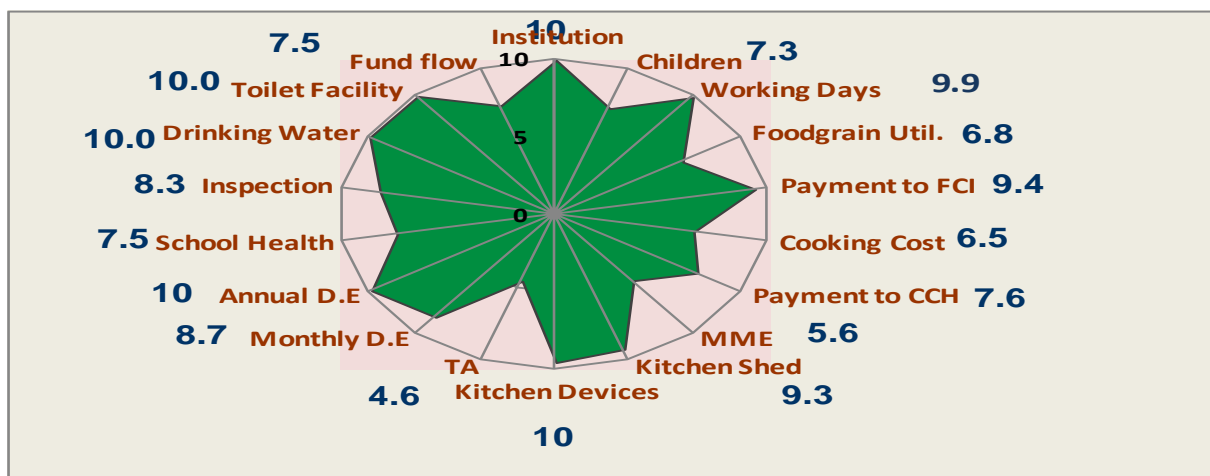

3. Challenges

- i. Two months delay in the release of central assistance to schools
- ii. Less coverage (73%) against enrolment both in Primary and Upper Primary.
- iii. Negative food grains balance on 31.12.16 in Datia, Gwalior, Shivpuri , Indore, Umaria, Sangroli, Panna, Neemach , Ratlam , Sidhi
- iv. Food grain availability as on 31.12.2016 is in excess of allocation in Narsinghpur ,Shajapur, Jhabua , Sagar), Bhind , Sheopur Rewa ,Khandwa and Sehore.
- v. Jhabua has utilized 135% food grain against coverage of 80% in primary and 78% in upper primary
- vi. Cooking cost available in excess of allocation in 30 districts viz. Jabhua, Damoh , Ujjain, Guna , Morena, Satna , Shadol & Bhopal..
- vii. Less utilization of Transport Assistance (46%)
- viii. 94% payment to Nagrik Apoorti Nigam (NAN) for food grains.
- ix. No meeting of District Level Meeting under the Chairmanship of MP(LS) held in 11 districts.
- x. Delay in construction of 7094 kitchen-cum-stores.
- xi. Social Audit in Ashok Nagar, Rewa and Sheopur still not completed.
- xii. LPG in 31276 (27%) schools. Firewood in remaining 73% schools.
- xiii. Only six districts out of 51 districts are submitting daily data on central server under Automated Monitoring System.
- xiv. 88% Monthly data entries in the MDM-MIS portal till December, 2016.
- xv. Mismatch in the MIS and AWP&B data.
- xvi. Multi-tap facility in 17283 schools (15%)

4. Best Practices

- i 79,000 women SHG's provide mid-day meal in more than one lakh schools
- ii Milk provided thrice a week from State's resources.
- lii E-transfer of Cooking cost in the account of SHGs.
- Iv Use of Ag-mark/Branded ingredients in MDMS
- vii Mothers, Antyoday Card Holders, Senior Citizens taste the meal daily..
- viii Meal samples kept for 24 hours in each school.
- Ix Action Protocol issued for addressing serious complaints immediately.
- xi) Task Manager and Quality Monitors each inspect at-least 50 schools in a month.
- xii) Dining Hall have been constructed in several districts by dovetailing funds of various schemes like BRGF, MANREGA, etc.
- xiii) Social Audit by Gram Sabha on quarterly basis.
- xiv Medical Contingency Plan in every school.
- xv Funds provided to every district for one thousand LPG connections
